## 2018 Post Officer Elections

Any Legionnaire in good standing is eligible to hold any office. We will vote for Legionnaires to serve as officers for the Post for the 2018 – 2019 cycle during the April 11th General meeting, with installation in May. All members in good standing are eligible to hold office. Below is a brief description of the responsibilities of each office:

**Post Commander:** Is ultimately responsible to the membership for the Post.

**First Vice Commander:** Assumes duties of Commander when needed. Chairman, Membership committee, Coordinates Sportsman raffles.

**Second Vice Commander:** Assume duties as Commander or First Vice as needed. Chairman, Americanism and Finance committees.

**Third Vice Commander:** Assume duties of the Commander, First Vice, or Second Vice as needed. Chairman, Publicity and Sick & Visiting Committees.

**Post Adjutant:** Maintains complete records of proceedings of all meetings. Responsible for all Post correspondence. Collects membership dues.

**Treasurer:** In charge of safety & security of all Post finances.

**Post Chaplain:** Charged with the Spiritual welfare of the Post.

**Sergeant-at-Arms:** Maintain good order & discipline as needed.
