Monroe County American Legion Convention

The Convention was held at Greece Post 468, on June 6, 2015. We had 10 of our 11 allotted delegates attending. Notable items include: Commander Bob Rose was relieved by Commander Brian Mitchell. All County offices with the exception of Sergeant-at-Arms are filled. Ray McCormick, our Adjutant, will be our Post Delegate to the District and Department conventions. Bob Morell, Past Department Commander, informed us that at the upcoming National Convention a motion will be made to increase annual dues by \$5.00 to cover increased operating costs at the National level (our most recent increase of \$5.00 was because of increased operating costs at the Department level). The Monroe County American Legion Chaplains requested that whenever a member is seriously ill or passes away that the Chaplains are notified as soon as possible to ensure the member & family get full advantage of their Veterans status. There will be a Wounded Warrior concert at Greece Post on August 15, 2015 with approximately 15 bands; early tickets are \$15 and will be \$20 at the door. Several state senators and a representative from Congresswoman Louise Slaughter's office spoke, pledging their undying loyalty to and support of, Veterans. Congresswoman Slaughter's representative told us that the VA has been granted authority to begin work on the new Rochester VA Outpatient Clinic and that she supports legislation for a federal veteran ID card. The overriding message from the state senators and local representatives was to become and remain "politically active" – not for any particular party, but for any issue that concerns you.

American Legion Boys State

American Legion Boys State is among the most respected and selective educational programs of government instruction for U.S. high school students. A participatory program in which students become part of the operation of local, county and state government, Boys State was founded in 1935 to counter the socialism-inspired Young Pioneer Camps. The program was the idea of two Illinois Legionnaires, Hayes Kennedy and Harold Card, who organized the first Boys State at the Illinois State Fairgrounds in Springfield. American Legion Auxiliary sponsors a separate but similar program for young women called Girls State.

At Boys State, participants learn the rights, privileges and responsibilities of franchised citizens. The training is objective and centers on the structure of city, county and state governments. Operated by students elected to various offices, Boys State activities include legislative sessions, court proceedings, law-enforcement presentations, assemblies, bands, choruses and recreational programs. Legion posts select high school juniors to attend the program. In most cases, individual expenses are paid by a sponsoring post, a local business or another community-based organization.

Boys State programs currently exist in all Legion departments except Hawaii. As separate corporations, Boys State programs vary in content and method of procedure, but each adheres to the same basic concept: teaching government from the township to the state level.

The Healing Fingers



We all use touch for therapy – when we think, we put our chin on our fist, and when we’re uncomfortable, we rub our hands together as if we’re cold. Even babies suck on their thumbs when they go to sleep. We don’t do all of these things for nothing, as each part of our body is connected to a whole system. If we know where to apply pressure in the system, we can overcome various physical and mental symptoms.

Finger Touch Therapy originates from an ancient Chinese technique, in which every finger relates to different organs and emotions. In a study conducted by the Mercy Cancer Center in the U.S., all of the participants experienced beneficial sensations, including reduced stress and nausea during chemotherapy. Additionally, many patients that reported difficulties sleeping found that by holding their thumb and taking deep breaths, they were able to fall asleep much faster. It is assumed that thumb holding is related to the way babies suck on their thumbs, but either way, both patients and doctors strongly recommend this method.

To use this technique, all you have to do is make a fist around the finger that’s connected to the sensation or body-part you wish to soothe, and slowly apply pressure to it for 3-5 minutes while breathing deeply. If you want to balance your whole body, simply do it for each finger on both hands.

Thumb

- Sensations: Anxiety, worry, and depression
- Organs: Stomach and spleen
- Physical Symptoms: Stomachaches, headaches, skin problems, and stress

Index Finger

- Sensations: Fear, frustration, uncertainty, and confusion
- Organs: Kidneys and bladder
- Physical Symptoms: Indigestion, discomfort in the arms, elbows and wrists, muscle pains, backaches, teeth related problems, and any type of addiction.

Middle Finger

- Sensations: Anger, restlessness, and indecisiveness
- Organs: Liver and gallbladder
- Physical Symptoms: Eye and vision problems, lethargy, migraines, frontal headaches, period pains, and circulatory system issues.

Ring Finger

- Sensations: Sadness, grief, fear of abandonment and rejection, negativity
- Organs: Lungs and large intestine
- Physical Symptoms: Indigestion, respiratory problems, tinnitus, deep-layer skin problems

Pinky

- Sensations: Low self-esteem, judgmental behavior, and stress
- Organs: Heart and small intestine
- Physical Symptoms: Stomachaches, headaches, skin problems, and stress
