

What is the message of the parable of the vineyard (Mt.21:33-43)? Jesus' story about an absentee landlord and his not-so-good tenants would have made sense to his audience. The hills of Galilee were lined with numerous vineyards, and it was quite common for the owners to let out their estates to tenants. Many did it for the sole purpose of collecting rent. Why did this parable cause offense to the scribes and

Pharisees? It contained both a prophetic message and a warning. Isaiah had spoken of the house of Israel as "the vineyard of the Lord" (Isaiah 5:7). Jesus' listeners would have likely understood this parable as referring to God's dealing with a stubborn and rebellious people.

This parable speaks to us today as well. It richly conveys some important truths about God and the way he deals with his people. First, it tells us of God's generosity and trust. The vineyard is well equipped with everything the tenants need. The owner went away and left the vineyard in the hands of the tenants. God, likewise trusts us enough to give us freedom to run life as we choose. This parable also tells us of God's patience and justice. Not once, but many times he forgives the tenants their debts. But while the tenants take advantage of the owner's patience, his judgment and justice prevail in the end. Let us pray today: Lord Jesus Christ, we thank you for all the benefits which you have given us. May we know you more clearly, love you more dearly, follow you more nearly, and live according to your holy will.

Saint of the Week ... Pope Saint John XXIII

The firstborn son of a farming family in a town near Bergamo in northern Italy, Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was always proud of his down-to-earth roots. In Bergamo's diocesan seminary, he joined the Secular Franciscan Order.

After his ordination in 1904, Fr. Roncalli returned to Rome for canon law studies. He soon worked as his bishop's secretary, Church history teacher in the seminary, and as publisher of the diocesan paper. His service as a stretcher-bearer for the Italian army during World War I gave him a firsthand knowledge of war.

In 1925, he became a papal diplomat, serving first in Bulgaria, then in Turkey, and finally in France. During World War II, he became well acquainted with Orthodox Church leaders.



Feast Day: October 11

With the help of Germany's ambassador to Turkey, Archbishop Roncalli helped save an estimated 24,000 Jewish people.

Named a cardinal and appointed patriarch of Venice in 1953, he was finally a residential bishop. At age 78, Cardinal Roncalli was elected pope, taking the name John after his father. Pope John took his work very seriously but not himself. His wit soon became proverbial, and he began meeting with political and religious leaders from around the world. In 1962, he was deeply involved in efforts to resolve the Cuban missile crisis.

"Good Pope John" died on June 3, 1963 at the age of 81. Few people had as great an impact on the 20th century than Pope John XXIII. St. John Paul II beatified him in 2000, and Pope Francis canonized him in 2014.

Teaching Mass Series *Understanding and Celebrating the Eucharist*

Presented by Fr. Gilos Le Vassour



The Eucharist is the heart and soul of our Catholic Faith, yet many of us stopped learning about the Eucharist after we received our First Communion. While appropriate for age 7, our lives have changed and those teachings are no longer sufficient. We are not the same. Our world is not the same. We have known joys and sorrows. As wounded and broken sinners, we are called to God's table with our faith family to grow in love, forgiveness, healing, celebration, and commitment. These Masses will help us learn more about the Eucharist, the Sacrament so many Catholics take for granted rather than <u>as</u> granted.

This four-part series of Teaching Masses will include a 10-minute presentation by Fr. Giles prior to certain parts of the Mass. While these four Masses cannot truly contain all the teachings (which a greater understanding and appreciation of the Eucharist would require), our hope is that it will ignite in you a continuing desire to learn more, especially during this year of Eucharistic Revival. The Teaching Masses will take place at both the Vigil and Sunday Masses.

October 14-15, 2023

Introductory Rites

We as Catholics are gathered into the real presence of the One who calls us together, the Lord Jesus who is with us. Fr. Giles will discuss the Opening Ritual, Penitential Rite, Praise of God and Introductory Prayer. There will be a 10-minute presentation and explanation of these beginning Mass parts.

November 11-12, 2023

The Liturgy of the Word

This Mass will focus on the Liturgy of the Word. Are we willing to listen to the One who wants us to hear, learn, and grow in the real presence of Jesus our teacher? Mass will begin as usual; a 10-minute presentation will be given on The Word at that point in the Mass.

December 9-10, 2023

Liturgy of the Eucharist, Part 1

What will I offer as a sign of my real presence to the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist? A 10-minute presentation on the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist will be given at this point in the Mass.

January 20-21, 2024

Liturgy of the Eucharist, Part 2

What am I (we) asked of and promising to the Lord, whose real presence has been given to each of us in the Eucharist? How do I take this out into the world? How do I live the Eucharist? A 10-minute presentation will be given at the end of Mass followed by the blessing and final hymn.


We are now past the 50% mark!

Thanksgiving Holiday Pies


It's time to start thinking about your Thanksgiving holiday pies...and the Jubilee Fundraising Committee is here to help!
