

Remember your confirmation?

o you remember the day of your confirmation? I certainly do! Pastor Lemke confirmed me and my 30-plus classmates at St. Peter's Lutheran Church, Reedsburg, on a cloudy Sunday — March 19, 1967. That was a big deal for me just as I am sure your confirmation was for you. At that time, I could finally go to Holy Communion as confirmation class was done — big milestones in a young Lutheran child's life.

But what makes Confirmation Day so special? I went back to my old catechism for the answer:

What is confirmation?

Confirmation is the rite by which a baptized person renews his baptismal vow, publicly confesses his faith, and is received into communicant membership by the congregation. (LUTHER'S SMALL CATECHISM, 1943)

Special? The confirmand personally and publicly renews their

vow that was made for them at their baptism — the most important day of one's life.

It is interesting what the pastor tells the confirmands before confirming them, which are the words of Jesus:

"Whoever confesses Me before men, him I will also confess before My Father who is in heaven. But whoever denies Me before men, him I will also deny before My Father who is in heaven." MATTHEW 10:23-33 NKJV

What follows is the confirmands answering what they believe and what they will do, including their affirming the following question:

Do you intend to continue steadfast in this confession and Church and to suffer all, even death, rather than fall away from it? *LUTHERAN SERVICE BOOK*, P. 273

So how are you and I doing years later? Are we doing what Jesus stated — confessing that we are followers of Him and His cross? Are we continuing to be steadfast, committed and unwavering in our daily lives? Most likely we would respond that we try our best, but we know we fall short.

There is Good News. Remember Jesus and Peter on the seashore after Easter? Three times Jesus asked Peter if he loved Him. Three times Peter told Jesus he loved Him. Peter had denied Jesus three times, and now Jesus restored Peter to serve Him and feed His sheep. Jesus told Peter to "follow me!" Peter had his own day of confirmation. Jesus



CHURCH WORK STUDENTS: Apply for financial aid

This annual grant to college students pursuing professional church work is making a difference. The purpose of the student aid fund is to make it possible for young men and women — lacking in financial resources but who have the desire and ability for church work — to train for full-time service.

District financial support is available to college and seminary students who are attending an LCMS university or seminary preparing to become pastor, teacher, deaconess, parish worker, DCE, music director or other full-time church vocation.

A new application must be filed each year. Students simply need to contact the school's financial aid office to get the district financial aid application and return it to their school before May 15.

Help reduce the educational debt of North WI District Professional Church Workers


Delegates to the 2022 **North Wisconsin District Convention** voted to create a \$1 million campaign to reduce the educational debt of district professional church workers.
