**A prayer of Moses the man of God.** *I Lord, you have been our dwelling place throughout all generations. Before the mountains were born or you brought forth the whole world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God. You turn people back to dust, saying, "Return to dust, you mortals." A thousand years in your sight are like a day that has just gone by, or like a watch in the night. Yet you sweep people away in the sleep of death—they are like the new grass of the morning: In the morning it springs up new, but by evening it is dry and withered. We are consumed by your anger and terrified by your indignation. You have set our iniquities before you, our secret sins in the light of your presence. All our days pass away under your wrath; we finish our years with a moan. Our days may come to seventy years, or eighty, if our strength endures; yet the best of them are but trouble and sorrow, for they quickly pass, and we fly away. If only we knew the power of your anger! Your wrath is as great as the fear that is your due. Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom.*

Psalm 90 is called the Prayer of Moses. In the first three verses Moses states that God has always been there for us and will be with us for all generations. He is our dwelling place. Moses goes on to say how short our lives are compared to God's. We are but a day or night in God's time. Time is something most of us hold dear. I am always thinking or worrying about time. Will I ever have enough time to get this done? How do I get prepared for Lent right after Christmas and get all the rest done? Or, it can't

be that time already. Time goes by so fast and the older I get the faster it seems to go. Lately, I have been thinking of things I want to see, do, and experience before my time is up here on earth. Maybe go sky diving, visit Australia, or swim with a humpback whale. Will I have the time? Moses asks God in verse 12 to teach us to number our days that we may gain a heart of wisdom. Maybe Moses is trying to tell us to appreciate each day, slow down, smell the roses, play with the puppies and enjoy life to its fullest. God does not want us to waste our days worrying, hurrying or thinking about what should have been done. Let us take time today to fully appreciate all that God has given us and the wonders that surround us. Enjoy the snow, breath in the crisp air, maybe sing a song in the shower. Take time today and every day to praise God and thank Him for all the wonderful things He has given us. Ask God, what we might do for Him today. Finally, thank Him for always being there for us, even when we have been too busy for him.


There will be no Soup and Sandwich Luncheon this year due to COVID but an alternate Fundraiser will be held to support the Children we sponsor in Global Ministries.



**Thank you** for your most generous, continued, and vital support! We can't do it without you, and we greatly appreciate your willingness to be a helping hand. Your in-kind donations help our children thrive and truly makes a difference in their lives. Let me share a child's story with you.

Jessie resided at Hoffman Homes for Youth (HHY) for almost a year. She was diagnosed with PTSD and had a history of severe physical and sexual abuse. Jessie came to HHY with nowhere to go upon completing her treatment and was initially overcome with frustration towards being "stuck" in a residential treatment program. She struggled to create and maintain healthy relationships, as well as, work towards treatment goals. After being introduced to a family who was sincerely interested in welcoming Jessie into their home, Jessie became more engaged and involved in her treatment. She participated in family sessions and visits with the potential adoptive family. The effort and kindness that this family had given in supporting Jessie throughout her treatment was a key turning point for Jessie. Jessie made significant progress showing exponential growth, not only in her behaviors but by being a role model for peers in her residence. Jessie was able to leave HHY to live with her adoptive family. To witness Jessie create healthy relationships and be united with a loving, supportive family was truly touching. Jessie continues to excel and work towards future goals, while still having the support of her adoptive family each step of the way. *\*Name changed for privacy*

### Terri & Braden Meyers' Story

Good Evening, I wanted to take a moment to tell you all our story.

Our Journey begins with Braden being four and half years old. We were driving down 81 when he became angry over something, I can't recall exactly what. Not knowing how to control his anger, he unbuckled his seat belt and became aggressive towards me while I was driving. Fortunately, I was able to pull over safely, and tried to reason with Braden, which I didn't succeed at. I then had to pray and call 911 for help.

This incident led to Braden's first hospitalization. He was diagnosed with a mood diagnosis at that time. I remember this day like it was yesterday, as it was the first time ever being away from my baby and he would celebrate his 5<sup>th</sup> birthday among strangers.

Braden did well on the medication, participated in behavioral therapy, and attended a special school. Things were looking up for us, until they tried putting Braden in a regular classroom. He couldn't handle all the stimulation and eventually hit the teacher, hurt a child and kicked the principle.

This landed him with his next hospitalization, which was down towards state college. This time he was in the hospital for about a month. The day we picked him up he was on such a cocktail of medications the child didn't know who I was, tried opening the door on the way home, and was hallucinating. I was so beside myself that we took him to a local emergency room for treatment and they flushed his system of all the medications.

A few days had past and Braden wasn't acting like himself. His behavior was odd, for example, he was having bowel movements in his pants. When I asked him if he was ok, he finally opened up and told me revealing that his roommate in the hospital had sexually assaulted him.

I was devastated as I am supposed to protect my child, and I didn't.

The next couple of years Braden did well and we were able to keep him out of the hospital, as I was nervous to send him after our last experience with hospitalization. However, things erupted, again, and he was sent to a hospital 2.5 hours away. He was there for about 5 weeks and returned home and things were stable for a couple of months.

Fast forward to the summer of 2019. Braden is now diagnosed with autism, Bipolar disorder, ADHD and oppositional defiant disorder. He has had back-to-back hospitalizations in September, November, and late December for a suicide attempt. During the hospitalization at Kids peace, his team decided that for him to get proper treatment he needed to be placed in a residential treatment facility.



Braden was accepted into 5 treatment facilities, so as a mom I had my work cut out for me trying to find the best placement for my son's needs and overall safety.

I chose Hoffman Homes for the programs they provided and wonderful statistics they had. As a mom that is highly involved with her child's care, I wouldn't accept placement until I toured a facility. I reached out to Brecia, the VP of Admissions, for a tour and from the first moment we spoke to when we arrived at Hoffman, she treated us with respect and like family.

I chose Hoffman Homes, and our journey with proper treatment began.

Braden was placed there for a year and four months. The staff became Braden's family. They taught him coping skills, how to respect people, to communicate, and to succeed academically.

As soon as Braden was accepted Covid hit, and it changed everything for us. I was once again devastated that I couldn't see my son face to face. But with the amazing team in Barkley House, and with the help of his therapist, we were able to talk daily. As a nurse on the front lines working 3-11pm shift, they always made sure we could talk whenever my schedule allowed. We were also able to zoom once a week.

The staff in the house treated Braden like their own, they prayed with him, hugged him when he needed it, and loved him while I couldn't be there. Braden was a very challenging in the beginning, he wouldn't eat and lost some weight. The dietician and house supervisor, Brian, allowed me to send his favorite food to him. Eventually, with the support of his staff he began eating new foods and today is making much better food choices.

Braden could hardly read when he came to Hoffman Homes, and through the school, Hoffman Academy, and the awesome animal-assisted therapy program, which Braden loved, he is reading almost on his grade level.

I will forever be grateful to Hoffman Homes for being such a positive piece on our journey. They will always hold a special place in my heart, as we continue to fight mental health!

Lastly, as a mom, I want to thank you all for your donations that keep such a wonderful facility open and available for children like my son.
