AGRICULTURAL REPORT by Doug Sattazahn

No segment of agriculture has been untouched by the COVID-19 pandemic. Supply chain disruptions have led to wild variations in supply and demand of milk, meat and eggs. Apparent shortages at stores do not correspond with farmers having to dump milk or get rid of chickens with no market, leading to frustration from farmer to consumer and everywhere in between.

The northeast dairy industry in particular is seeing lower overall demand for milk products, causing milk companies to place restrictions on the supply from farmers. For example, the Dairy Farmers of America (DFA) cooperative will use March milk production as a baseline and only pay producers full price for 85% of that level going forward. Milk production over that threshold will be priced at a salvage price of around \$7.00 per hundredweight. Farmers will be looking to reduce their output or find other uses for milk on the farm to stay under this 85% level. This is coupled with milk prices that have already decreased significantly since before the pandemic.

Personally, as a Clover Farms producer, our farm had to dump 5,000 gallons of milk on April 1st. Hopefully this will be a one-time incident as we have been told that Clover's markets are still in relatively good shape.

There is speculation that USDA money will be used to pay for dumped milk, but it remains to be seen when and at what level this will be. If you have questions or comments regarding the dairy situation you can reach me by email at dougsattazahn@gmail.com.

FAMILY ACTIVITIES by Jane Reppert, 610-562-2647

I hope everyone is well and safe during this trying time from the Corona Virus pandemic. Many stores were out of disinfectant and cleaning products. Here are a few hints to make your own (taken from the Good Housekeeping magazines and Berks County Extension newsletters):

Disinfectant: dilute ½ cup Cider Vinegar in 1 cup Water

(or) Mix ¼ cup Borax in ½ gallon hot water

(or) Combine equal parts alcohol (at least 60%) concentration and water in a spray bottle.

Don't wipe but let the solution evaporate.

All purpose Cleaners: Mix 1 tsp. With 1 quart of warm water. Ass a splash of lemon juice or vinegar to cut grease.

(or) Mix 2 tsp. Borax and 1 tsp. soap in 1 qt. of water. Can be stored in a spray hottle

(or) Mix 4 Tbsp. Baking Soda and 1 qt. warm water. Pour solution on a clean sponge and wipe.

I hope during this time we are to stay at home, you were working on some special projects around the house or on your entries for the Family Activities Contest. If you still need complete contests and rules, you can contact your Subordinate Grange Family Activities chairperson or go on the PA State Grange website under Documents-2020-2021 Guide to Contest & Programs or you can contact me.
