From the Pastor's Perspective:

I struggle with the task of introducing myself, never wanting to limit who I am with what I do. First of all, I believe that I am a beloved child of God, created in the image of God and invited to participate as a cocreator with God—but I believe that to be true of all of us and saying so at the beginning of conversation tends to end it before it begins! So, while I was serving as an intern during seminary, I responded to the question of "What do you do?" by saying that "I am a bard." I like that term for what I do, a description taken from the Gaelic and British culture (my heritage), a shorthand way of saying that I am a professional story teller, singer, keeper and creator of traditions.

I never want to limit my introduction by saying "I am a Pastor," because that introduction does some strange things to conversations. When I am on an airplane, for example, and use that answer to respond to a seat-mate's inquiry, I will hear the story of their broken family system...an upcoming surgery...or why they used to go to church but don't anymore. If I am seated at the bar in an Applebee's restaurant, the conversation around me usually stops for a moment and I can watch people review their language and topics of conversation while in my presence; the tone and tenor change and people speak far more carefully around me. The term "Bard", on the other hand, opens up the conversation and I can share a great deal more about the kind of stories I tell and why I think that this is an important job.

So I tell stories for a living. I often tell my stories in churches on Sunday morning, but you can find me telling stories in other places as well. I do so as a follower of Jesus the Christ and I love to tell his stories, as well as other stories that have been shaped by Jesus' teachings. But I also tell stories in writing, in poetry, in art, and as many different ways as I can so that the word of God can reach out and touch the lives of people who find themselves in church—and those who cannot bring themselves to enter our doors.

I also believe in the power of listening to other's stories about their lives and the ways in which God has been active in them. In today's language, we often call that practice "Spiritual Direction;" in the Celtic tradition that is my heritage, we call such a companion an "Anam Cara" or "Soul Friend." I have training in this practice and tradition as well and am excited about listening to your stories and coming to know you and this community. In learning to tell and hear our stories, I believe that we come closer to understanding the many ways in which God is working in our world.

I am looking forward to meeting all of you soon...of hearing your stories...sharing the stories of Jesus... sharing my own stories...and together shaping the Kin\_dom of God in our very midst! When I get to town, we will be creating opportunities where we can do this sharing at the very beginning, and then with God's blessing, we will be able to create new stories together for a number of years!
