Keep in mind, this year's newsletter will once again have write-up for every CFB and NFL game along with CFB power ratings and all the opening bets we made at Circa. If you want CFB picks, but can't afford the \$499 VIP, we recommend betting our power ratings on page 6. For the past eight seasons we have posted computer projected lines for every game. **Games where there was of difference of more than 3 points saw our computer lines actually beat the Vegas line at a 487-414-14 (54.1%) clip!** That's pretty solid and actually better than our own handicapping in some seasons. Keep in mind, these computer lines don't take into consideration off-the-field factors like revenge or flat spots or if there are late-week injuries. They are basically a power-rating number difference between the two teams that also takes into consideration the home field advantage.

The next issue comes out Wednesday, September 4th at 3pm ET! It will include Week 1 NFL write-ups along with Week 2 CFB.

Games in Rotation Order
Thursday, August 29th

HOME TEAM IN CAPS

MINNESOTA 26 North Carolina 25. We think this is the most underrated game of Week 1. It's really important for either program to get a win here if they are to meet preseason expectations. Minnesota is excited about New Hampshire transfer QB Max Brosmer while North Carolina might play both Max Johnson and Conner Harrell at QB. Minnesota is the more experienced team, at home and have the better QB situation. We like the Gophers despite money coming in on NC.

JACKSONVILLE STATE 27 Coastal Carolina 25. One of the better Group of 5 match-ups in Week 1. A game where you could get a good grasp on a team power rating. Jacksonville State might play two QB's in Logan Smothers and Tyle Huff. Coastal Carolina might also play two QB's in Ethan Vasko and Noah Kim. Both teams are below average in returning experience. While there is a lot of uncertainty at QB, the market has said Coastal and UNDER are the right positions.

Friday, August 30th

OKLAHOMA 50 Temple 7. Temple is in a really bad spot this year. The Owls are off back-to-back 3-9 seasons, are one of the least experienced teams in the country and play a schedule which will see them underdogs in all 12 games. Forrest Brock will get his first start at QB. Meanwhile, Oklahoma only has Houston on deck and should be able to name the score. We're not big fans of laying huge point spreads but we did bet OU a few different times this summer (see page 6)

Tcu 34 STANFORD 25. Stanford should be one of the most improved teams in the country this year as far as a power rating (see page 5). The Cardinal return 18 starters and are in the 2nd year of Troy Taylor's scheme. Obviously, TCU is off a massively disappointing 5-7 season which came on the heels of a National Championship game appearance. What is the reality of this program? We think somewhere in between. Early money has been on Stanford and the UNDER. We're a part of both moves.

WISCONSIN 38 Western Michigan 17. Both teams should be improved in Year 2 of their coaching regimes. Tyler Van Dyke will get the start at QB for Wisconsin. WMU is the most experienced MAC team this year and a sleeper in that conference (we bet them 10/1). It's tough laying this big of a number with a Wisconsin offense that hasn't topped 27 ppg in any season since 2019. We lean WMU here.

MICHIGAN STATE 28 Florida Atlantic 16. We like the hire of Jonathan Smith for MSU but we're not high on the Spartans this year and bet the win total UNDER. We have heard nothing but positive things out of fall camp about new QB Aidan Chiles from Oregon State. On the other side, FAU should be improved in Year 2 under Tom Herman (record wise) but the Owls only return 7 starters. Cam Fancher will get the start at QB. We lean dog and UNDER like most of these games.

Saturday, August 31st

INDIANA 37 Florida International 16. We really like the Curt Cignetti hire for Indiana. He brought in a ton of experienced, productive transfers from across the country including 10 starters from James Madison. The Hoosiers should be much improved this fall and will flirt with a bowl game. Mike MacIntyre is in year 3 at FIU and should have his best team especially on offense. It's tough trusting a new Indiana roster in game 1 to cover 21.5 points. We lean with FIU.

PITTSBURGH 41 Kent State 17. We like the OVER in this game. Pitt has a new OC from Western Carolina in Kade Bell. He wants to run tempo and Pitt has an experienced offense. Speaking of experience, Kent State is night and day from last season on offense. Last year, they returned ZERO starters and averaged just 14.7 ppg. This year, they return EIGHT starters led by All-MAC WR Chrison McCray. The Golden Flashes could be the most improved offense in the country as far as scoring.

MARYLAND 34 Connecticut 13. Maryland's offense should take a big step back this season. Billy Edwards looks like he will start in this game but we expect to also see MJ Morris. However, this should be Locksley's best defense he's had in 6 years. UConn is going to start Nick Evers at QB. The Huskies are better than last year and have taken a ton of money in this game all summer. However, we think the value has dried up. Pass.

