Dear Dr. Baker, Mr. Foreman and Zanesville City Schools Sponsor Governing Board.

During the 2017-18 school year Zanesville Community High School had a student enrollment as high as 145. Our May Commencement Ceremony was on May 18, 2018 at Zanesville High School where 69 students received diplomas.

During the 2017-18 year, Zanesville Community High School also received an Auditor of State award for a clean audit of our financial records.

The Zanesville Community High School 2018 ODE DORP Report Card was recently released. Four different measures are calculated to determine the report card final overall rating. These include Combined Graduation Rate, High School Assessment Test Passage, Progress, and Measureable Objectives. We as a school achieved 71 points out of a possible 100. The school then received a Meets Standards for the final rating on the 2018 DORP Report Card.

During the 2017-18 school year, we collaborated with the Boy Scouts of America and the Learn for Life program to give our students access to employment opportunities within our county. Our students toured five different manufacturing facilities within Muskingum County. We also worked with area managers to facilitate mock interviews for our students. These interviews created an opportunity for our students to get the experience of an interview with feedback and the ability to meet area managers.

With regards to attendance, we continue to struggle with getting our students to understand the importance of daily school attendance. Our students face many obstacles outside of school which prevents them from making school a priority. We are doing a good job with breaking down some of these barriers; however, we still have a long way to go. We filed truancy charges on four students and two of those students graduated, one transferred to a GED program and the other student is still enrolled and working towards a diploma.

On June 12, 2018, the Ohio Department of Education conducted an FTE Review. They reviewed a sample of 24 students and the findings were minimal with only one student left unresolved due to no proof of residence document on file. Also, during this review, we focused on an improvement plan for our Blended Learning (FLEX) Program. This proved to be very helpful as we moved forward in the process.

Our greatest strength, as a school, is the relationships that we build with our students. These relationships lead to an improvement in attendance, greater desire to be motivated and the achievement of high school diplomas.

Please find attached to this letter a copy of our 2018 report card and our educational plan.
