
- How many weeks does Shavuot come after Pesach?

A Message from President Lindsey Turner



Thank you Uncle Max

Dear Friends,

Last Saturday morning I had the honor of carrying a rescued Torah from the Ark to be read. It was part of our wonderful weekend with author Anita Diamant.

At this service Shir Chadash shared with Vassar Temple and Temple Beth-El, I wore the tallit that my dear Uncle Max had given me many years ago. This Torah, like the one we cherish at Shir Chadash, was rescued from Europe, saved from destruction by a terrible evil.

Standing on the bimah, holding this beautiful Torah, I realized that this Torah and my Uncle Max's tallit had crossed paths in a very special way.

Before these sacred texts came to America, they had to be liberated. And so for them to be rescued, Uncle Max's tallit <u>had</u> to go to England in the duffle bag of a G.I. from New York, land in France, somewhere near Calais around Christmas 1944, and suffer through the terrible cold of that year with only summer uniforms. It had to go into Belgium, where my Yiddish speaking Uncle Max became his unit's interpreter, interrogating prisoners, getting directions and information from local people, then finally into the heart of Germany. And then it came home to America and Uncle Max honored me with this tallit that I will continue to wear.

We know how many Jews served, and we know how many Jews died, but this one story is the reason I was so proud to carry that Torah last Saturday!

*Answers to the Rabbi's [extraordinarily challenging] Pop Quiz

49 days – that is seven weeks in my book.

This is a little tricky. The Torah itself does not talk about the giving of the Torah. It does talk [a lot] about the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai. But later Jewish tradition talks about Shavuot as celebrating the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai. So I guess you get credit for either answer. And double points if you mentioned both.

The period between Pesach and Shavuot is called S'firat Ha'Omer/ the Counting of the Omer. Omer is the term for the sheaves of grain that were harvested during this period. In the Jewish mystical tradition each day of the 49 days has a special association. Since Hebrew uses letters to designate numbers, the 33rd day of the omer is called Lag [lamed is 30 and gimel is 3] B'Omer. It is set aside as a time of special celebration. Various reasons are given for this celebration: maybe it is the anniversary of the death of Rabbi Shimon bar Yochai; maybe it commemorates a terrible plague that broke out among the students of Rabbi Akiva and ended abruptly on this day. In any event the rest of the period of S'fira is a period of semi-mourning – why? Who knows [no that is not a question it is a rhetorical assertion.] Lag B'Omer represents a break in that mourning. People can do fun things, like go on picnics.

Probably because it begins with the words "Moses received the Torah at Sinai"—which anticipates the central idea of Shavuot. Also because it is a short book and we can read one chapter each week as we move from Pesach to Shavuot.

Who knows. [Again, not a question. Another rhetorical assertion]. I personally credit the ancient dairy farmers' lobby.