UTSA 40 Kennesaw State 13. Kennesaw St's first FBS game is a tall task facing one of the best Group of 5 programs. Honestly, it's tough getting a handle on a Kennesaw St power rating considering they red-shirted a lot of players last year and went 0-6 vs FCS teams. UTSA loses their all-time leading passer in Frank Harris but Jeff Traylor has recruited well and they are really solid at the line of scrimmage. We've seen nothing but UTSA money all summer and we agree.

† **Georgia 31 Clemson 18.** Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta, GA. Originally, we liked UGA in this match-up. However, the Bulldogs haven't had a great fall camp on the news front. 2nd-leading returning WR RaRa Thomas was kicked off the team, starting RB Trevor Etienne has legal issues and could be suspended for this game and backup RB Roderick Robinson will be out several weeks following surgery on his toe. Meanwhile, it's been quiet on the Clemson front. This is the largest underdog role for Clemson in a decade. We're passing at the current numbers.

MASSACHUSETTS 26 Eastern Michigan 24. You may laugh at this statement but this is one of the more important games in Week 1. First, you have two comparable teams as far as a power rating goes. It's tough envisioning either team going OVER their season win total without a win in this game. EMU was a fraudulent bowl team last year but their head coach Chris Creighton always gets the best out of his team. This should be Don Brown's best UMass in 3 years. Finally, several respected market groups are on opposite sides to this game. We made a small bet on UMass at PK but would pass at the current line.

SYRACUSE 31 Ohio 14. Off back-to-back 10-win seasons for the first time in school history, Ohio is expected to take a big step back this year. The Bobcats only return 5 starters and are in the bottom 5 in returning production. Meanwhile, Syracuse has a new coach in Fran Brown and in just one off-season he's upgraded the talent level big-time with the best recruiting class in modern Syracuse history and several high-impact transfers led by QB Kyle McCord from Ohio State. The market has hammered Syracuse in this game all summer but like most games, a lot of the value has been dried up with the lines posted for several months.

GEORGIA TECH 38 Georgia State 17. Obviously, Georgia Tech is off the big upset of Florida State last weekend. The Yellow Jackets shockingly controlled the line of scrimmage (190-98 rush yard edge including 5.3-3.2 yards per carry). It was a brilliant game-plan to shorten the game by GT's coaching staff as the 14 combined possessions were the fewest in any CFB game since 2020. Dell McGee is the new head coach at Georgia State. He's a great hire but wasn't hired until early spring and there's been a big roster overhaul. The market is definitely anticipating a flat spot here for GT as we saw Georgia State +21.5 get taken out in the market yesterday.

SOUTH CAROLINA 37 Old Dominion 16. We like South Carolina's new QB LaNorris Sellers who could actually be an upgrade over Spencer Rattler. We've also heard good things about the SC defense in fall camp. Meanwhile, we're down on ODU this year. A lot of their top players transferred out and we already thought they were a phony bowl team last year getting outscored by 3.4 ppg and getting outgained by 44 ypg. South Carolina was one of the VIP picks we gave out this summer. Albeit it was at -17.5. Again the value has dried up.

James Madison 28 CHARLOTTE 19. There's been some wild movement on this game this summer and this week. First, James Madison only returns 6 starters and is in the bottom 10 in returning production. The Dukes have a new coach in Bob Chesney, who we really like from Holy Cross. Obviously, this JMU team is a far cry from the one that has gone 19-5 the last two years. Charlotte should be better in year 2 under Biff Poggi and this line got as low as 6 in the market earlier this week. However, Poggi just announced yesterday that Charlotte will be down 8 starters in this game and we've seen nothing but JMU money since. We're on both sides of this game (Charlotte +11.5, James Madison -6.5). At 9, it's a pass.

Penn State 30 WEST VIRGINIA 21. We think Penn State is a legit playoff contender this year and think they'll be favored in 11 of their 12 games. We like both OC and DC hires that James Franklin made and the offense should be more explosive. Meanwhile, there's a lot of excitement around Morgantown with the Mountaineers off a 9-win season. They return dual-threat QB Garrett Greene and 13 starters. This is another game where the market has been on WVU all summer and we agree with that original move. However, if the line drops to -7, we're playing back some Penn St.

Boise State 36 GEORGIA SOUTHERN 23. We think Boise St is the best Group of 5 team in the country. The Broncos have the best player in the G5 regardless of position in RB Ashton Jeanty (1,916 rush/rec yds and 19 TD's). We weren't totally surprised that Maddux Madsen was named the starting QB over Malachi Nelson. Madsen played well last year (9-3 ratio). The defense should be much improved. Meanwhile, Georgia Southern comes in losing their last 5 games of 2023. JC French will get the start at QB and Clay Helton likes his defense this year. Another game that moved significantly this summer (Boise -10 to -13) but we don't see value now.

