

ULTRAFAST BROADBAND IS HERE!

Great news! The Emmington end of the village can now upgrade to ultrafast broadband as phase I of the works by Openreach has been completed.

The work will take place in three separate stages, Emmington end, centre of the village and Stert end. Once each section is completed residents will be able to apply to broadband providers to upgrade their connection, the connection will be the responsibility of the provider.

Everyone at the Emmington end of the village should now able to order and be connected to ultrafast broadband. Those who applied for a voucher, which helped us get the scheme funded by the government, should order as soon as possible.

Phase II works, (the centre of the village) is about to start and Phase III (The Stert end of the village) will follow on from Phase II.

NEW GATE TO FIELD TO ALLOTMENT

A TOE grant has been secured for a new kissing gate to replace the gate into the field leading to the allotments. In addition, hardcore will be laid in the entrance area to try to reduce the mud and make it a bit safer.

PLAYING FIELD

Football goals will need to be repaired or replaced ready for the spring and a new hedge will be planted later in the month or early April depending on the weather.

EMERGENCY PLAN

Unfortunately even after we had managed to get SSE to spend hundreds of thousands of pounds putting the main electric feeder cables to the village underground and provide a feed from two different directions, we still suffered a power cut during Storm Eunice as both feeds went down due to the storm. At least we were off for a much shorter time than some of the nearby villages. The relocation of the generator needs to be investigated so it can be used if this happens again at a location where basic facilities can be provided - a cup of tea, recharge phones, a bit of warmth.

SPEEDING ON B4445

A safety audit has been undertaken as required by Chinnor PC and the recommendation to move the chicane 5m towards Chinnor has been implemented. The next stage, public consultation, has already commenced and the aim it for the results to be presented to the Oxfordshire County Council Committee in June.

The village has also been included in phase 1 of the County wide roll-out of 20mph zones. We are awaiting an update from OCC as to the next steps and timings



A handheld speed gun and 20mph bin stickers have been purchased. 2 stickers are to be delivered to each house on the main road one for each of the main bins, green and black, to be placed over the 30mph sticker. If you would be interested in joining a speed watch team for ad hoc deployment of the speed gun please contact Heather Mullins the Parish Clerk.

The VAS sign on the B4445, on the Chinnor side of The Inn at Emmington, is to be relocated to the opposite side of the road due to ongoing issues with its operation. The works are planned to be undertaken on 6th April.

New **Welcome to Sydenham** signs have been ordered and will be put into place in due course. The gates at the Stert end of the village will be painted before the new signs are fixed.

FOOTPATHS AND BRIDLEWAYS

The top end of Jays bridleway needs a hardcore top up once the weather improves and the bridleway dries up.

The Sewells Lane works carried out by OCC have made a huge difference, but we still need to lay some hardcore on the very narrow portions where it is muddy and bridleway widening was not possible. The village will need to undertake maintenance work during the year to maintain the extra width provided by the heavy vegetation clearance by OCC.

A Potts Possy working party spread more wood chippings on the path by the allotments on Mothering Sunday. The chippings were provided to us free by our local garden services provider, 'Two Oaks Landscapes Ltd' (George Butler) – Thank You!



in memory of CYNTHIA JOYCE GOMME

It is with great sadness to announce that Cynthia Gomme passed away on 20th February 2022. She was a resident of Sydenham for 30 years.

All who knew Cynthia would know that she was a kind, truthful, trustworthy lady. She always helped people, without judgement, because that was who she was, kind natured and thoughtful and not expecting anything back in return.

Cynthia never bragged about her achievements, like being awarded a British Empire Medal by Her Majesty the Queen in 2018 for her services to music and charity, followed by an invitation to a garden party at Buckingham Palace in 2019.



Also, in 2020 she was awarded a certificate by Rennie Grove Hospice Care, given in recognition of 10 years' service.

She had a lifelong career as an Occupational Therapist, spanning from 1959. She progressed in her career to become Head Occupational Therapist, being responsible for all occupational therapy services within the High Wycombe and District Hospital Management Committee.

Cynthia gave over 30 years of service to the New London Music Society Summer School. She gave 100% of her time, attention and hard work to this every summer and always talked about it with great enthusiasm and passion. One great passion was her love of animals, especially cats, which she adored. This was especially true of her cat Sherry, to whom she referred to as the cat who had adopted her!

We will all miss Cynthia and will remember her with great fondness and love.

in memory of DOUG NEWHAM LVO DFC

We are very sad to report that having celebrated his 100th Birthday last November, Doug died on 14th March 2022. He moved to Sydenham in 1988 and played a major part in village affairs.

Among his numerous contributions, he obtained/sold all the advertising for the Sydenham Fayre programme for many years; with Ray Harris he negotiated the 99-year lease of the OSR with the Diocese, formed it into a Registered Charity in order to apply for various grants including from the Millennium Commission, and chaired the OSR Committee during the building's major restoration. He and Julienne moved from Walnut Barn to Cumbria to be nearer one of their sons in 2006.

Doug was 17 when the war broke out in 1939 and was a civilian junior technician working on the early-warning radar network. It was vital for alerting Fighter Command that German squadrons were approaching, giving RAF pilots time to get their fighters airborne to intercept, before their airfields and other critical infrastructure could be destroyed.

For the 2020 Royal British Legion's Festival of Remembrance Doug explained:

"Our work involved the design and production of back-up synchronising systems for the early-warning radar network, in case the primary system was disrupted by bombing. Radar stations were, of course, vital for the control of Fighter Command during the Battle of Britain. My own work, as a junior technician, included working visits to Fighter Command HQ and to about half of the individual radar sites.

I was a very young man at the time, and while the experience of being dive-bombed at close quarters was certainly a unique experience, I had to carry on with my work.

Those were very challenging times indeed."

Doug joined the RAF the following year and had a distinguished career in Bomber Command. After the war he married Julienne and spent 36 years in a further distinguished career rising to General Manager Operations Control at BOAC/British Airways and was awarded his LVO (Lieutenant of the Royal Victorian Order) in 1969, 'for personal Royal Flight planning services to Her Majesty'.

Doug was very humble about what he had accomplished, always recognising the immense good fortune which he had enjoyed. A memorial Service was held at Caldbeck, Cumbria on 11th April, to commemorate and "celebrate the wonderful life that I have been so privileged to enjoy".

Always willing to help, always willing to give up his time, Mick will be greatly missed by all the staff and regulars at The Inn and our thoughts go out to his partner Linda and all his family - RIP Bondy.

The week after the last newsletter, Storm Eunice was forecast to hit the South of England on Friday afternoon and sure enough as the winds whipped up the trees and power lines came down. Despite a couple of flickers, the power thankfully stayed on at this end of the village although we did have an open plan garden looking out onto the Thame road as the entire garden fence came crashing down - guess who helped fix that back up on the Sunday morning? On March 31st, we celebrated 5 years at The Inn and at the time of going to press we were looking forward to partying away to the sounds of local Chinnor Group MFU who were postponed from December last year due to high Covid levels - thank goodness that's all disappeared!!!? Well, from the news anyway! But seriously, a huge thank you to everybody who has supported us over the past 5 years we have been at The Inn and living in Sydenham - as a family, as part of the community and as a business, we have felt welcomed and appreciated, so thank you.
