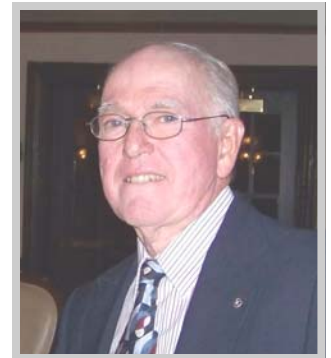

VIPER PLANT SHUTS FOR 15 WEEKS

Has the success of the new C7 Corvette killed the SRT Viper? A source in the supplier industry tells Autoline Daily that the Viper assembly plant will be shut down for 15 weeks. Chrysler says it will be shut for 11 weeks starting the week of April 14. The plant was originally going to shut for 8 weeks, but the shutdown was then extended as Viper sales have gone from bad to worse.

The Conner Avenue plant in Detroit which makes the Viper was tooled to build 2,000 Vipers a year, but last year sales came to only 591 units, as reported by Ward's. Last month only 44 Vipers were sold and inventory now stands at 412 day's worth of unsold cars. Maybe the success of the new Corvette has something to do with it. Last month Chevrolet sold 2,438 Corvettes, up 148% from a year ago. The Corvette only has 34 days' inventory.

THE CORVETTE ALLOCATION SYSTEM *by Joe Golt*

As you may know, we did a museum delivery on our C7 on February 24. We ordered the car on September 20th. It was a long road and I learned a great deal about the Corvette allocation system. Kerbeck was very straightforward with me and I spent many hours searching the forums to learn what I did. Keep in mind that this system is generally secretive, so I can't be sure everything is exactly true. So, here goes.

There are 5 large dealers: Kerbeck(NJ), Criswell(MD), Malkulkin(NH), Les Stanford (MI), Coughlin(OH). Many small dealers are uninformed as to how the allocations system works. They may think they can get you a car when they can't.

Every year each Corvette dealer is informed of their yearly allocation. For Kerbeck it was 1270 Corvettes! The other 4 got less, but well into the hundreds. The average small dealer gets about 10. Even though a dealer may have unused allocations he cannot order a car whenever he wants. On every other Thursday GM informs the dealer how many C7's he may order. This will include how many Z51's, coupes and convertibles he may order. The dealer has until the following Tuesday to place the order or he loses the allocation. Of course, if you are a small dealer you may not get anything for weeks.

When we ordered in September there were about 80 orders in front of ours. So, we had to wait until December 18th before our order was accepted by the factory to build. Our car was built on February 3rd. Each car is then put on a holding lot for 2 weeks. Then it was ready for delivery.

At the present time there is virtually no waiting at Kerbeck. If you give him a deposit you will get in the next cycle.

One question always pops up. Why does GM have such a system? The large dealers have an arrangement with GM. When the demand is low i.e. 2012, 2013, these dealers agree to buy every Corvette that Bowling Green makes. They will be heavily discounted and the dealer makes little profit. In return, when the demand is high, the big dealers get the lion's share of Corvettes.

Hope this helps if you are thinking of ordering a new C7. Don't hesitate to contact me if you have a question.

CORVETTE RACING Disappointing end at Sebring

Corvette Racing's two Chevrolet Corvette C7.Rs each led in class at Sebring International Raceway on Saturday but ultimately ended the 62nd Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring Fueled by Fresh from Florida on disappointing notes.

The No. 4 Corvette C7.R of Oliver Gavin, Tommy Milner and Robin Liddell finished sixth in GT Le Mans for the second round of the TUDOR United SportsCar Championship. The car led in class for significant portions throughout the race before two late spins and an engine issue with 30 minutes remaining put a halt to the car's charge.
