

Three Kids Mine

Mine has Varied History

The history of Three Kids Mine is as colorful as its present is controversial.

Three middle-aged Las Vegan's with a gift for understatement named the site, 16 miles southeast of Las Vegas, the Three Kids Mine after they discovered manganese ore there in 1917.

The manganese mined from the Three Kids pits, created by ancient volcanoes and lakes, became a national treasurer after World War I, World War II and the Korean War as a hardening agent in the production of steel for the war planes and weapons.

The original trio= B.R. Jefferson, B. Edwards and J. Marrs-leased the property to the Manganese Association, which began producing ore for the Pennsylvania steel mills in November 1917. The association earned #13.20 to 15.20 net profit per ton for a year. The mine produced about 12,000 tons of ore at that time.

It took 20 hours for a truck owned by Southern Nevada pioneer James Cashman Sr. to deliver a load of manganese from the mine to the rail yards, where downtown Las Vegas is today.

Thomas Thorkildsen of Los Angeles took over the war time lease in April 1918. By 1919 the United States' need for manganese dropped, and the Three Kids operation remained dormant until the next war.

By the time the World War II started, the nation was importing 87 percent of the small amount manganese ore it needed.

To respond to the war needs, the Manganese Ore Co. resumed operation at the mine in 1943.

Processing ore at the sight took millions of gallons of water, diesel fuel and sulfur dioxide. The fine grained sediments from the milling process went into unlined ponds on the surface.

In 1945, a company called Manganese Inc. was formed and led the nation in manganese production at the Three Kids Mine in 1955. After the war, production diminished. When the contract with the Federal Government ran out in 1961, mining activity stopped.

After the mine closed the site changed hands many times until it landed in the ownership of Three Kids Enterprises in 1989, but it hasn't been mined for manganese since.

During its heyday, the mining pits around Three Kids yielded thousands of tons of lead, silver, zinc, and copper as well as manganese.

The original manganese deposits never have been exhausted.

Map Dowsing & Remote Viewing

The obvious link between dowsing and remote viewing has not yet been the subject of experimental inquiry, and perhaps it is now time for this. The two activities seem to complement each other like two sides of the same coin.

Whereas with map dowsing, the object to discover the location of a satisfying gold deposit or something else, remote viewing involves describing what the location looks like. While dowsing usually relies on a question and answer procedure, remote viewing occurs as a series of fleeting mental images, which can be compared with psychometry. It is possible that

a combination of dowsing and remote viewing techniques would be irresistible for most dowsers. I know, because I have used remote viewing all along.

There is another aspect of scientific experiments that suggest a new way of looking at map dowsing. In June 1972, when two scientists started their experiments with a psychic, renowned Swann, the early tests were much the same as those that which dowsers have been subjected to over the centuries; objects were placed in a locked, thick-walled wooden case, and Swann was asked to identify them by remote viewing. He was extremely successful at this in front of many

witnesses. He said: "I see something small, brown, and irregular, sort of like a leaf, or something that resembles it, except that it seems very much alive, like it's even moving." Inside the box, the hidden target was indeed a small live moth, it's coloring and shape much like a leaf.

But one day Swann announced: "I'm tired of these institutional experiments. they're so boring. Why don't we do something exciting? I did some experiments at the American Society for Psychical Research in which I moved my viewpoint to some remote location and described what was there. That was fun to do and statistically significant. I think that I could look anywhere in the world if you just gave me some coordi-

nates, like longitude and latitude. Let's design an experiment around that!"

Although skeptical, as are most people when confronted for the first time when someone says that they can dowse from maps, the two scientists agreed to set up a series of tests, gradually increasing the controls until, they arrived at a super cautious procedure built into the remote viewing experiments. On the way, it turned out that Swann was absolutely correct; usually he had no difficulty giving an immediate and correct response when given no more information than two

coordinates.

Telephoned by a scientist challenging the test, he at once described a small island with technical equipment such as radar on it, and traced the outline of the island: promontories, jetties and a wharf. The coordinates turned out to be an island in the south Indian Ocean, used jointly by France and Russia for meteorological research. And by any standards the similarity between Swann's coast outline and the actual map of the island is astonishing; both the basic shape and the specific details are accurate.

Nor was this an isolated success. On dozens of other occasions, Swann was able to describe precisely the geo-

graphical features of the point crossed by the two coordinates, even when the places chosen were deliberately difficult and unexpected; a lake in the otherwise arid desert, a town in the vast Siberian forest, and so on. Compared with sophisticated controls and statistics on the later remote viewing experiments. Swann's achievements with map coordinates are no more than circumstantial evidence. But they throw fresh light in the validity, the technique, and the scope of map dowsing.

Swann's performance is unaffected by distance, or time. Above all it's fascinating to see how careful modern scientific research is confirming what dowsers have been telling each other for decades: that nearly all of us are capable of perceiving things beyond the grasp of the five senses and that we can improve with practices.

