



At Home Parkerizing

Parkerizing is a method to provide corrosion protection to metal parts. It was used by Harley-Davidson from the late 1930s into the 1960s on many fasteners as well as intake manifolds, kickstands, brake/clutch pedals, etc. It was especially prevalent during WW2. It was also used on vintage cars and is still used today on firearms.

The method I used is primarily from Palmer (2020) and instructions from the manufacturer of the chemical concentrate (Palmetto Enterprises, 2020). I used the manganese phosphate concentrate; it creates a dark gray color.

I am conveying what I have done for your edification. But users conduct any of these procedures at their sole risk. Recognize you are dealing with toxic chemicals, toxic fumes, hot oil, hot plates, hot glassware, all around equipment energized with electrical power.



Palmer (2020) does a nice job of describing the equipment needed. I would add that Pyrex ware specifically says not to use it on a heated surface; I can say from personal experience that Pyrex will break on a hot plate. I used small stainless steel pet dishes instead of Pyrex (cheap on



Amazon). The volume of the container depends on the size of parts you will treat. You can do nuts and bolts in a 1-cup container. For parts like an intake manifold, it will need to be deeper. You'll need two

containers that will allow you to completely submerge the parts, one for the solution and one for oil. Allow for some evaporation of the solution.

Take care when heating oil. On the same hot plate setting, my solution water came to the desired 200 F, so I removed the water to another burner and put the oil on it. The oil, on the same setting, got much hotter, well over 250F. For a measuring cup, I found a smaller one at Safeway that measured in ounces and milliliters that I like. Measuring in milliliters is easier when you make up a smaller solution as you can get a finer measurement that eyeballing "a third-cup."

I also prefer the dexterity of stainless steel tweezers over tongs. Large tweezers are available from kitchen suppliers for grilling.

You need to get the parts down to bare steel. If the parts are cadmium plated, zinc plated, epoxy coated, powder coated, or chrome, this creates additional requirements not covered here.

The directions call for bead blasting. Not owning a bead blaster, I used the wire wheel on my



bench grinder to remove rust and old coatings from larger parts, and for smaller parts and to get the nooks and crannies, I use a Dremel and its small wire wheel brush. I hold the smaller parts with a needle nose vise grip. I only handle the parts with nitrile gloves to keep the oil from my

hands off the parts. After wire wheeling, I spray the part with carb cleaner, wipe it off with a clean cloth, and put the part in a clean box.

Once you have all the parts cleaned, set up for the Parkerizing. I did all my Parkerizing outside with a box fan blowing across the work.

The directions call for 14 ounces of Manganese phosphate concentrate to 1 gallon of water (128 ounces). This would create WAY more solution than I

would need for my purposes. You can use a smaller volume which is easier to handle. Just follow the ratio of 14 concentrate to 128 of water. The ratio of 14:128 can be applied to any unit of measure, just be consistent – if you measure 7 milliliters of concentrate, then you'll want to measure 64 milliliters of water, and so on (3.5 to 32...).





You place the volume of water in the vessel and bring it to 200F first, then add the concentrate, bring that to 200F, then add the parts. This minimizes "cooking off" the concentrate.

After the parts are cooked in the solution, remove them. I used a wire screen in the cook pot so parts can be easily taken

out. Some folks run stainless wire around the parts so they can be easily removed. You are also supposed to turn the parts every few minutes (how many is a few? - they don't say, I did it every five minutes).



Total time in solution is 8 to 15 minutes. I did my parts for 15 minutes and they came out a dark gray – which I like.



Once removed from the solution, rinse in water and dry QUICKLY, then PLACE in the hot oil. I say quickly, because you want the part to be hot

when it goes into the oil so pores in the metal will bring in some of the oil. I say <u>place</u> in the oil, as in

use the tweezers. You don't want to plop the part in the oil and have hot oil splashing around. I left the parts in the oil for 15 more minutes then placed on a clean paper shop towel to drain. After the parts cool, I wiped off the oil.



It takes several hours for this process: cleaning the parts (most time consuming), set up

vessels and hot plate, parkerizing and oiling, and cleanup. But to me, the result was worth it.

Commercial parkerized parts that you buy have a rather thin coating. When you tighten a nut, and I mean just snugging it, the Parkerizing can rub off. Having bare steel surfaces between two





parkerized parts is asking for corrosion. For example, the Harley parkerized transmission plate is meant to have the parkerized mounting nuts loosened and the plate and transmission moved to adjust the primary chain. Loosening and moving scrapes off the thinner commercial Parkerizing. So be aware of this limitation. I use painter's tape to temporarily protect commercial parkerized nuts/bolts to reduce rubbing off the parkerized coating when tightening with a wrench.
