DESCRIPTION: The Ben Pearson Locksley Line was the BP line marketed mostly to the United Kingdom. It was not a lower quality line, and some of the models were superior to the regular BP line. For example the Locksley Lion was like a supercharged BP Cougar. The Razorback is the exact same bow as the Javelina. Semi-recurve. Walnut and White Holly riser. The riser is in much better shape than the limbs. Bow has no delamination; no cracks; limbs are straight. Overlays and tips are in good condition. No drilled holes; No chips, dings or cracks. No crazing or stress cracks; several long superficial stress lines in the limbs which were filled with super glue. A few minor scratches and nicks here and there. Decal is in fair condition. I put this bow to a stress test (held at full draw for 16 hours) to make sure the old glues held and the stress lines did not crack or extend. It passed the test fine, and was shot a day to further test.
