PASTOR LEANNE'S MESSAGE:

Well, I know it is spring, because I finally took the Christmas wreaths off my home door! Other than that, there is not a lot of evidence that the season is changing at this present time. I'm looking out the window of my office at the snow – it was 13 degrees this morning. I guess I have become a true North Dakotan, because I am taking it in stride. I know that soon it will be the season of mud and thawing. I will be chasing two dogs around to try and wipe their feet off before they track all over the house. Then tiny greens will begin poking up through the ground. (I already saw my irises!) And, right behind that... gardening!

That's how it is with the seasons of life. They seem like they will never get here until one day, we look around and realize that for better or worse, the changes we anticipated have come. Everything happens incrementally, until suddenly, all at once, it's different.

One of my professors (in Pastoral Counseling) used to emphasize this truth when it came to recovery and growth. He would laugh, "everybody is looking for the magic bullet when they come into counseling, and when change comes and health arrives, the people who see them get all excited about miracle cures. But miracle cures never happen. Change evolves and grows until there is a tipping point. It may feel sudden, but it's not. Behind every sudden, magic bullet event of change, there are hours and hours of evolving struggle and work. It only looks easy – but it rarely is." As this spring, we had warmth, then cold, then warmth, then snow, things evolve and change in their own way and time. Real healing, real growth, real change, take faith and patience and diligence. But, with God's help, it comes. So take it a little easy on yourself. Nobody can fix everything all at once and some things take a lot of time! Give yourself time for change to come, and don't give up when it looks like nothing good is happening. Galatians 6:9 says, "And let us not lose heart in doing good, for in due time, we shall reap a good harvest if we do not grow weary!"



Keep the faith! Better things are ahead.

MODERATOR'S REPORT

Pastor Leanne will take vacation April 1-2. She thanked all those who contributed to the Lenten activities.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Administrative and Personnel—Committee will be reviewing security policies and procedures and advise ushers how to handle situations. It was suggested that FPC find someone to manage our social media page and someone to substitute for Josh Stokka when he is absent.

Hospitality—The Committee is planning activities for the September 14th street fair and working on a "doors" project which will be placed on the church lawn.

Proclamation-Worship and Music—The Committee is investigating replacement of organist/pianist hymnal.

Proclamation-Christian Education—The Committee will plan a spring event for teens at Cross Ranch.

Property and Equipment and Resource Management- Session approved up to \$53,000 to fund new lighting for the balcony and other parts of the sanctuary. The money will come from the Capital Improvement Fund which currently has \$164,931.

The church insurance coverage will be switched from Church Mutual to Church Asset Management/Guide One because deductibles are more reasonable.

Child Care Center Board—Enrollment remains stable. Staff appreciation will be April 28.
