#### LANDSCAPE NOTES

Hello Chantarelle friends! Here's the latest from your Landscape Committee.

**Delighting in Beautification** The two of us are having a wonderful time planning and selecting plants to enhance the beauty of the Chantarelle entrance at Arnold Drive, and also for a few home fronts that have been badly in need of a change. The Waldron crew has done a fine job of installing our new plants, particularly Rafael. You may have noticed these new plants at our Chantarelle entrance. At this point they are still rather small. But as the growing season progresses, we hope these friends from the plant-kingdom will delight you as you pass by, with all the various colors and shapes of foliage and flowers emerging as they grow. As always, we base our choices on drought-tolerant, low-maintenance plants that provide habitat for neighborhood birds and insects as well as beauty for our eyes to behold. For those homeowners for whom we have placed new plants in your front areas, we ask that you keep an eye on them. Please let us know if you notice they need any extra attention, especially water. We'd sure appreciate that. Next to come: mulching in some of the barest areas, which will enhance our landscape as well as help to preserve every drop of irrigation.

**Speaking of Water** (or to be more accurate, writing of water) it has come to our attention that some of our residents are perhaps doing a little overwatering in their private

gardens. There have been reports of excess water running down the street in the evenings as a result of irrigation leaks. We want to refresh your memory that the Valley of the Moon Water District will fine residents for over-watering lawns and gardens. Plus we just hate to see that precious resource of water running down the street and into storm drains! So it's a good reminder for all of us to conduct an annual check on our private irrigation systems to see if there are broken sprinkler heads that need to be replaced, or other leakages that could be prevented. Let's enter into this rapidly approaching dry season with well-honed irrigation systems. Also keep in mind that the ideal time for watering our gardens is between sunset and sunrise. This helps the earth and the plants maximize the retention of the water.

#### A Celebration to Share

The two of us are coming up on our one-year anniversary of serving on the Chantarelle Landscape Committee. It is our pleasure and our honor to be in this position as stewards of the plants and trees in our neighborhood, which no doubt bring pleasure and joy to each and every one of us. May the year ahead be one of even more budget-wise and droughtwise enhancement of the splendid landscape we all have inherited from those who launched this community twenty-five years ago.