KENTUCKY 38 Southern Miss 11. We thought Kentucky was a little under-valued in the early markets not only for this game but as far as season win total (gave out OVER 6.5 wins to VIP customers). They should be very good at the line of scrimmage (both Top 20 units) and have a Top 25 WR room. How good is Georgia transfer QB Brock Vandagriff? Meanwhile, Southern Miss will also start a transfer at QB in Tate Rodemaker from Florida State. We bet UK and UNDER but don't see much value now.

OHIO STATE 51 Akron 3. Obviously, there's talk about Ohio State being a "historically" talented team. We love their top 2 RB's, their secondary and their experience on the DL. However, we don't love new QB Will Howard from Kansas State. That's why the Buckeyes are No. 2 in our power ratings and not No. 1. Obviously, OSU can name their score here but we do like the UNDER.

ARIZONA 45 New Mexico 14. Yes, New Mexico blew a 31-14 lead as a 13.5-point underdog last week to Montana State. A further dive into the box score though would show New Mexico getting outgained 362-152 on the ground and the Lobos benefiting from not one, but two defensive TD's. Arizona's offense should have their way here.

ARIZONA STATE 28 Wyoming 22. A new era for Wyoming football with new coach Jay Sawvel taking over for Craig Bohl. Sawvel has a defensive background having been the DC here. However, we expect Wyoming to open up the offense a little more this year as they like their new QB Evan Svoboda (6-5 245) who played well in a start at Texas last year. ASU's offense should be better as their OL and QB positions were completely compromised due to injury last year. We like OVER.

Miami, FL 27 FLORIDA 26. One of the most important Week 1 games especially for both coaches who are feeling some heat after under-performing the first two years of their tenure. Both coaches feel they have their best teams in Year 3 and both are much improved in our power ratings (see page 6). Miami has had a lot more preseason hype as they'll likely be favored in at least 10 games while Florida plays the toughest schedule in CFB. This game has seen back and forth movement in the market but we prefer the home underdog as we like Napier more than Cristobal. Florida is worth a bet if you can find +3.

TEXAS 46 Colorado State 14. Texas has had cluster injuries at RB this fall camp led by starting RB CJ Baxter being out for the season. We were already not as high on Texas in the markets having bet UNDER 10.5 wins, and against them in several game of the years (see CFB Preview Guide). This line has dropped 4.5 points and like so many games, the value has dried up on CSU.

NEBRASKA 39 Ute 11. Nebraska is going to start 5-star true frosh Dylan Raiola at QB. If you happen to watch the Nebraska spring game, he looks and moves like his idol Patrick Mahomes. However, it is the Nebraska defense that we think will be the reason why the Huskers get back to a bowl game for the first time in 8 years. We love their two DT's Nash Hutmacher (6-4 330) and Ty Robinson (6-6 310). UTEP has a new coach in Scotty Walden who we like. However, it's tough to get a feel for their power rating with 53 new scholarship players.

NORTHWESTERN 23 Miami, Oh 17. Northwestern's new make-shift stadium is literally a few yards away from Lake Michigan. Wind could be a factor in their home games this year and we've seen money come in on the UNDER with this being by far the lowest total (39.5) of Week 1. We actually prefer the Northwestern side here especially if you can find a -2.5. While Miami ranks No. 1 in our preseason MAC power ratings, this NW team under David Braun continues to be disrespected. This was an 8-win team a year ago that brings back 15 starters. Best bet material at -2.5.

HOUSTON 28 Unlv 27. We like the Willie Fritz hire for Houston. He's a big upgrade over Dana Holgorsen. However, we don't like this year's Houston team nor the brutal schedule they play. Meanwhile, this is the best UNLV team on paper entering a season in at least 40 years. The Rebels won 9 games a year ago and should be better on defense this year thanks to many Power 5 transfers. UNLV is worth a bet if the line goes back to +3.

SOUTH ALABAMA 35 North Texas 28. North Texas has gotten the money in the market. While we have agreed with most moves this summer, we don't agree with this one. NT lost their play-making QB, top 3 RB's and by far their top WR from last year. They also just lost their most talented player on defense to injury for the season in Isheem Young. South Alabama has a new coach in Major Applewhite but he was on staff last year. A lot of their new starters on offense showed out in the 59-10 bowl win including QB Gio Lopez.

TROY 28 Nevada 18. We think this line is a big over-reaction to Week 0. Yes, you need to upgrade Nevada's power rating for their near upset of SMU as 28-point underdogs. However, the Wolf Pack still were -1.7

in yards per play and benefitted from several SMU mental errors. We downgraded Troy more than any other Group of 5 school this off-season. They only return 5 starters and rank dead last in returning production. Still, this line was 15.5 last week and now it's 8.5. We like Troy.

