
Minutes - Board meeting - June 16, 2014





The Club's Society case entry won:







Meeting Recap - Ellensburg Blue Agates

Presenter: Nick Zentner, CWU Geology Dept.Highlights from meeting notes by Carol Devine

- Much of Washington was formed elsewhere and brought to North America. Ten million years ago the Earth's crust in this region warped and cracked forming Umptanum Ridge.
- Ellensburg Blue agates come from one of the several layers of basalts deposited between 150 and 40 million years ago, the Tianaway Formation, which can be seen as an almost vertical very dark layer behind Liberty Café on Highway 97.
 Another layer, the SWAK Formation, has dikes of brown lava which have produced gold nuggets. (Search on the Internet for Liberty Gold, and Robert Repin videos.)


- Ellensburg blues were washed by an ancient river through Green Canyon Notch and deposited in the alluvial fan north of Highway 97. A 1961 map by John Prentiss Thompson accurately identified this deposit.
- The majority of this land is now privately owned. However, there is a BLM managed, publicly owned section of land still accessible to rock collectors. It is still wild, beautiful, and has few visitors. To learn its exact location with GPS coordinates, contact nick@geology.cwu.edu
- Ellensburg blue agates are the most valuable if they are blue throughout the stone.
- Blue agates are also found in Brazil, Germany, Tibet and parts of Europe.
- Blue agates are blue for the same reasons the sky is blue. Particles of light scatter inside the agate.

Nick Zentner is an entertaining and knowledgeable speaker. For the past 10 years, he has specialized in video production. To promote geology as a career, Nick is explaining the unique geological features of central Washington State in brief videos accessible to the public on the Internet.

Following the presentation, Club members displayed an impressive array of Ellensburg blue agates.
