PENTWATER SPORTFISHING ASSOCIATION ANNUAL MEETING — August 26, 2016

Directors Present: Dean Jessup, George Cornell, Bruce Koorndyk (Immediate Past President), Dan Gettings, Steve Sauser, Lyn Snider, Rob Bannink

Members Present: Jan Jessup, Pam Cornell, Judy Koorndyk, Chris Sharp and family, Win and Bette Matteson, Brad Smith, Gary Hickman, Ken and Joni Wegner, Kurt Loosenort, Dale and Sharon Converse, Joe Primozich, Kristy Sauser and kids, Ron Bacon, and Mac McCaleb

The first order of business was the Potluck dinner – Prayer offered by Dean Jessup. Pulled pork and soft drinks provided by PSA and wonderful dishes provided by attending families and members. If you haven't attended – Make it a point to get there next year. It was a great meal and fellowship of friends and fishing fanatics.

Meeting called to order at 3:50 p.m. by President Dean Jessup.

- Motion to approve agenda by Lyn Snider, supported by Steve S. Motion carried agenda approved.
- Secretary's Report: George Cornell briefly discussed minutes from July 15th meeting
 Steve Sauser moved to accept as printed, supported by Lyn Snider. Motion carried.
- Treasurer's Report: Lyn S. handed out written report it was available to all members in attendance. Lyn went over all the categories and expenditures. As of Aug. 26th we have \$4,533.60 and are in very good shape financially. We also have 77 paid members as of the 26th and that is a solid increase over recent years. Keep trying to recruit and grow the PSA membership is what drives the organization. Pam Cornell moved to accept the report as present, supported by Win Matteson Motion carried.
- Old Business: Dan Gettings reported on clothing stocks and sales. We have a solid inventory of clothing – starting to run short on hats. Sales have been down in last 6 weeks since we had to cancel both the Ladies Classic and the Youth Classic due to weather.
- Don Van Zile Boaters Safety Class report: Dean J. reported that we had 13 enrolled in the July class and 16 in the August class. Classes are conducted by Officer Tim Simon from Oceana County and held at the Yacht Club. Very good class for boaters and young people needing class to operate personal watercraft. PSA co-sponsors the classes.
- PSA Youth Classic was cancelled due to weather and rough water. PSA did purchase books and trophies for the Youth Classic which will be used next year.

- PSA signs for the Memorial Day Derby will hopefully be improved for next year by volunteers from the Artisan Center in Pentwater. Gene Davidson said he could find someone to work on the signs over the off-season.
- Home-Coming Parade: Dean J. Thanked Rob Bannink and family for their efforts to get PSA showcased in the parade. <u>THANKS AGAIN ROB – GETTING THAT BOAT IN THE</u> <u>PARADE IS GREAT FOR PSA AND WE ALL ENJOY CHEERING IT ALONG THE PARADE</u> <u>ROUTE. - Village Fish Cleaning Station: After a brief discussion, it was moved that PSA would contribute \$100 to the Village to support the fish cleaning station. It was moved by Bruce K. and supported by Ken Wegner. Motion carried.
- New Business: George C. and Dan G. who were appointed as a Committee to get names to nominate to fill the PSA Board vacancy reported on their findings. They stated that they had discussed and solicited a number of names of folks who might be interested in serving as a Director for PSA. They recommended that Brad Smith of Holland/Pentwater be appointed by the Board to fill the existing vacancy to serve out the remaining term (2 years) of Bruce Koorndyk's election last year. Brad Smith was endorsed by the Board as a whole and was appointed to serve as a Director through 2019. Brad brings a wealth of experience with fishing organizations to PSA. Thanks Brad for agreeing to serve the PSA and Pentwater Sportfishing.
- Election of Directors: The terms for Lyn Snider and George Cornell were expiring.
 President Dean J. and Dan Gettings were the Committee to explore filling the vacancies.
 Both Snider and Cornell agreed to serve on Board again and stand for election. After a brief discussion and soliciting any nominations from the floor Lyn Snider and George Cornell were re-elected to the Board. There terms will expire in 2020.
- Big Fish Awards: George Cornell and Dan Gettings presented 2017 Big Fish Awards. Unfortunately, Steve Bandkau (Last Cast II) King Salmon award and Scott Neilly (Full Draw) Lake Trout award could not be present to receive their plaque and cash award. Gary "Doc" Hickman (Gray Fin) was present to receive his award for Brown Trout, as were Ken Wegner (Carpe Diem) for Coho Salmon, and Dean Jessup (Dean's Dream) for Steelhead. Updates from Dean J: Thank you to the board for another wonderful year.

