30th ANNIVERSARY - PEARL

Use the Library and Sew for the Show

Take any book or ruler out of the library and make something. It can be a quilt or table runner, a quilt top, a block, or a practice piece on which you learned a new technique. It can follow directions exactly or just be inspired by them. Bring what you made to show and tell, along with the book, and show the membership what you learned. Each time you share your library-inspired work, you will receive a raffle ticket.

Minis for the Show

Here are the rules for Mini construction:

- 1. Your Mini can be as small as 6"x6" (minimum)or as large as 24"x24" (maximum).
- 2. No cheater cloth.
- 3. Your Mini can be machine or hand quilted; no tied quilts.
- 4. Your Mini should have a label with your name, county, state, date, and Courthouse Quilters on it. That way your lucky winner will know all about their new quilt and who made it.
- 5. Your Mini must be handed in by the September meeting. This will give the committee time to get the raffle all set up. You can turn in your Mini to either Mary Rigby or Joan Lasota at any of the guild meetings.

PATTERN REQUIRED: Dancing Stars & Pinwheels #SNS109 – Jody's Jems
SUPPLIES NEEDED: XX Necessary X Recommended
XX A good working sewing machine XX60mm Rotary Cutter and new blade
XXCutting Mat (24" x 36" is a good size for this project)
XXFabric for quilt (see below) XX 20 blank stickers or 4 blank address labels for l
XXExtension cord or power stripX Tote for carrying supplies & projectX Box or bag for sewing notionsX 1/2" presser foot, if availableX 1/2"
X
XX 6" x 24" ruler XX 9 ½" square ruler
X Stiletto or The Purple Thang X 12" Rotating Mat, if you have one. NOTE: The cutting mat MUST stay flat and out of the sun. Be careful because it will warp and be unusable.
Basic Sewing Kit should include:
XFabric scissorsXMagnetic pin dish or pincushion
XTape measureXThimble
XXSeveral bobbins filledXSeam ripper (Clover is best)
XMechanical pencil X Pins (1 3/8" sharp .50mm glass head silk pins & flower head pins are my favorites)
XFirs (1.3/6 sharp .50/fir) glass flead slik pins & flower flead pins are my favorites)X Tan, gray, or matching good quality, name brand, 100% cotton thread
XHand sewing (betweens or sharps) and Sewing machine (sz 80/12) needles
I highly recommend getting <u>Better Homes and Gardens Complete Guide to Quilting.</u> It is the best refer book I've seen. ISBN: 978-0-696-21856-9.
FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:
9 or 12 different fat quarters that complement each other but have contrast. The contrast will help
the stars & pinwheels pop. SUBCUT all the fat quarters into 4 squares all the same size , 8 ½", 8 ¾" or
squares. All the squares must be the same size. It helps to measure all your fat quarters first, take the
smallest one and cut it into four equal squares (8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " or 8 $\frac{3}{4}$ " or 9") and cut the rest to that size. Bring yo
36 or 48 precut squares and your leftover fabrics.
This is strictly a techniques class, you will be able to go home and make as many blocks as you like, so fee
free to bring more squares for a bigger quilt. Scrappy does not work with this quilt, so stay away from
layer cakes and random scrappy squares. You can also use yardage and cut 4 – 10" squares from each of
your fabrics.
Students must be comfortable with retery outling and their cowing machine to enjoy this also
Students must be comfortable with rotary cutting and their sewing machine to enjoy this class I encourage you to bring a friend and have a fun day. Bring snacks and bottled drink if you
need it.
