They have been through a very rough time. They thought Jesus was dead and rejoice because he was alive. We probably do not feel the full intensity of feelings that they did, but we can feel the immensity of what it meant to them, and what it means to us that Jesus rose from the dead.

We would not be Christians, if Jesus had not been crucified and risen from the dead. Read that sentence again. We would not be Christians, had Jesus not died, and risen from the dead. Sit with that thought. Ponder what it would be like, had that not happened.

Our whole spiritual belief would be different. Not only would we not be Christians, we wouldn't be together at Community Presbyterian Church, as we know it.

I have begun my studies for a Doctor of Ministry through the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary. The first assignment was to read the book, *The Crucifixion of Ministry* by Andrew Purves; and write a book review. The timing of Easter and the resurrection of Jesus Christ have been a good match for Purves' book.

Purves asks us to think about our ministry, your ministry and mine. We are all Christians, because Jesus died and was resurrected. We believe, and we are intentional about sharing the Good News with others.

As humans, we tend to think of the church we are associated with as "ours." Have you ever said, CPC is "my" church? I admit that I have thought about being "your" pastor, and considering you "my" people, and all of you as part of "my" ministry. Purves says to think again. This isn't "my" ministry and it isn't "your" church. Community Presbyterian Church is Jesus' ministry. If it wasn't for Jesus, we would not have a ministry at

all. Christian ministry belongs to Jesus, not us.

Karl Barth, a 20th century theologian, wrote that "It is not Jesus Christ who needs our ministries, it is our ministries that need Jesus Christ." In the Gospel of John 15:5 Jesus says, "Apart from me you can do nothing."

How might we think differently and do things differently if we consciously remember that CPC is Jesus' ministry, not ours? Certainly, our role is to be involved with Jesus' ministry, but the ministry does not belong to us. We have been called to be children of God. We have been called to be disciples of Jesus, here at Community Presbyterian Church.

We'll talk more about what it means to be part of Jesus' ministry. For now, take some time to ponder what that means for us that "our ministry needs Jesus Christ," and what it would be like to be involved with Jesus' ministry, not ours.

May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you.




