It's Epiphany already. We celebrate three important things on Epiphany: 1) The arrival of the Three Wise Men to Bethlehem to see the Christ Child in the Manger. 2) The Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River. 3) The First Miracle of Jesus, turning water into wine at the Wedding Banquet in Cana. We believe all three of these things happened on this date, in different years of course. The Main emphasis of today is on the arrival of the wise men, and focus on the Baptism of the Lord tomorrow.

Once again, we will have a blessing of chalk at Mass, which you may take home and use to bless your home by inscribing the sacred formula on the lintels of your doorways.

20 + C + M + B + 18

The outside numbers refer to the year of salvation, 2018. The three letters are the first letters of the names of the three wise men: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar.

Epiphany: A Fourfold Feast

Epiphany originally celebrated four different events, in the following order of importance: the <u>Baptism of the Lord</u>; Christ's first miracle, the changing of water into wine at the wedding in Cana; the <u>Nativity of Christ</u>; and the visitation of the <u>Wise Men</u> or Magi.

Each of these is a revelation of God to man: At Christ's Baptism, the Holy Spirit descends and the voice of <u>God the Father</u> is heard, declaring that Jesus is His Son; at the wedding in Cana, the miracle reveals Christ's divinity; at the Nativity, the angels bear witness to Christ, and the shepherds, representing the people of Israel, bow down before Him; and at the visitation of the Magi, Christ's divinity is revealed to the Gentiles—the other nations of the earth.

The End of Christmastide

Eventually, the celebration of the Nativity was separated out, in the West, into <u>Christmas</u>; and shortly thereafter, Western Christians adopted the Eastern feast of the Epiphany, still celebrating the Baptism, the first miracle, and the visit from the Wise Men. Thus, Epiphany came to mark the end of Christmastide—the <u>Twelve Days of Christmas</u> (celebrated in the song), which began with the revelation of Christ to Israel in His Birth and ended with the revelation of Christ to the Gentiles at Epiphany.

Over the centuries, the various celebrations were further separated in the West, and now the <u>Baptism of the Lord</u> is celebrated on the Sunday after January 6, and the wedding at Cana is commemorated on the Sunday after the Baptism of the Lord.

How to Bless Your Home on Epiphany

After Mass, you should have received a piece of blessed chalk. You can take this chalk home and use it to make the following inscription over your door: 20 + C + M + B + 18. This inscription incorporates the current year of salvation (Two Thousand and Eighteen years since the birth of Christ) in addition to the first letters of the names of the three wise men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. The inscription is also understood to stand for the Latin phrase: *Christus mansionem benedicat.* Translated, this means, "May Christ bless this house." This ancient tradition is a way of claiming your home for Christ, and sanctifying your front door, so that no evil people or demons will enter your home. It is a great prayer to make with your whole family, accompanied by the reading of the First Chapter of St. John's Gospel, the Our Father and the singing of *We Three Kings*!
