
RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

TOWN OF KREMMLING
REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING
November 1, 2017

The Board of Trustees, for the Town of Kremmling, met in the boardroom located at 200 Eagle Avenue. Mayor Thomas Clark called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Trustees present: Scott Crandall, Gina Schroeder, Jason Wikberg, Guy Bakke, and Grace Bohall. Staff present: Town Manager Mark Campbell, Public Works Director Jason Bock, Police Chief Scott Spade and Town Clerk Rhonda Shearer.

CRANDALL MOVED TO APPROVE THE REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING MINUTES OF OCTOBER 18, 2017. WIKBERG SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

SCHROEDER MOVED TO APPROVE THE EXPENDITURES FROM OCTOBER 19, 2017 THROUGH NOVEMBER 1, 2017 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$90,585.38. BOHALL SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

WIKBERG MOVED TO APPROVE THE AGENDA AS PRESENTED. CRANDALL SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

There were no citizen comments.

The Board of Trustees adjourned at 6:33 pm, and reconvened as the Liquor Authority for the Town of Kremmling.

The board and Police Chief Spade discussed the renewal for the Kum and Go. They have had two violations in the past two years, which the state has penalized them for. There have also been a few management changes recently, and Chief Spade is trying to verify that all employees are TIPS certified, but he saw no reason to deny the renewal application.

BAKKE MOVED TO APPROVE THE LIQUOR LICENSE RENEWAL FOR THE KUM AND GO. SCHROEDER SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

The Liquor Authority adjourned at 6:37 pm, and reconvened as the Board of Trustees.

Manager Campbell stated that he has spoken with Ben McClelland and he is interested in filling the municipal court judge seat that will be vacated by current Judge Noriyuki after December 31.

BAKKE MOVED TO GO THROUGH THE APPROPRIATE STEPS TO HAVE BEN MCCLELLAND BECOME OUR JUDGE. SCHROEDER SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

The Mayor reported:

- He attended a Northwest Colorado Council of Governments (NWCCOG) meeting by telephone, he and Manager Campbell attended a Mayor, Manager, Commissioner meeting, and they also have purchased new holiday lights.

The Police Chief reported:

- Halloween went well, there were no major issues.
- Officer Jones' last day will be November 11.

The Public Works Director reported:

- The pumps at the Colorado River pump station have been replaced.
- The divers will be back at the town reservoir on November 20 to patch the leak.
- They are getting all of their equipment ready for the winter season.

The Manager Reported:

- He had the windshield on the Durango replaced.
