

KNOW YOUR FAITH

Mixed Marriage By Fr. Stephen R. Sohe



Marriage or the sacrament of Matrimony is one of the seven sacraments. It is a covenant entered into by two baptized Christians for the whole of their life, and ordered towards the good of the man and his wife, and the procreation and education of offspring.

Observe that marriage is a covenantal union between two baptized Christians and not simply two baptized Catholics. Even if one of or both parties in marriage are no-Catholics, their covenantal union is still recognized by the Catholic

Church as marriage. This thus creates the room for mixed marriage in the Catholic Church, but not without particular caution.

Mixed marriage, in its strict canonical sense, is a marriage "entered into by a Catholic with a person who is a baptized member of a Christian church or ecclesial community that lacks full communion with the Catholic Church". Simply put, a Catholic can marry someone who is not a Catholic, but baptized member of another Christian church. However, such marriage needs permission from the local ordinary, that is, the Bishop of the area where the Catholic partner resides, or his/her original place of domicile before such marriage can take place. The reason for the permission arises from the concerns of the Catholic Church surrounding mixed marriage.

The Catholic Church holds that the Christian family is the living cell of the Church. Of cause, for this living cell to be healthy there is the need for unity of faith. Thus, one of the concerns of the Church surrounding mixed marriage is that it threatens the unity of faith of the Christian family by introducing into the living cell of the Church the tragic doctrinal differences that exist between the Christian churches. There is also the concern that the Catholic party might abandon his/her Catholic faith for that of his/her spouse. Or he/she may even abandon his/her Christian religious practices altogether. These same concerns apply to the children from such union. With these concerns in perspective, the Catholic Church thus require a permission from the local bishop for a mixed marriage. For this permission to be granted, the Catholic party must fulfil the following three conditions. First, he/she must declare that he/she will not abandon his/her catholic faith, and that he/she will bring up their child/children in the Catholic faith. Second, the other non-Catholic party must be timely informed of this declaration. Third, the two parties must be "instructed about the purpose and properties of marriage which neither of the contracting parties is to exclude" (cf. Canon 1125 #1, 2, and 3).
