CHURCH MEETINGS vs VOLUNTEER BURNOUT

This church has been blessed by leadership in both its past and present who established working committees who meet, plan, and execute the ministries of the church. It is a gift to this pastor to have laity who love to serve and who do so with grace. I have noticed, though, that we lack the organization to do our work in a coordinated fashion. Many of us are bone tired and approaching burnout.

Have you ever felt like church meetings controlled your life – like you had no time to plan fun and refreshing times with your family, or for yourself? Many of our church's leaders find themselves seated around the church conference table three nights in a given week. It's even more taxing when meetings are called hastily, and personal plans must be changed to accommodate committee agendas.

It should be no surprise that the busyness we inflict upon ourselves when we fail to plan or establish schedules for our committees is a recipe for exhausting our volunteers. This kind of exhaustion is commonly referred to as "burnout", and results in Christians who serve becoming less and less committed to serving. This, in turn, makes it harder for the Committee on Lay Leadership to fill committees with laity who are committed to their tasks.

There is, however, a way to organize ourselves so our volunteers can manage their lives in coordination with the work of the church. With the support of both the Pastor Parish Relations Committee and the Administrative Council I have begun working on a monthly meeting schedule that will allow all committees needing to meet with an agreeable time slot each month. This will minimize the hastily called "emergency" meetings and free up several nights altogether. If a committee does not need to meet, their scheduled meeting can be canceled with much more ease than our current method of adding meetings to the calendar.

Please make note of the following monthly schedule. These meetings are agreeable to chairs and those who have been present at recent meetings.

1st Monday - Ultreya 6 PM

Last Monday – Finance at 5 PM and Administrative Council at 5:30 PM

2nd **Tuesday** – Pastor Parish Relations (closed meeting every other month) 5:30 PM Missions 6:30 PM

- *Wednesdays are set aside for fellowship, learning, and choir rehearsal
- *Trustees could meet on the 2nd or 3rd Monday or one of the other Tuesdays (currently meeting on the 1st Thursday)
- *When Lay Leadership meets it will be on either Monday or Tuesday.
- *Worship prefers to meet at 11 AM on Sunday.
- *Education has met on Sunday at 11 AM but could also choose an available Monday or Tuesday as their established meeting time slot.

*The goal is to establish Thursdays as "meetingless nights" for the church so everyone has a free night each week for activity beyond the church. Fridays and Saturdays are already well established as times for special events and fellowship.

You may have noticed that I seem to be organized to a fault; I beg you to bear with me as I try to develop a culture in the church that helps us all avoid burnout – and may God be glorified!
