my favorite sermons. I don't like it because I am especially good at delivering it. I don't like it because it has the most Bible in it, though it has plenty. I like it because it explains something that I myself have wondered about for a long time: WHY don't I feel close to God sometimes? There are times when I fail to realize just how He interacts with His children and what I can do to be more cognizant of God's presence. We will examine what the Bible has to say this morning about being "Not Far From God."

The Hatton Half: The Importance of Christian Worship

Since the beginning of time, man always possessed a need to worship someone or something higher than himself. It is from that desire which many deities arise in the minds of the world. In some of the world religions, followers of said belief invent idol gods toward which to pay homage. There are some who believe that no such deity even exists, so there is no purpose in worshipping anyone/anything in their eyes. For members of the Lord's church, the one true God we worship is the God of the Bible. So, why is it important we worship Him? The first reason one might suggest is the mere fact of our existence. If evolution is not the ultimate reason for our existence, then creation is our only option. Therefore, there has to be a Creator, so God exists. He spoke this very world into existence (Gen. 1). As one views the world, there are beauties viewed, which manifest the glory of God (Psa. 19:1). Where there is glory, someone must be glorified. The only person who is glorified is God. Another reason for consideration is our purpose in life. Some suggest our purpose in this life is to live it to its fullest. This may not be a bad thing. When Paul wrote to Timothy, he said "we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out" (1 Tim. 6:7). The Christian's ultimate purpose is to give honor and glory to God (1 Cor. 10:31). We must decide to serve Him (Jos. 24:15). Only a few things were given to point out the importance of Christian worship. One must always remember that the Christ will return to come for God's people and we will have an opportunity to live with God for eternity. However, we must glorify Him now so that we will see His glory later.
