Words from Our Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ at Trinity Presbyterian Church,

s we prepare to welcome a new pastor to Trinity Church, I thought it might be helpful for me to share with you a brief overview of how a person becomes a Presbyterian minister these days. Becoming a Presbyterian Minister is not an easy process. My journey through the process was so long ago that I've forgotten some of it, but I checked the current version of the Presbyterian Church Book of Order and noted these important pieces of the process:

Academic Requirements: To be a Presbyterian minister you need to complete a bachelor's degree (in practically any subject) at an accredited college or university. Then you need to complete a three or four year Master of Divinity degree at an accredited seminary or divinity school. It is preferable for Presbyterian pastors to attend one of the eleven Presbyterian seminaries in the United States. This is not always possible, and many Presbyterian pastors are being educated in non-denominational seminaries today (like Fuller Seminary in Pasadena, CA).

Ecclesiastical Requirements: The academic training is only one part of the preparation process for becoming a Presbyterian minister. Simply graduating from seminary with passing grades does not result in a person becoming a Presbyterian minister. There are significant steps carried out by the governing bodies of the churches that cannot be skipped. We call these the ecclesiastical requirements. The various presbyteries around the country are responsible for screening candidates for ministry to help in "testing" a person's call to ministry. Here are some of the requirements from the Book of Order and the local Presbytery:

Examination and acceptance into the process as an "Inquirer" by a church Session and a Presbytery.

Comprehensive psychological exam including several interviews with a licensed psychologist.

Passing grades on the nationally administered ordination exams in the areas of Reformed Theology, Worship & Sacraments, Polity (church government), Biblical Exegesis, and Bible Content. These requirements also include proficiency in both Greek and Hebrew.

Supervised internships of at least 400 hours in at least two Presbyterian churches.

One basic unit (400 hours) of supervised Clinical Pastoral Education in an accredited chaplaincy program.

Examination and acceptance by Session and Presbytery as a "candidate" for ministry through and examination on sense of call.

Examination and acceptance by Presbytery as certified ready to circulate a resume and receive a call to parish ministry. Successful defense of a one-page statement of faith.

Final Step: A person must have a job offer (call) to an approved ministry position in a particular presbytery. If it is a call to a congregation, the congregation's Pastor Nominating Committee and the entire congregation must vote to approve the calling and installing of the pastor. This step must also be voted on by the receiving presbytery which is also charged with examining the candidate's faith statement and sense of call to the ministry. Until a person has a job as a pastor or chaplain, he or she cannot be ordained as a Presbyterian minister.

The local presbytery also sets minimum salary, vacation, and study leave requirements for the calling of pastors to that region.

These employment obligations are referred to as the "terms of call" and they must be approved by the local congregation and the presbytery. In addition to the salary requirements of the local presbytery, there are also national requirements to participate in health insurance, life insurance, and retirement benefits.


The process can be quite challenging, but it helps individuals

discern whether God has gifted them and called them to a position as a pastor. These are only the "technical" aspects of the preparation process. There is of course so much more involved, but this gives you an overview of the Presbyterian method for becoming a pastor.

Please continue to keep your new pastor and Trinity Church in your prayers over the next few months of transition since it is both and exciting and challenging season for everyone.

I am thankful for the warm welcome that Elizabeth and I have received in our short season with all of you – and I know that you will offer the same hospitality and kindness to your next installed pastor.

The church office is rarely quiet and there is always something to do. Below are a few updates on what is (and is not) happening in my realm.

Lifewater Update

Good news! As of April 9, 2019, there are a total of 15 Healthy Homes in Kasambya Mbili and 12 Healthy Homes in Kasambya Moja. Kasambya Mbili and Kasambya Moja are the two villages we have sponsored through Lifewater.

A home is certified healthy when a family has adopted five healthy habits: washing hands with soap and water, storing and using water safely, building and using a bathroom with a roof and door, using a drying rack to keep dishes off the ground, and keeping the area around the home safe and clean.

When the 40 homes in each of the villages is designated a Healthy Home, the village will form a Water Board. This board will coordinate all further aspects of this project.

Sean Martin, our contact at Lifewater, visited Trinity Church on May 15th. He assured me that progress for each of these villages is a wonderful start. To have all the families on board with Healthy Homes will probably take a year or more. This is the most difficult part of the process because the families are asked to change habits that have been used for generations.

Meeting with Sean was a blessing for me and Barb Hughes who joined me. We had a great conversation about what to expect in the next two years or so. His passion to see others find salvation in Jesus and to help get resources to provide safe water to villages all around the world was inspiring.

On a lighter note, Sean had been playing for the worship team at Westminster Church when Pastor Jim was called. They had an opportunity to reminisce about times past.

Building Bridges

Building Bridges with Our Muslim Neighbors was canceled due to an insufficient number of attendees. It could have been hard for me to write these words because it could mean failure, but I have so much peace that this was one of those amazing "Godthings." In order to explain all that this has meant, I would need more room than I have. Suffice it to say, God knew long before I did what He had in mind for this time.
