A Brief History Of Westminster Lodge No. 2227

The Westminster Elks Lodge began organizational meetings on Febr. 14, 1961, at the Shangri-La restaurant, with John Prunk and several State Elks Association officials presiding. The organizational meetings continued till April 30, 1961, at which time the Lodge was officially instituted at Lakewood Lodge No. 1777 with 383 charter members. John Prunk was elected first Exalted Ruler.

In May of 1961 the Lodge leased the basement of the A & A Pharmacy Building at 3815 W. 72nd Place. Through the efforts of a number of members, the basement was finished enough to serve as a club and Lodge facility. The Lodge immediately launched itself into charitable work holding its first Charity Ball on Nov. 8, 1961. The proceeds from the Charity Ball went to buy food baskets for needy families in the area; these baskets are distributed by members just before Christmas. The first Charity Queen was Leona Wright. During this first year, considerable work was done at Laradon Hall as another charitable project. During this year, the groundwork was laid which resulted in our sponsorship of the annual Colorado State High School Rodeo.

The second year of the Lodge began April 1, 1962, with Robert Wise as Exalted Ruler. This year saw an expansion of all our activities, including the first sponsorship of the State High School Rodeo. During this year, the Lodge purchased five acres of ground from the City of Westminster; this is the ground where our new Lodge building now sets.

The third year of the Lodge saw George Wright, Jr. as Exalted Ruler. The fourth year we had Paul Beacom as Exalted Ruler. This, our fifth year, has Byron M. Day as Exalted Ruler.

During each of these years, our Exalted Rulers have expanded our activities, both charitable and social. During the second year, the seeds of hope for a building of our own were really planted. Though the possibility seemed remote at that time, several hard working members continued to plan and work. In our fourth year we were able to negotiate a loan committeent and a building contract. Now here in our fifth year, we have built our building and we proudly present it for your inspection. Most of the interior finishing work has been done by our members and no words can express the thanks we all owe to those who took their time to complete the job.
