**JOY'S JOURNALING****Are you allergic?**

Recently we have discovered that our kids are full of allergies. Oh boy! I can definitely relate to them, as I have grown up with continuous allergy problems, hay fever, etc. It's no fun to not be able to breathe, or sing sometimes due to the pollen content in the air.

And so we begin our journey of allergy shots. Mercy, Brooklyn, Jamie and Noel stood there like troopers as the nurse gave each of them their first shots (one in each arm). I sat there so proud of them as not one tear fell from their eyes, in fact, they all said after the shot, "Is that it?"

Time took me back to a day when I was young and I had to go through that regimen of scheduled shots to help me combat my allergy symptoms.

I asked our allergist to explain how these shots actually work. She began to describe the process of how she would take a vial of saline solution, and put a

certain amount of the extracts of the things that the girls were allergic to into that vial. It would be mixed up, and then that vial (#6—which was the most potent) would be poured into vial #5 (which had a small amount of saline solution in it) - that in turn would be poured into vial #4, #4 would be poured into #3, #3 would be poured into #2 and finally #2 would be poured into vial #1 which is the least potent of those extracts. #1 would be the most diluted.

We would then begin to inject those extracts into the girls' arms beginning with vial #1 three times a week, increasing the dosage as time went on. She said the body would build up immunities to those airborne pollens, molds, etc. so the girls would be able to live around those things that they cannot get away from, without any problems. Eventually, they wouldn't have to take the shots anymore because their bodies would be immune to the very things that were harming them at this present time.

As I thought about all this, the Lord revealed something to me about this very

thing.

We live in a very sinful world. Sin is all around us. Sometimes we partake of sin in small amounts, and if we continue in that sin, it eventually will end up with us partaking in that sin in larger amounts. If we continue in the sin then we become "immune," so to speak, to that particular sin. As time goes on, we get to the point where that sin doesn't affect us anymore.

Just like the allergy shots, we start out with "just one drink" or "just one pill" or "just one time" or "just one kiss or encounter" ... "just one sin" As we increase our "dosage" we become immune to sin. Sin (like the allergies) doesn't seem to affect us, doesn't seem to bother us, doesn't seem to disrupt our lifestyle, because we are now so used to it being "in our bodies" that we can now live "happily ever after" with our sin.

People, this world is a sin-sick, fallen world. We are not supposed to be "comfortable" in it, after all, this world is not our home. Our Home is Heaven above, if we are saved. There,

Psalm 27:6

"And now shall mine head be lifted up above mine enemies round about me: therefore will I offer in his tabernacle sacrifices of joy; I will sing, yea, I will sing praises unto the LORD."

there will be no sin.

So what do we do? Sin—like allergies—is all around us. We cannot get away from some things "For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23) BUT we can choose **what** we are around. I, for one, choose to stay away from those things that will harm my spiritual life; those sins that "so easily beset us." I don't want to build up my "immune system" to sin. I don't **want** to get to the point where sin doesn't bother me, nor affect the way I live.

Now, the girls will endure their allergy shots so they can live and breathe comfortably without getting sick anymore with pneumonia, bronchitis, strep throat, etc. We will continue **those** shots to build up their immunities to those things which are harmful to them

BUT we don't EVER want to be immune to sin.

As for me and my house... We will remain **ALLERGIC** ... to sin!

