July 29, 2018 Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time John 6:1-15

Dear St. Pius X and St. Anthony Church Family,

Peace! Last week Jesus invited his disciples to a private retreat with Him to receive some needed rest following their wearying missionary work. This week Jesus offers this rest and refreshment to all of us. In the reading, after a day of teaching and healing, Jesus miraculously feeds the great crowd! What a retreat! Sign me up! Oh, wait, every mass is such a retreat. At Mass, we come to Jesus, opening our hearts to share with Him our burdens in prayer. Then we listen to His teaching word and are fed by His Body & Blood in Holy Communion. Everything that today's reading(John 6) says that Jesus gives us, we can find in the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. In Mass, we find 1) spiritual community, 2) the edifying word, 3) the comfort of shared prayer and 4)life-giving food for our bodies and souls. All of this for the purpose of continuing the mission of sharing Christ with others. Because what is deep within all of these parts? Jesus Himself. His real presence alone refreshes, meets all our needs and satisfies all our longings.

Over the next four Sundays, every gospel reading will come from this same chapter 6 of John's gospel, as an extended teaching about Jesus' presence in the Holy Eucharist. Each week we will focus on another aspect of how God reveals Himself to us and provides for us through this unique sacrament.

But what about today's message? From 5 loaves and 2 fish, Jesus provides food for over 5,000 people, and leftovers to fill 12 baskets! Just as He said last week 'come away with me and rest', this week He says to us, "Any insurmountable problem you face-*like how to feed so many with so little-* bring it to me and we will work it out!" Never underestimate what God can do with our problems, if we trust His Will, take them to Him and offer their solution to His glory!

I love how today's gospel contrasts 'big' with 'little' things! For example, in the background to this story we hear about the big body of water they crossed (Sea of Tiberius-Jn 6:1), the big hill they climbed ('mountain'-Jn 6:3), the 'big' holyday that was approaching (Passover-Jn 6:4) and the 'big' crowds that Jesus was drawing (Jn 6:2,5). But we know that Jesus reverses our expectations about what is greatest and what is least, Himself always lifting up the 'little ones'! In Luke 9:48, He says, "For the one who is least among all of you is the one who is the greatest." So, how does Jesus use 'little' things to overcome 'big' things? Notice the 'little' details: 1) the little offering of simply five loaves and two fish-2) this offering given by the 'little boy' 3) the boy being found by Peter's 'little brother' Andrew (Jn 6:8-9), and best of all don't overlook the 'little' detail included at the end of the story that 4) Jesus wants no one left out or 'thrown away' so He gathers up all the 'little' pieces left, nothing wasted (Jn 6:12). So, it is true, Life is about the 'little things' (Jesus is the Way, truth and Life!- John 14:6)
