LIVE THE LITURGY

Do you ever wonder why so many images of a shepherd show him with a sheep around his neck? When sheep wander, they need to learn who to follow. A good shepherd realizes that in order for the animal to do this, there must be a bond so tight that they can "smell" like each other and the sheep can recognize the scent. Jesus has us around his neck. He wants us to follow him; not just his teachings, but in the relationship with his Father. Jesus shows us, by his life, suffering, death, and resurrection what we ought to do to be fully human and live as children of God. By bonding with those most poor and vulnerable, Jesus calls us to do the same and desires to be our Good Shepherd. As you worship here today, keep in mind an image of Jesus carrying you around his neck. He wants you to recognize him so that you can follow, especially when we find ourselves wandering away.

Some of you may be aware that I have had health issues with my heart over the past several years. Among other things, I became the proud owner of a pacemaker back in 2012. Those overseeing my medical care have also been keeping careful watch over the aortic valve in my heart, which began showing signs of wear and tear for the past several years.

During a routine doctor's visit last October, I learned that an echocardiogram test had shown that, while I didn't yet need to get the valve replaced, the situation was heading in that direction and might take place within the year. Along with my regular spring examination, it was decided that I needed another echocardiogram and that's when I found out that the time has come to replace my aortic valve. Over the past month, I've undergone a series of tests to determine how this was going to take place.

I am now able to let you know that I will be undergoing open-heart surgery in St. Louis on Wednesday, May 17, to replace the aortic valve in my heart. Surgeons from the Cardiovascular Division of Washington University School of Medicine will perform the surgery at BJC hospital.

It is my understanding that, following the surgery, my activities will be severely curtailed while I am recovering. Father Joseph Corel, our Vicar General, and our Chancellor, Sister Kathleen Wegman and all of my colleagues at our Catholic Center will be picking up any slack, for which I am very grateful.

I humbly ask that you assist me in the days ahead with fervent prayers to our loving God for my complete and speedy recovery. May God bless you all.



Monsignor Higley will Lead Pilgrimage Our Lady of Sorrows Shrine in Starkenburg - May 21

The Historic Shrine of Our Lady of Sorrows Shrine at Starkenburg will host its annual Spring Pilgrimage on Sunday, May 21, 2017.

The special day will begin at 10:00 a.m. with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. The Pilgrims will then carry a replica of the White Lady, an image that has been at the Shrine since 1852, in a rosary procession through the Shrine grounds, stopping at each of the outdoor Stations of the Cross.

A traditional German meal of fried chicken, roast beef, mashed potatoes, green beans, corn, slaw and dessert will be served by members of the Church of the Risen Savior from 11:00 p.m. – 1:00 p.m. The meal will be served in Valentine Hall, which is handicapped accessible and air-conditioned. The public is welcome to attend the meal, even if not participating in the Pilgrimage.

"We look forward to welcoming the Sacred Heart choir from Columbia Missouri to our Spring Pilgrimage." said Msgr. Higley. "All are invited to spend a refreshing, prayerful day in the pastoral environs of this beautiful shrine." Rev Msgr. Greg Higley, pastor of Church of the Risen Savior.

Following the meal, the Sacrament of Reconciliation will be heard. The day will conclude with Benediction at 1:00 p.m. and Mass at the Outdoor Altar at 2:00 p.m., with Monsignor Higley, officiating. He is the Pastor at St. George in Hermann and Church of the Risen Savior in Rhineland.

Religious articles will be available for sale and will be blessed in the afternoon.

The Shrine of Our Lady of Sorrows is located in Montgomery County, just 2 miles north of the Katy Trail, on Highway P. Directions to the Shrine of Our Lady of Sorrows:

From I-70: take the New Florence/Hermann Exit and go South on Highway 19. In Big Spring, turn right onto Highway K. Turn left onto Highway P at Americus. Go approximately 5 miles, Starkenburg is on your right. The Shrine of Our Lady of Sorrows is handicapped accessible. The Shrine and St. Martin's Church Museum are open daily for visitors.
