I, Terri C Anderson, attended the AVVA 8th National Convention. I learned that this was the second National Convention in which the AVVA Chapters were given voting rights and privileges. Chapter Representatives and Presidents made it clear by our attendance and participation that we wanted a voice in the national elections and by-law revisions. During registration, I was given an AVVA bag which included a manual with the agenda for each day, convention rules, proposed by-law changes, election information and policies, governing documents and legislative finance.

Beginning Thursday morning, the AVVA Delegates began working on critical decisions concerning our national by-laws. The by-law committee worked diligently comprising and developing the new revision. As a delegate, I attended the by-law panel discussion so that I could better understand the by-law revisions the committee proposed and the reasons for the changes. In addition, the committee provided information concerning the by-law discussion and voting process.

Cecelia Essenmacher presented the detail of the by-law revisions. Each delegate who had discussion or questions about the revision moved to the microphone to be recognized and was given three minutes to speak on the subject. At the end of the discussion and any additional revisions the delegates were asked to vote. By-law revisions were approved by the delegates on Thursday, July 23, 2015.

The AVVA Convention reconvened on Friday, July 24, 2015 and the focus was on the AVVA Candidate's Forum and Election. A candidate forum was held on the Convention floor prior to the election so that any candidate who was running in opposition to another of the same office had an opportunity to address the Delegate body. The candidates were called by office, and then in alphabetical order. Each candidate was given five minutes to present their view and answer andy questions from the floor. Unopposed candidates did not speak unless one or more delegates had questions for them. Our manual included a candidate biography for each person running for office.

The majority of the candidates for national office were re-elected to their position. Three new officers were elected. They were:

• Treasurer—Kathy Andras (Bill Williamson chose to leave the Treasurer position after 16 years of service. He gave a farewell speech.

- Region 1—No candidate.
- Region 5 Director—Cecilia Essenmacher (Penny Meinhart retired)
- Region 7 Director—Percilla Newberry

I attended the AVVA Luncheon where I met many members of the AVVA and the VVA. It was very enjoyable. General Burwell B. Bell, U.S. Army (Retired) was the guest speaker. He is a lifetime member of the New York based Council on Foreign Affairs and VVA Chapter 203.

In addition, the legislative priorities of the 114 Congress were reviewed. Areas of focus for AVVA are:

- Toxic Exposure Act of 2015
- Reinstatement of Caregivers Expansion and Improvement Act of 2013

Other areas or AVVA support include:

- Improving the oversight and accountability of the Veterans Administration
- Extending the relationship with the IOM
- Increasing the visibility of the VA through expanded outreach programs
- The fullest accounting of our POW/MIA's
- Clearing up the VA's benefit backlog
- Hiring to fill positions and programs for PSTD and substance abuse
- Incarcerated Veterans
- Minority Veterans
- Women Veterans
- The Newest Veterans
- The Veterans Health Council

Bill Williamson presented the AVVA financial results for the period ending May 31, 2015.

### VVA Call in Day on the Hill—November 4, 2015

Call 202-224-3121, give the operator your state or zip code, and he/she will connect you with your elected officials' office. Ask to speak to the LA for Veterans Affairs, make it clear that you are calling as a constituent, asking for their support of H.R. 1769 and S.901, the Toxic Exposure Research Act of 2015. Congressman Dan Benishek, (MI-1) has introduced H.R.1769 the Toxic Exposure Research Act of 2015 co-sponsored by Congressman Mike Honda (CA-17th). Senator Jerry Moran, (KS) has introduced S.901 the Toxic Exposure Research Act of 2015 co-sponsored by Senator Richard Blumenthal (CT). If enacted into law, this bipartisan legislation would establish within the Department of Veterans Affairs a national center for the diagnosis and treatment of health conditions of the descendants of veterans exposed to toxic substances during service in the Armed Forces.