Platte Weir update – to date they have had nearly 12,000 Coho running up the Platte River this fall!!! Good hopes for years to come. Manistee Weir has not been updated yet.

A Get Well Card was signed by all for Jerry Chesness. We miss you Jerry!

2018 Officer List – Updated list of PSA board of directors was handed out to all attendees. See the newsletter for updates.

Secretary's Report - Reviewed August meeting minutes, which had been e-mailed out to the board prior to this meeting. Aug and Sept minutes will both be distributed in the Sept monthly newsletter. Motion to accept minutes as presented by Rob B., second by Brad S. Passed.

Treasurer's Report – August was a little more expensive month with multiple trophies and awards purchased (all as expected). PSA funds are standing at \$3927.24. Only 1500 tickets to be printed. Tickets will again be mailed to all members in the spring. Please contact any board member for extra tickets.
- Web Page Update Dean J: The web page has been updated with pictures from the Bannink Lines Down Tournament and Annual Meeting in August. Please continue to send suggestions and updates for the web page to Dean J.
- Annual meeting Review Dean J: 26 adults and 5 kids enjoyed a fantastic dinner at the Pentwater Friendship Center. Plenty of food, fun, and laughter.
- Memorial Derby Sign repair George C will be coordinating with the Pentwater Artisan Center to update the PSA signs to have them ready for spring 2018.
 Bruce will help with winter contact for this project.

New Business:

- 2018 Calendar of Events Dean J: Proposed 2018 calendar was handed out to all attendees. Discussion by all about specifics. Ladies' Classic will be moved to July 28 to improve fishing and avoid the Ludington Tournament on July 14/15. All other dates discussed and accepted. Motion to accept calendar as discussed by Dan G, second by Lyn S. Passed.
- Youth Mini proposed for Aug 4. There was discussion about the name of the Youth Derby for PSA LIABILITY REASONS, the PSA can NOT run the event as an open call to area kids to go fishing. It needs to be limited to a mini tournament of PSA members taking invited kids on their own boats. The day will be called a Youth Mini Tournament with prizes given to kids on member boats.

- Big Fish Contest Plaque and \$500 Cash Award Dean J: Thank you once again to Wyn Matteson for the \$500 donation. All winners have received their trophies and show them with pride. Wyn Matteson has again graciously donated the cash prize for 2018 awards. Thank you!!!
- Winter Meeting Dean J: Winter board meeting will be held at Cabela's in Grandville. The meeting will be set for 12 noon on January 20, 2018.
- Fish Cleaning Station Update Dean J: The PSA again donated \$100 to the Village of Pentwater as in years past. The village is very grateful for this donation as there are few donations given specifically for the free community cleaning station. The cleaning station is in need of servicing on the grinder or possibly replacement, as there have been increasing issues over the past years with the large fish. This is very expensive and the PSA is considering a fund-raising effort to help the village with this vitally needed piece of equipment. We will continue to discuss this with PW Village and in future PSA meetings.
- PW Village Update Bruce K: Announced a Sept 26 meeting, 6:30pm, to present a draft idea on various Pentwater Village updates. Bruce serves on this Village Committee and also represents the PSA with Dean. They are looking at all community upgrade needs, and will also continue to look at the fish cleaning station needs as a point of discussion.
- Committee Member Appointments Dean J: Dean handed out PSA Committee
 Chairperson Assignments. All accepted.
 - Asian Carp Meeting Dean J: Thursday, Sep 14 there was a meeting in Muskegon by the Army Corp of Engineers about the Asian Carp threat in the great Lakes. Dean J made a statement representing the PSA. The PSA greatly opposes the threat of Asian Carp invasion and supports any efforts to successfully stop this threat.

One live fish has already been found above the electric barriers at the Brandon Road Dam near Joliet, IL. The electric barriers currently are turned off every time a barge passes through the locks.
