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
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
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

The land of Resurrection –Happy Easter!

The Easter celebration comes alive for folks who have visited the Holy Land. There is no substitute for having walked down the Mount of Olives when celebrating Palm Sunday. Never again will you be able to hear about the crowds waving their branches without seeing in your mind's eye the Temple Mount and the walls of the Old City. Or for that matter, Maundy Thursday will forever be linked to those old, gnarled olive trees in the Garden of Gethsemane, and the rock in the chancel of the Church of All Nations. When you go to worship on Good Friday, you'll remember being in the home of Caiaphas and walking the Way of the Cross in the Old City of Jerusalem.

And then there is Easter. Having been to the church of the Holy Sepulcher—the place of the Resurrection—and visualized what it might have looked like by your experience of the Garden Tomb is certainly helpful; but it has been surprisingly less important to my faith than the other sites you can visit. Thoughts from a repeat pilgrim...

I have made two trips to the Holy Land, both with Alpha 2 Omega Travel. The first was in July 2013, where we visited significant historical and biblical sites in and around Jerusalem and the Galilee. I recently returned from a second trip that was quite a lot longer. We revisited many of the same sites, but also went to ancient Samaria and to Jordan, where I checked an item off my bucket list by spending a day at Petra. Wow!

I had a different perspective this second time. The Bible stories were the same, of course, and the political realities of the Middle East continue to confound the mind, but I had a greater curiosity about Palestine (the occupied West Bank area) and the complexities of the layers that impact the daily lives of Christians, Jews, and Muslims. Also, the February weather lent an interesting angle to our experience. The crowds were small and there were a couple of blustery days. This helped me to remember that life was difficult in biblical times. In sunny, warm July it is easy to overlook this; in February, I could fully appreciate that they did not have waterproof clothing, sturdy shoes, or central heating back then. Nor did they have fabulous buffets waiting for you at the hotel every evening.

I thoroughly enjoyed both trips and would encourage anyone wanting to travel to the Holy Land to use Alpha 2 Omega Travel. Linda Miller handles the logistics extremely well and hires very knowledgeable and personable local guides. Is it safe? Yes, it is. Also, Linda works with the pastor leading the trip to customize the itinerary to provide added interest.
