with help from **Ilene & Mark Abramson**. A special thank you to Carol and Richard Lewis who came just to help even though they weren't able to dance.





## WISH LIST DRIVE 2017 BREAKS ALL RECORDS!

We could not feel more proud to be part of the Trail Duster/Rail Duster Family! Each year, our club members are asked to put their efforts together and reach out to assist someone in need in our community. For the past several years, we have lent our support to the Los Angeles Ronald McDonald House, raising money for countless toys, supplies for their two large kitchens - including 220 place settings of dishes, and all the other necessities that go into a kitchen. and food for the pantries in each of the two Houses that comprise RMH.

Last year, our club raised \$3,005 that all went for food to fill those pantries. That was the largest amount ever donated by our members for such a Drive. This year, because of the generosity of so many of you, we attained a new goal – one we had never imagined possible. As of this time of writing, our club has raised \$4,147!!! You opened your hearts – and

your checkbooks, and you gave graciously and generously, and because of this, our club is supplying 75 sets of queen size linens (retail value \$7,500 plus tax,) to RMH, 150 bath towels and hand towels, and loads of food for the two pantries!

We will shortly be turning over merchandise with a retail value of approximately \$9,000! This surpasses all of our previous successes, and we are positively thrilled to think about the difference our club is making at RMH! To each and every one of you who has supported our efforts and contributed to this year's huge success, we thank you with all of our hearts. Our only dilemma now is. . .can we achieve this kind of success again next year?