There is nothing like Summer Camp. Lots of youth come and while here they experience God. They enjoy great Bible teaching/preaching,

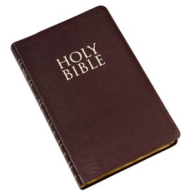

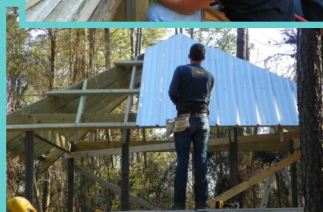
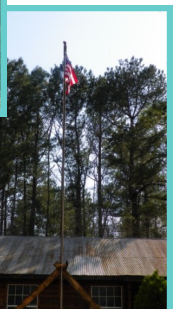
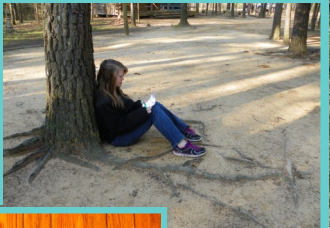
That same desire that spurred me on in times past still pushes at me and at times my tears

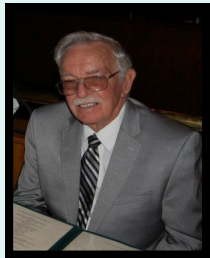
push to be released because of my inability to find the life-size cypress wood slabs on which I can get back to my chore!

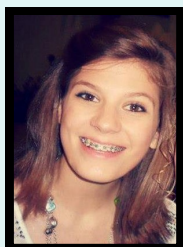
We are still winning though the battles sometimes get rough!

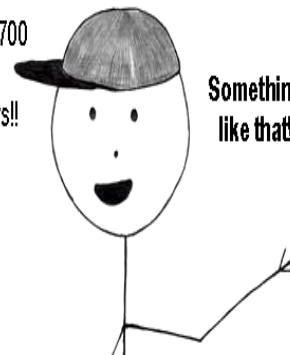


Hey Sticky! Heard you went to Psalms Camp. What did you learn?

TEARS AND FEARS

Joy told me the Newsletter is ready except we needed to fill one page. My first thought was let's ask everyone to shorten their article or post pictures. Then off I went to camp to mow. I can think best working at camp. I can ride the big mower and cry with no one to hear me or see me. Yes, I wept today. I don't know why sometimes.

I decided today to fill the last page about Psalms Camp. The Lisemby Family rented other camp facilities for a few years when we began to host music and Bible camps. Then we decided to build Psalms Camp on the very property that was owned and farmed by Ms. Sue's Dad, H.B. Grice and family. Mother inherited some of the twenty-seven acres, and then the Lisemby Family Evangelistic Ministries, Inc. bought the rest from Uncle C.B. Grice, Uncle Clifton Grice, and Aunt Lurlene Wolfe. Many friends and supporters helped to build and maintain the campgrounds for several years.

Things were doing pretty well until Dad's health began to fail. Our travels slowed down. Some of the group began to move into other ministries. I drove trucks and took a job at a local church, and was Arkansas State Chaplain for the Human Development Center of Warren, Arkansas for a few years. Psalms Camp suffered deterioration and decay. Lisemby Family

Ministries weakened along with Dad's health. Our travels with Concerts and Revivals help fuel the cost of the camp. The camp helped take care of the endless needs of our travels. Both suffered.

In 2005 Dad, Mother, Ricky and I had a meeting—heart to heart—we decided that the Lisemby Family, though we were weak, hurting, and struggling, had dropped the ball. We acknowledged that God had done a work, and we had let go in discouragement. With tears and fears we prayed and told God we would repent and take up the load and go until...

There was much work to do. The camp was a mess—no air conditioning, porches were rotting, etc. We had dropped insurance and unplugged the meters on the buildings. Mother said, "I'll call the insurance lady and re-instate the policy, and call the electric company and turn power on to the buildings." Ricky said, "I'll clean the campground and make it presentable again." I said, "I'll cut up fallen trees, burn and start mowing and weed eating." Dad said he would do what he could do. Tears and fears came as we prayed for forgiveness and asked for help.

Now we had not traveled hardly at all for a long time and hadn't had camp for two years. As I returned home from our family meeting I began to put together the menus and game plan

for camp when the phone rang. Bro. Billy Smith from Murmil Baptist Church in El Dorado, Arkansas called me and said his church would like to come to camp at Psalms Camp and asked for a date for camp. I almost fell out in astonishment. He had forty-two people that was to come. We hadn't even advertised yet! Our God is BIG, isn't He! I pulled the air conditioner out of my house, put it at the cafeteria and we said "Let's go do this thing!" The next year we added air conditioning to the Chapel and the next year added bathrooms in the Chapel, etc, etc.

