Elderly white male who is 5'6" and weighs 180 lbs. Hair grey; irides blue. There are defects in the iris in each eye. The upper jaw is edentulous; the lower teeth are in fair condition.

There is a large cluster of multiple stabwounds which extend from the chin down to just below the xiphoid process; this measures 13" in the vertical and extends from the nipple line on the right over to the left shoulder - measures 10" horizontal.

There are three main clusters; one large cluster which lies in the nipple line and extends for 3" on the left side and 2" on the right side and this constitutes 28 stabwounds. The second smaller cluster in the epigastrium which consists of 5 stabwounds and a third cluster of the anterior neck which starts at the suprasternal notch and extends up to the thyroid cartilage and this consists of 13 stabwounds. There are also stabwounds extended along the mandible and this cluster consists of 5 stabwounds; there are also two small stabwounds on the left side of the face which are superficial; these stabwounds all measure approximately 1/2" in length except in some areas where they coalesce to form larger wounds. There is also a stabwound of the right axilla which penetrates into the underlying soft tissues for a distance of 2"; there is one in the lateral half of the mid portion of the left biceps which only penetrates into the underlying tissues for 3/4".

The stabwounds in the neck are seen to penetrate through the both lobes of the thyroid, through the trachea in two places, through the thyroid cartilage and through the left lobe of the thyroid as well as penetrating down the back of the neck on the left side; the stabwounds of the larynx, trachea and thyroid gland stop at the spinal column; the one on the left side of the neck penetrates for a distance of 1".

There are multiple penetrations of the ribs, intercostal spaces and of the sternum and these extend from the first interspace downward to the xiphoid process. In its mid portion the coalescence of the stabwounds cuts the sternum in half at the level of the 4th rib. Six of these wounds go into the heart and some go through the heart; there are others which involve the great vessels particularly the ascending aorta where there are 5 stabwounds of the aorta below the great vessels and 4 stabwounds of the aorta below the heart; these stabwounds all stop at the spine and measure 6 1/2" in length. The direction of the stabwounds is front to back. There are also 4 stabwounds of the most medial portion of the upper lobe of the left lung and also several stabwounds of the most medial portion of the upper lobe of the right lung; as a result of these wounds there is 450 c.c. of blood in the left chest cavity and 400 c.c. of blood in the right chest cavity. There is also approximately 100 c.c. of blood in the pericardial cavity.

PRIMARY INCISION: Panniculus up to 3 cm.

CIRCULATORY SYSTEM: The heart weighs 400 grams. Epicardium and endocardium smooth. Myocardium firm and pale. Valves unremarkable. Coronary arteries are thinned. There is mild aortic arteriosclerosis.

RESPIRATORY SYSTEM: Lungs weigh 600 grams; they are pale; there is aspirated blood in the parenchyma. Many of the stabwounds penetrate deeply into the parenchyma of the lungs. Bronchioles, bronchi, trachea, larynx and thyroid gland show nothing other than stabwounds previously described.

G.I. TRACT: Stomach contains a quart of partially digested food.
LIVER: The liver weighs 1700 grams. It shows fatty metamorphosis.
SPLEEN: Spleen weighs 90 grams. Soft, mushy pulp.
PANCREAS: Nothing noteworthy.
ADRENALS: Good cortico medullary differentiation.
GENITO URINARY SYSTEM: Kidneys weigh 300 grams. Very pale; calyces, pelves, ureters and bladder negative. Bladder contains 360 c.c. of clear urine.

CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM: Reflecting the scalp and removing the calvarium reveals nothing noteworthy. Brain weighs 1250 grams. Leptomeninges slightly cloudy over convexities. Arteries at the base of the brain thinned. Sectioning reveals nothing further.


