A Note from Rick: Markets were mixed with slight gains and slight losses this week at TLA, Slaughter cows and steers were both slightly higher. Calves and dairy cattle were slightly lower. Feeder cattle and dairy feeders were unchanged with really no test of the market. The springer sale on Thursday was a bit disappointing to several consignors. The market was \$25-\$50 dollars lower on the top end but we didn't have nearly as many top end heifers as we've had in the past. We had a lot of cattle that were smaller and/or off in the udder. These cattle did not sell very good and that resulted in overall sale numbers being down quite a bit from last month. This will continue to be a problem in the heifer business, in my opinion. If you don't have the #1 heifers to sell it's not going to be good. There's just no market for the lesser heifers. I do think the market for the #1 heifers is steady and will get even stronger with time. Milk prices continue to climb, butcher prices are stable, and dairy cattle on the open market are fewer.
