# FROM THE PASTOR

According to Forbes Magazine, this is number 13 in our countdown of 40 things you should say to yourself (and maybe others) before you die: "This is my favorite thing."

How ironic that "This is my favorite thing" should come up during the first two months of my three month sabbatical.



I was always amazed (and I just saw it this week again) when in the "Sound of Music" Maria can rattle off in song a list of her favorite things. I am not sure I could do the same, much less with such ease.

So then, why is it that we have to really think

for quite a bit before we can rattle off all of our favorite things. My guess is that for some, as it is for me at times, we have gotten just too busy to do some of our favorite things, thus they move to the back of our mind and are almost out of range.

Just this week, I took a peek at a book I am going to be exploring during sabbatical. It is called How To Be An Explorer Of The World: Portable Art/Life Museum, and in it, the author Keri Smith discusses ideas and makes assignments. I opened the book, to remind myself what will be the first "assignment" during sabbatical and found "Exploration #1: Right Where You Are Sitting," where you are asked to "Write ten things about where you are sitting right now that you hadn't noticed when you sat down. Use your senses. Do it quickly. Do not censor. Okay, begin." I was astounded how many things I had not noticed though I had been seated in the room for over an hour. I had to sit a few more hours at the desk, so I took a break near the end of the day to do the assignment again, only to discover some of my favorite things were found right there – Luna my four legged-companion under the desk, the beautiful markings on my desk made from the blight of the American Chestnut, my dining room Shaker harvest table that was the first piece of furniture I purchased as I went to serve my first congregation in Clarks Summit, Pennsylvania... And the list went on and on.

Sometimes, we don't need to go somewhere else to find our favorite things, because they are right there in front of, around, and within us (in the form of memories). How great it is to know we don't have to wait for our favorite things till we have time to go somewhere. Rather, many of our favorite things are with us now, if we would both take the time to notice. They are shimmering, savor them, summon them to us or let them summon us, and then be still, so as to cherish this moment and receive from it fully what it has to offer us.

In the months of sabbatical, I will be sure to enjoy some of my favorite things. My prayer is that you will have the opportunity to do so the same in the months ahead.

# <u>Directional Process for St. James United Church of Christ</u> (April 2019 – March 2020)

There have been some rumors that the church might be closing. Please put your worries to rest, for we have way too much to do for us to be thinking about closing up shop. We will be finishing our three-year strategic plan by April 2020. In preparation for the end of that strategic plan, we will be undertaking a twelve-month process, which will involve the whole church and produce a three-five year direction for St. James UCC. The process we will follow will look like this:

# Research, Interviews, and Fact Finding on the Three Questions (April –August)

- 1. Who are we: St. James UCC?
- 2. Who is our neighbor?
- 3. Who is God calling us to become?

# <u>Presentation on Answers to the Three Questions</u> (mid September) Congregational Meeting/Gathering Potluck

Consistory will share all the information gathered on questions one and two. After the presentation everyone will write on a card three

things that are either missing or brought them joy or excitement in the presentation.

<u>Period of Discernment</u> (mid September – mid October: four weeks) We will pray everyday about the three things we wrote on our card asking God for discernment, and then take time to listen to God.

**Determining Themes and Skills Needed** (mid October)

End of Discernment Worship Celebration and Congregational Potluck Celebrate in worship the end of the four week discernment period. Then, the congregation will meet immediately following worship to share our dreams and what we learned from this time of prayer and discernment.

**Defining Themes and Future Calling** (early November)

Consistory meets to review themes from the second Congregational Potluck regarding where the church is going in the next 3-5 years, how to get there, and how it will impact the budget.

**Determine Staffing Needs** (January - March 2020)

The **PAWS reading program** continues in January and February on the following dates:



# FOOD PANTRY

Our 2018 Food Pantry served 265 times, providing families with a nice full bag of staples, plus fruit and veggies, bread and bagels, pastries, toiletries, extra food, plus occasional Giant Food Store gift cards, and during the month of November, a Giant \$25 gift card for every family who came (30). We have been keeping

records since 2014, which means our present location food pantry is now 5 years old. A lot of people make this happen – our volunteer pantry personnel, our community donors, including the Haverford Township Library and the Community Y, but most of all the people in the St. James pews, who generously support the food pantry throughout the months. God bless you all.

The food pantry is always in need of staple items like tuna, peanut butter and jelly, breakfast items like cereal, pancake mix and syrup, oatmeal, pasta sauce. We collect the first Sunday of each month during worship – or anytime that is convenient for you.

If the pastor is away, the President will make the decision regarding cancellation.
