 b. Levites = descendants of Jacob's son Levi. Lived throughout Israel & were sent into various towns to serve as local ministers & teachers of the
law. During & after exile, become head of synagogue system.

want to ask Artaxerxes for military escort.

1. Ezra did not take care of everything by himself, he didn't do it all. Rather
he entrusts trustworthy men with important task.
D. He takes into consideration the of his people. V. 31- 32 1. You will note he takes his time. He did not push the people.

E. He practices in accountability. V. 33-34
1. When it comes time to make sure that all treasure has arrived, Ezra did
not check it out in secret. Transfer takes place in open & in public.
F. He worships the Lord with an eye to the body of
Christ. V. 35-36
Fulfils his civic responsibilities by passing on king's command to satraps
over provincial areas around Jerusalem.
2. He leads the exiles in joyful, thankful worship by sacrificing large number
of animals—197 in all. v. 351 bull for each tribe & 8 rams for each
tribe. Its as if Ezra & they are saying they expect more people to come
back & be added to God's people.
A trustworthy spiritual leader cares about the people he currently leads but always has an eye out & is aware of those yet to come to Christ.
Christ's body is an ever-expanding one, not a one.
