GREETINGS FROM MS. MELODY SEARS, PRINCIPAL AT NORTHWEST SCHOOL OF THE ARTS

Hello, Northwest Community. I just got back to my office from visiting Los Angeles, today. The Magnet Schools of America Convention was held there, this year. I was very excited to visit Hollywood High and Hamilton High, performing arts magnet high schools. Apparently, the students knew who we were, and asked about some of our students who have gone on to greater performance opportunities. Until I walked into the buildings, the students did not know Northwest was going to be represented at the high schools, so the fact that we were already well-known in Hollywood and LA in general made me smile! I brought back all sorts of neat ideas from the workshops!

It is nearly time for exams, and students received their report cards for third quarter just last month! The year is winding to a close. Remember that if students are failing his or her major, that is one way to have to leave this school, and we do not want that. Also remember that if a student misses more than ten days in high school, the student must make up that time in recovery hour for hour, minute for minute, or he or she will fail the class. Have students talk with their teachers or with Mr. Sennett to schedule make up times for recovery. The times for recovery for April came home with last month's newsletter, and announcements were made on the robo -phone calls. The exam schedule for middle and high school students is being sent home, today, along with the calendars for May and June. Please check the dates, and know that our day does not end with exams, but with the review sessions AFTER the exams. Students should plan to stay for the next day's exam review after finishing up the day's morning exams. Review sessions start at 1:30. Review sessions make a big difference. Please do NOT plan to pick up your student early, and if it can not be helped, be sure to send a signed parent note with your student in the morning to Ms. Andrews' Office, in Attendance.

We also want to let you know that the work on the Fitness Trail behind the school, being built with the funds from the Jimmie Johnson Champions Grant, is nearly finished! We are very excited about that. We were interviewed by a local news crew for the story about the grant. Just as wonderful in the news is that our own Eva Nobelzada is being nominated for a Tony award, right beside Bette Middler! Go, Eva! We'll be tuned in! I hope she wins. It will be the second Tony connected with NWSA!

Northwest school of the arts – End of Year Testing Schedule 2017

The overview of the Northwest School of the Arts Testing Schedule is below. PLEASE read this information BEFORE you scroll down to see the

Basic Information:

- Middle School Testing is highlighted in GREEN
- High School Testing is highlighted in GREY
- Whole School is highlighted in ORANGE

NC Testing Window:

- Testing will run from Wednesday, May 24th until Thursday, June 9th for ALL other EOC's, EOG's, NCFE's
- It is REQUIRED BY STATE LAW that ALL EOG's, EOC's, NC Final Exams, CTE Exams, Local Exams, and Teacher-made final be administered during this window.

NOTE: The testing calendar is subject to change based on requirements from the state and/or CMS

EC and 504 Accommodations:

- Mr. Sennett will have official EC and 504 Accommodations scheduled for the following ONLY: EOG's, EOC's, NC Final Exams, CTE Exams, Local Exams
- Because we require so many staff members for official testing, Accommodations for TEACHER-MADE exams will be the responsibility of the teacher

Staff Members Involved and Planning Periods:

- It will be an "ALL HANDS ON DECK" scenario for exams. ALL staff members will be utilized as well as volunteer proctors
- Teachers will have a 30 minute "Duty Free" lunch each day, but you MAY NOT have a planning period each day. You will be have TWO EXTENDED planning periods as scheduled AFTER the morning exam times

Exam Schedule "Outliers" – These are highlighted in Yellow

Mr. Williams teaches a class of 8th grade students who take both the 8th grade Math EOG as well as the MATH I EOC. This is highlighted in yellow in terms of when it will be administered
