

Senior Health Insurance Program (S.H.I.P.)

If you need assistance with Medicare, Supplemental Insurance, Med D plans, LIS, Medicaid applications, Benefit Access Applications, or Subsidy Recertification, MASS can help. Benefit Access Participant Reminder

All participants who qualify for the Benefit Access program, formerly Circuit Breaker, are able to file their application for the discount on their license plate sticker. A one-time discount of \$75 will be given each year. Call Mendota Area Senior Services at 815-539-7700 to schedule an appointment. MASS will also have an Outreach worker available at the monthly outreach sites in Leland, Earlville, Sandwich, Sheridan and Somonauk to provide assistance with applications.
