
# Napa Valley Quilters Guild

No one can duplicate the same exact creation that you make. All items in your creation are yours; colors, stitches, and especially your process. It is that one item that makes your creation completely your own.

What is your process? Do you look at a selection of materials and then choose a path? Or Are you one to choose a pattern and then purchase the materials needed to make the project. I tend to plan a vague idea and then I start laying out the items I own already that will work for that project. There is a very good chance that I will only use some of those original choices. Because, I change my mind many times in my creative process. I enjoy that intuitive, fly by that

immediate thought, process, most often. This is why I have a hard time duplicating the same block too many times. I get bored. I find that painting with fabric is very exciting for me. I choose the subject I am "painting". Draw it on a cloth background, and then lay the color in; highlights and shadows. It is a very zen happy place for my creative energy. I lose all sense of time and suddenly I am hungry, and thirsty and my eyes are blurry.

Our quilt show is next month. And the items each of you share makes for a very exciting show. There is however, all the necessary work that is involved in putting together. Rose Luce, spends a huge amount of excitement and energy just finding vendors and coordinating with Jamie McClenahan, in the signing and fund collection to pay for the building and spaces to show all your creativity. The many other members working in groups to build a shopping space to sell items and fund our Quilts to Share program. Remember that if you are showing something, now is the time to put in your paper work. Linda Feutz's contact number is in our directory and she needs your forms, with a picture, and correct dimensions as soon as possible. She finds a home to place each quilt, and places each item in a cube to make sure everything fits. And then tries to be sure it is represented as best as possible in the spaces available. In October we will do a 'debrief' of the quilt show!! What was great, what could be improved upon and enjoy all of our successes.




