These are the **UNOFFICIAL MINUTES SUBJECT TO CHANGE**, 2-6-102,104 MCA of the regular October 19, 2015 Scobey School Board meeting. With trustees Chairman Lane Drury, Bill Rask, Jesse Cole and Val Landeraaen in attendance, the trustees:

- Chairman Lane Drury called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Roll was taken and it was established that a quorum was present.
- Patrons and visitors were recognized.
- On motion by Val Landeraaen, seconded by Bill Rask, the minutes from the regular meeting on September 21, 2015, were approved unanimously as presented.
- The superintendent and principal's reports were discussed and are attached and made a part of these minutes by reference.
- On motion by Bill Rask, and seconded by Jesse Cole, the August 8, 2015 – October 11, 2015 claims in the amount of \$436,333.83 were approved unanimously as presented.
- On motion by Val Landeraaen and seconded by Bill Rask, the Activities Report for September 1, 2015 through October 13, 2015 was approved unanimously as presented.
- Val Landeraaen moved to approve the second reading of the Education for Homeless Children – Policy 3125. Bill Rask seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Jesse Cole moved to hire the following coaches:
