

Sunday Ordinary Time Year A John 1:29-34

Eucharistic Renewal Meditation

"Liturgy is about praise, about rendering thanks for the Passover of the Son whose power reaches our lives. The celebration concerns the reality of our being docile to the action of the Spirit who operates through it until Christ be formed in us. (Cf. Gal 4:19) The full extent of our formation is our conformation to Christ. It does not have to do with an abstract mental process, but with becoming Him. This is the purpose for which the Spirit is given, whose action is always and only to confect the Body of Christ. It is that way with the Eucharistic bread, and with every one of the baptized called to become always more and more that which was received as a gift in Baptism; namely, being a member of the Body of Christ. Leo the Great writes, "Our participation in the Body and Blood of Christ has no other end than to make us become that which we eat."

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

2nd Sunday Ordinary Year A

John 1:29-34

What did John say? "A man is coming after me who ranks ahead of me because he existed before me" (John 1:30) Which is it? After you, ahead of you, OR before you? Or can all of those prepositions apply? What exactly is John trying to say? First, some background, and it is that John belongs in the background. He is not the Messiah. He consistently denies any importance to himself and humbly says, "My only job is to point out the Messiah-that's allforget me once He comes." The problem became that John had wonderful success at drawing crowds out to the Jordan River to repent and be baptized. He had a following. He has disciples. Some people may even have seen John's popularity as an indication that He John was the Messiah. Yet, John wants to make sure they do not get stuck on him, and miss their opportunity of following Jesus, so John repeatedly does and says things to denigrate himself and exalt Jesus. John adamantly says three times in John 1:19-21, "I am not the Messiah". But John also doesn't want to appear to be a powerful 'Influencer' or 'Kingmaker' which would elevate him more in people's eyes (just as important as the king is the person who makes/names the king!) Since John gets arrested and is executed, some people could misunderstand John to be the top leader who names his disciple-successor to replace him, Jesus. Such a 'dynastic' act would raise John's leadership position to 'Boss', especially as he goes on to be martyred. All of this leads John to make that 'confusing-time' statement. John says that this person (Jesus) who comes after him in history-time (which might make him less-that Jesus is only a replica imitation or sequel to John) is actually greater than him in time (though Jesus arrived later and has less seniority) because in fact, Jesus existed from all eternity. John is bending over backward to humble himself and not let anyone think more of him than they should, and certainly not to think more of John than they think of Jesus. John wants to be clear: Jesus is the Messiah. John is simply saying, 'The sooner you forget about me, the sooner you are saved in Christ.' This is what John means in John 3:30 when he declares, "He must increase; I must decrease."

Since we know so clearly the identity of Jesus, we may underestimate the confusion people had over who was more important: John or Jesus. John was highly respected among the people. King Herod is afraid of John's popularity as we hear when Herod fears to hurt John because of the people's love/admiration of John (Mark 6:20). Also demonstrating Herod's respect for John, when Herod first heard about Jesus' popular ministry work, he immediately thought of John coming back resurrected from the dead (Matthew 14:1-2).

So while John's may make that confused sounding statement about time, precedence and succession, John doesn't want any confusion about this: Don't follow me - Follow Jesus. John goes on the record here saying, "Yes. I picked out the Messiah for you, (not because of any special power of mine) but it was because the Holy Spirit (Dove) and voice of the Father at Jesus' baptism confirmed it!" john as a human being is not 'selecting and naming' the Messiah, John is only following God's voice & the Holy Spirit dove that identified and confirmed Jesus to be the ONE!

John did know Jesus, as they are related by blood through their mothers, but John wants to be clear that God is calling the shots. Anything John knows authoritatively about Jesus being our Divine Savior comes from God's Holy Spirit, not himself. John did not sit around and think up how opportune it would be for Jesus to be named the Messiah. No, God pointed it out to John through the Holy Spirit's signs given to him, and then John points Jesus out to us. It is not the result of any special divine authority within John. John is simply saying, "Everything I know about Jesus, God revealed to me." Since John was the first on the scene converting people and bringing baptism, he didn't want anyone to think more of him than they thought of Jesus. As a good prophet, John knows that he should not get in the way of the message. A good prophet delivers the message and then steps aside. Sometimes prophets walk all over their message with their own human issues. Have you evert heard the saying about someone watching someone else point out a constellation in the night sky, "Don't mistake the finger for the star-look beyond it?" John wants no confusion – He is to be forgotten as soon as Jesus shows up. That is why John is so repetitive about saying, "I am not he - I am nothing - Jesus is the Lamb of God-He is everything. Follow Him"!