In the words of two scientists, Harold Puthoff and Russell Targ, who tested Swann in many experiments about remote viewing, "We have found remote sensing to be a robust phenomenon in which experienced and inexperienced subjects are able to describe in words and drawings, both the location and activities of experimenters placed and undisclosed sites at varying distances from the subjects."

Mining Executive Says Outlook Is Grim For Gold Price Recovery

ELKO- Gold prices won't be on the rebound any time soon, so World Gold Council Chairman John Wilson is telling miners they have to eke by with the metal's current depressed value.

"We have to do a far better job in anything we're doing, and then we'll come through as generations of miners have done before us." he said at an Elko Mining Expo luncheon.

Wilson, who also is president and chief executive of Placer Dome Inc., told Friday's gathering that the key to gold coming back is the weakening of the U.S. dollar.

"I for one don't see it happening for some time, so I cannot be bullish and say we will come out of this quickly," He said.

Gold prices are at 20-year lows, and Wilson said in terms of inflation, they are significantly lower than they were 20 years ago.

The spot gold price closed Monday on the New York Mercantile Exchange at \$259.80 a troy ounce, off 50 cents from Friday's close.

The price had already fallen roughly \$100 over two years when Great Britain announced on May 7 that it would sell 415 metric tons of gold from its reserves over several years. That announcement produced another \$30 hit on the already low price.

Wilson said two good things came out of the aftermath of the disclosure, however central banks will think twice about doing the same thing in the future, and Federal Reserve Chairman Alan Greenspan issued an assurance that the United States is not selling gold.

Meanwhile, the World Gold Council is continuing its effort to convince central banks their practice of lending gold to bullion banks that in turn lend gold to speculators and mining companies is "putting great pressure on the market," the Elko Daily Press reported on Saturday.

What central banks do is important because they hold roughly 34,000 metric tons of the 130,000 metric tons above ground in the world today. The central bank reserves rep-

resent 14 years of production, Wilson said.


He also said the World Gold Council opposes the proposed International Monetary fund gold sale to aid 41 depressed countries.

Such a sale may hurt the gold prices but do little to help the poor nations, especially those that mine gold, Wilson said.

Looking to the future, Wilson said he believes "a day of fiscal reckoning is coming, and we will need assets like gold."

Placer Dome operates three mines in this state-the Pipeline Mine in Lander County, Bald Mountain Mine in White Pine County and Getchell Mine in Humboldt County.

Who has the Mining Claims?

Based on the information obtained from the BLM, there are, as of July 1, 1998 approximately 138,000 active mining claims in Nevada. The number of active claims constantly varies as new claims are staked and some claims The BLM data are dropped. shows a total of 7.333 claimants however the actual number is a little smaller. This is because the BLM's computers would count, for example, J. Doe and John Doe as two claimants when they are the same.

While most of Nevada's mineral production is the result of the efforts of the large companies, most of the claimants hold relatively small numbers of claims. Over 65% of all claimants (4,776) hold between one and ten claims. An additional 1,022 claimants (14% of all claimants) hold between eleven and twenty claims. Thus nearly 80% of the claimants hold between one and twenty claims. The BLM records show that collectively the nine largest claimants hold over 36,000 claims. In addition to holding claims in their own name, most of the mining companies also lease claims held by others. Thus, the larger companies actually control more claims than they control themselves.

According to the results in the Division's survey of 1997 exploration activity, 18 companies each controlled more than 1,000 claims with nine of those companies each controlling over 5,000 claims.

WHERE'S THE GOLD? TIPS AND TECHNIQUES

In this column each month we will try to give newcomers to our hobby some valuable tips and techniques which may help them get more enjoyment out of recreational prospecting and mining. Who knows, it may even help them find GOLD!



Willie Biron is an active member of the Gold Searcher's of Southern Nevada and a successful metal detector user. Look for his next detecting class at an upcoming outing.

There are many metal detectors out there, but if you want to find that yellow colored metallic type called GOLD you must get a detector that will work on those deep tiny pieces. It seem everyone is making detectors today and its tempting to go for the cheap one. My advice is do not skimp on the basic design. Sure you can pick up a quarter a bottle cap, or a nail with a treasure hunter special, and its really appreciated by those who use good sensitive equipment; because that's less trash we are going to see when we dig a bit deeper for that gold.

You may say well that is all I've got and it is better than nothing! I say have a ball and enjoy the outing because your chances of leaving with gold is slim to none.

If you are really serious about finding gold, you will need a metal detector that has been specifically designed for that. The following list of detectors is where you should start. Designed specifically to help you find gold, some have a better reputation than others. You have to do your homework.

First talk to someone that has one that you think may do the job....ask him to show you the gold found with it! Next you should try to rent or borrow one for a test drive.

There are used detectors for sale. I recently found some while browsing the web. Talk to club members about their likes and dislikes and maybe they are upgrading their detector and the old one is up for grabs. Chances are you can pick up a good detector from someone who hasn't found gold yet and is tired of trying!

Finding gold isn't easy and you have to really be in tune with your equipment to pick it up, as long as its a good unit, it doesn't have to have all the latest bells and whistles. The following list is provided as a starting point to finding gold...
