







MILD/MODERATE DISABILITIES

- Normalizes that everyone needs help
- As teachers learn skills to help students with more significant needs, they expand their toolbox to help those with lesser needs
- Culture of inclusion decreases bullying (often targets are students with mild/moderate disabilities)
- Para support in the classroom helps students with lesser needs

Students with Significant Needs

- Prepares students for the real community they are a part of, including their faith community
- Increases their academic exposure and achievement
- Strengthens social skills and job skills
- Provides Peer models
- Build real and meaningful relationships within the community of learners

Benefits for Peers

- Exposure to a more diverse group of learners
- Prepares them for the real community they will be a part of
- Additional support (Special Educators, Paras, therapists, etc.) help catch students who might fall through the cracks
- As teachers expand their toolbox of teaching strategies and supports, all students benefit.
- Teaches our Catholic values in a real life setting

Benefits for Teachers & Staff

- Expands their toolbox
- Techniques they learn can be transferred to other students
- Allows them to live their faith more fully
