Welcome to the Willette church of Christ, where you will find the Bible as our only rule for faith and practice. We seek to speak where the Bible speaks and to be silent where the Bible is silent. We want to call Bible things by Bible names and do Bible things in Bible ways.

Our evangelistic efforts include several local and foreign mission works listed on the back of this bulletin. The home congregation is the most important work. Therefore, every month, we spend time door knocking, visiting, and helping our local community. We have a large benevolent building that operates every Tuesday from 8:30-12:30, which offers free clothes and other items to anyone in need. Our primary foreign work is found in Andhra Pradesh, India, where Brother *Jack Honeycutt* serves as our full-time mission coordinator. We are also blessed to have a regular prison ministry with services conducted each Sunday from 1:00-3:00. Brother *Tim McHenry* is our regular preacher. In addition to preaching, he teaches classes, works with youth events and community outreach. Our associate preacher *Mark West*, preaches, teaches classes, ministers in the nursing home, coordinates our visitation teams, and work with our Bible camp and youth in general. In addition, we have a radio program on 102.1 FM that airs each weekday around 12:15. If anyone has special needs our Christian Counselor, Dale Sadler, is ready to help by calling 615-513-3642

We are a Bible centered, mission minded, and family oriented church. Thank you for coming, and please return at every opportunity.

Tidings from Timothy

The enduring influence of mothers is but one example of those things that stick with us throughout our lives. There are many things that go into making a person of character and fortitude – someone who is a good citizen of both his nation and of the kingdom of God. This morning we will be examining some ways in which we have been influenced since we were born in a lesson entitled, “Those things that last.”

Latest statement from the elders: A statement was sent out a few times via email this week. Here are some pertinent parts for this morning:

1. As you enter the building, please pick up the disposable communion supplies available in the foyer. No communion trays will be passed during our services.
2. Collection plates will be available for your contribution at or near the exits as you leave.
3. Weather permitting, our outside doors will be propped open so no contact need be made when entering or exiting.
4. As you enter the auditorium, you will immediately notice that every other pew is taped off. This will help all of us insure the appropriate 6ft for “social distancing.” Please do not remove this tape.
5. Between services we will have teams sanitizing surfaces where the possibility of cross contamination exists. Volunteers are needed for disinfecting surfaces (doors, pews, etc). Cleaning will be needed after the 9:00 service, so please allow ample time between services for best quality of cleaning.
6. Please know that if you would feel better with your own personal protective equipment such as a mask, or gloves, you are welcome to wear and use them during your time here. This is a good idea in these times.

We expect much joy, laughter, and just maybe a quick hug may be found. All we ask is that everyone please be respectful of every person’s “space” and not crowd or force contact on anyone that may have reservations about contact, especially in light of what our country is still in the midst of.