Virginia Tech 31 VANDERBILT 17. We like VT to make a lot of noise in the ACC this year. The Hokies return 18 starters and rank No. 3 in the country in returning production led by QB Kyrion Drones. Meanwhile, Vanderbilt has a bunch of new faces on both sides including QB Diego Pavia from New Mexico State. Don't forget VT will likely have more fans in the stands in Nashville and Vandy is only on a 24-41 ATS run (37%) at home the last 10 years.

RICE 31 Sam Houston State 21. We like the OVER here. Sam Houston State averaged only 3 ppg on offense in their first 3 games of last season but steadily got better and averaged 26 ppg in CUSA play. They return 9 starters on offense. Meanwhile, we think Temple transfer QB EJ Warner was one of the more underrated gets in the transfer portal this year.

Ucla 35 HAWAII 20. We bet UCLA's win total UNDER this off-season and we bet Hawaii's win total OVER. Surely, we'd like Hawaii in this game right? Wrong. We were a little surprised the market didn't react much to Hawaii's performance vs FCS Delaware State last week. The 40-point Rainbow Warriors were tied 14-14 in the middle of the 3Q and one of their scores came via a punt return. We think UCLA even with a new coach should handle Hawaii much like what Stanford did at Hawaii last year in game 1 with a new coach. The difference is UCLA is a much better team than what Stanford was.

ALABAMA 47 Western Kentucky 14. It's going to be weird watching the Crimson Tide on Saturday without Nick Saban pacing the sidelines. We don't think Alabama could have made a better hire than Kalen DeBoer who wins every where he coaches including going 25-3 at Washington the last two years. Jalen Milroe is back at QB for Alabama and the OL should be much improved. The defense is talented but young. Alabama should be able to name their score but we haven't bet side or total in this game.

MICHIGAN 34 Fresno State 13. Another game with a new coach and a lot of uncertainty. Michigan not only has to replace Jim Harbaugh but the defending National Champs only return 1 starter on offense. They still believe their defense will be Top 5-10 caliber but there's still a question mark on who the QB will be. Fresno State has an interim coach in Tim Skipper after Jeff Tedford stepped down in the summer due to health reasons. The Bulldogs do have a talented offense led by QB Mikey Keene. We don't see value at the current numbers.

TEXAS A&M 23 Notre Dame 20. ESPN College Gameday will be on hand for this important clash. This will mark the first game of the Mike Elko era in College Station and we think he's a big upgrade over Jimbo Fisher. Conner Weigman is back at QB and there's plenty of talent around him. The story of the game will likely be decided on the other side though. Texas A&M has one of the best defensive lines in CFB while ND's projected starting OL only has a combined 6 career starts. ND has Duke transfer Riley Leonard at QB and an improved WR corps but could be compromised if their OL is getting pushed around. ND has not won a road game as a 3-point or more underdog since 2012. We think A&M wins but prefer the UNDER as ND DC Al Golden is one of the best in CFB (see performances vs Ohio State and USC last year).

Sunday, September 1st

† **Lsu 34 Usc 30.** @Allegiant Stadium in Las Vegas, NV. Originally, we liked LSU in this game when the line was posted 8 months ago. However, the Tigers failed to address the DL concerns in the transfer portal and we're hearing nothing but positive things about USC in fall camp. We really like the defensive staff Lincoln Riley hired and they should be improved at each level. Both QB's Garrett Nussmeier and Miller Moss have big shoes to fill but we think they're both capable. Finally, we trust Lincoln Riley more in a big game than Brian Kelly who was out-coached by FSU's Mike Norvell in each of the last three season openers. That's why we made a bigger bet on USC +6.5 than our original LSU -6 position.

Monday, September 2nd

FLORIDA STATE 34 Boston College 17. Yes, Florida State was bad last week in their upset loss to Georgia Tech in Ireland. Yes, they shockingly got manhandled at the line of scrimmage. Yes, Mike Norvell and staff were completely out-coached. However, we think there's been an over-reaction in the market. The line has dropped 5 points from last week and we don't think it is deserved. Bill O'Brien makes his debut as BC head coach and he has an experienced team led by QB Thomas Castellanos. Originally, we thought FSU might be jet-lagged, now they should be razor-focused to atone for last week's loss.

Keep in mind, these computer lines don't take into consideration off-the-field factors like revenge or flat spots or if there are late-week injuries. They are basically a power-rating number difference between the two teams that also takes into consideration the home field advantage.

Of the 4 games where our computer is off more than 3 points compared to the Vegas line (highlighted), our favorite team this week to back would be **Northwestern -3**.

The Comp column is the computer projected line and the Diff column is the difference between the Vegas line and the Computer line. "+" numbers in the difference column say back the underdog. "-" numbers in the difference column say back the favorite. Let us know if you have questions.