In 2007 when Dad died, our lawnmower had broken down and I couldn't mow the camp for the funeral. Well Bro. Mike and Dawn Holloway from Cook Baptist Church in Ruston, Louisiana came and mowed, cleaned, and wept with us during this said time in our life. Every year since then, the youth of Cook Baptist have come to help clean the grounds. And Murmil Baptist has returned for camp year after year. Amen!

Bro. Mike and Cook Baptist Church, and Bro. Billy Smith and Murmil Baptist Church have been a steady help as we got back on our feet. There are others that have helped and encouraged us, but today I wanted to single out these two men and their churches. We are traveling more now than ever before and the camp is growing and becoming beautiful again. People have come

from everywhere and are seeing needs.

I drove around today, thankful for the X-Mark mower given to us; all the plumbing help, carpentry help, dozer help, ditch witch help, power box and electrical help; meter loops; painting; back-hoe help; sweat; bridge help; fish in pond help, kitchen help, electric cable, lighting, flag-pole help, game room help, etc. So thankful.

I wept today and I don't know why—maybe memories good and bad, maybe because of missing Dad. We were a team; we were tight. Maybe because of the waste of time in my life...chasing money, fortune, fame and recognition—how silly! The thing that means the most to me is being ever present with my family—traveling, singing, preaching the Gospel, and to continue providing a beautiful campground for groups to come learn of our Lord.

Psalms Camp has two reputations: 1) Best food in the world! And 2) People say they feel the Presence of the Lord here. I say "Amen!"

Would you take a moment right now and whisper a prayer that the Lisemby Family will stay in the Will of the Lord, and as the old song says...."Work 'til Jesus comes!"

I prefer the times in my life when it is easy to march from victory unto victory. But I remember best those precious times when I crawl toward God in "Tears and Fears."

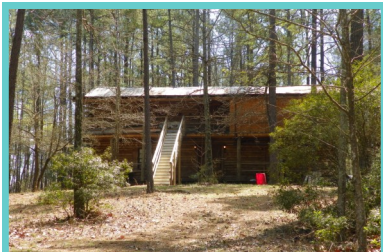

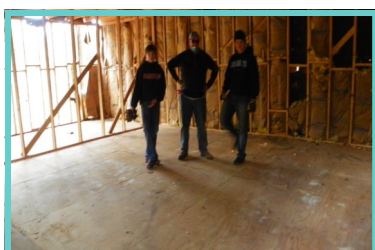

- **DONNIE'S LODGE:** Built in memory of Donnie Verret. Killed by a drunk driver coming home from a Youth Camp. Last year an upstairs bathroom was added along with entrance to the upstairs.
1. Donnie's Lodge needs two (2) large window A/C units Heat & Cool if possible.
 2. New mattresses



- **GAME ROOM:** Next year Psalms Camp will have completed a Game

Room that will need at least one (1) large A/C unit, new flooring—carpet, some new furniture and tables for games, foosball, etc.

- **SINGLE CABINS:** Psalms Camp needs a building built to lodge Pastors, Teachers or Special Guests. Sort of a motel unit. Looking at duplex type or individual small cabin units big enough for bed, sitting area and bathroom. A great Church project perhaps or build something in honor or memory of a loved one.



- **CHAPEL**—Built in memory of Uncle Ray Lisemby.
 1. Carpet has faded over the years, and needs to be replaced.
 2. 5 ton AC/Heat unit.



- **CAFETERIA**—Built in memory of C.P. & Rachel Verret (grandparents of Donnie Verret) In desperate need of new flooring; commercial grade tile or wood.
