





Council Highlights from the October Church Council Meeting

Treasurer's report: The roast beef supper realized a profit of \$1624.37. \$427 will be donated to the Crop walk, a refrigerator/freezer will also be purchased, any remaining funds will be put into the General fund, Terry made the motion to approve, Tracey seconded. Motion carried.

Pastor's report: Keeping on top of all the activities including the planning of the 150th event on October 31st is keeping me busy. Visiting all the shut ins is on my agenda again. Hoping for new member introductions soon as first communions. Rev. Michelle Knight is transferred out to her new church. The Garman funeral is this Friday. September 30th, I officiated a nonmember funeral. There were a large number of surgery events and hospitalizations this month.

Worship: Rededication and 150th event October 31st is planned. Pictures, special events, and lunch are planned! The television screen will be on that day for everyone to follow along.

Hospitality: Looking for small gifts for the residents at Polo Rehab, Polo Council of Churches will reimburse our cost. Visitations are not being allowed in the nursing facilities. After the 150th anniversary celebration, shutins will receive a copy of the stained glass window book, photographs, and a short letter to include them in our celebration!

Education: Hand bells are going well, as is the new educational material. New Confirmation material is working well also. Adults would like more students, however, there are a few former confirmation students attending.

Global Mission: St. Mark's collected \$573 as had 16 walkers and 5 dogs. A great turnout!

Property: The repair of the archway and painting of the belltower has been completed. The doors need to be kept open to allow circulation of the air to the bell tower. There were a few moist spots above the archway ceiling and roof needs to be checked. Boss roofing has already been contacted. Awnings are being looked at being replaced in the spring. The furnaces have been turned on. The temperature needs to maintain 60 degrees for the organ. Bowman's electric is looking at replacing light fixtures, they are also checking in to the state/ComEd for monetary assistance. Marilyn finished mulching the flower beds. Lori is touching up paint on the names on the stained glass windows. Oran and Kent will help change light bulbs. Sara is going to help look for a kitchen door. We will have a church clean up day, October 30th. Caulking and painting front porch of parsonage is still ongoing. We need more people to be on the Property committee. Merla is the only person, and the constitution says we need to have at least 3 people on the committee.

Council of Churches: September 28th meeting was held. Suzanne, Merla, and Pastor attended. Secondhand Rose received \$9500 in grants. Lifeline pantry needs promoting in the city as many people do not know where it is. A new council president is needed. Both the Brethren and Pine Crick Christian churches have new pastors. The next meeting is November 23rd at 7pm at Crossroads Church. St. Mark's is asked to provide 200 boxes of Au Gratin potatoes for the Christmas baskets this year.

Constitution Committee: Met on 10/11/21, went over 9 chapters. Many questions and Merla will contact the Synod to see if it applies to our smaller congregation. Next meeting is October 27th at 3pm.

Old Business: A Thrivent grant was secured for the fall supper; it will be used for supplies. A portion of the proceeds will go to hunger. It will be decided on exact amount once proceeds are counted.

New Business: A letter will be written from the St. Mark's Council to the City of Polo about the proposal of Route 26 parking that we need to retain our parking spaces out front.

Other Business: Terry will get information from Lori on the budget, Craig and Lisa will also join the committee to form a 2022 budget to present. Sara will be on the nomination committee as the outgoing member. Terry Jenkins offered to be head usher for November. Lisa will be November Custodian. December 4th 4-6pm String Orchestra will be at St. Mark's, Kent made a motion to approve, Sara seconded, motion approved. Craig made a motion to approve Lori to put Tythe.ly on our website for additional ways to donate, and Linda advertise on our Facebook, Sara made a second, motion approved.
