Update on JNAC

As many of you are aware, this fall Eastside established a Joint Needs Assessment Committee ("JNAC"). The purpose of the JNAC process is to create a snapshot of the pastoral charge—the faith community and resources—in order to make a recommendation for what future ministry leadership the pastoral charge needs to live out God's mission in the world. As part of this process, the committee engaged with Eastside in a number of ways including group discussions during worship, individual surveys, focus groups, engagement with committee and one on one discussions. Thank you to all that participated and shared your views.

In December, the JNAC met and determined that based on the feedback received, we required additional assistance from Region 4 (formerly the Saskatchewan Conference and Wascana Presbytery) in order to move forward. As a result of these discussions, Region 4 has recommended that Eastside undergo a Review Process which involved interviews with the Reviewers this weekend, and as a result the JNAC has been put on hold in order to move forward with this review. Once the Review is complete, we will reengage and determine the next steps for the JNAC.

We ask for your patience as we move forward in this process and continue, with the assistance of the greater United Church, to determine the best path forward for this community.
