As we close the book on 2024 and look ahead to 2025, we want to take a moment to reflect on the incredible achievements, collaborations, and growth the Shenandoah Alliance team has experienced this year.

In early 2024, SAS underwent a staffing change that temporarily reduced our team size to three members until Becky joined us at the end of October (Yay!). Despite this challenge, BJ and Megan's unwavering dedication enabled us to successfully implement our Scattered Site Project while also managing their other program duties. The placement of our first resident was an overwhelming success, and this project served as a valuable learning experience for our team. We are now applying those lessons to build a stronger program for the year ahead.

In addition, we have expanded our partnerships with the Salvation Army and enhanced our coordination of the Red Kettle Campaign. To further promote our mission, we have added more outreach and awareness events and have also secured additional funding opportunities to support gaps left behind in our Federal Housing Grant Programs.

Please note as you read this newsletter that it highlights key milestones from both 2024 and the first half of Fiscal Year 2025, because of the timeline of those federal grants.

20 PEOPLE IDENTIFIED AS LIVING WITH AT LEAST 1 DISABILITY AND 3 PEOPLE REPORTED BEING RECENT VICTIMS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.
