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FADE IN:

EXT. FLAT ROCK, PENNSYLVANIA — DAY

Here litters the relics of America's Industrial Age.

DRONE PANORAMIC SHOT: We hover over huge mounds of discarded tires. Decades of them. They are everywhere. Nothing but them fills the screen.

O'MALLEY (V.O.)

Every year, three-hundred million tires become waste in the United States.

In the distance, stands the tall chimney stack of an abandoned factory. Printed vertically down its spine reads, U.S. Rubber.

O'MALLEY (V.O.) (CONT'D)

Where should these abandoned tires go?

QUICK-PACED MONTAGE BEGINS.

EXT. U.S. RUBBER FACTORY — SAME

Panes of blue-frosted windows. A few are broken, plays with the sheer conformity of industrial art.

O'MALLEY (V.O.)

I know. Not playgrounds. Not soccer fields.

INT. U.S. RUBBER FACTORY FLOOR — SAME

Steel girders and concrete narrows down a long factory floor long since deserted.

O'MALLEY (V.O.)

In a time of universal deceit.

EXT. U.S. RUBBER FACTORY — SAME

The rusted relic remains, as a whole, draped against a dark clouds.

O'MALLEY (V.O.)

Telling the truth.

EXT. U.S. RUBBER FACTORY DOCKS - SAME

A few tires linger about, as we peer down the railroad tracks.

O'MALLEY (V.O.)  
Is a revolutionary act.

The very tip of U.S. Rubber Stack is in the distance, as Springsteen's My Hometown Instrumental plays.

FADE TO BLACK:

EXT. MOUNT VESUVIUS UNIVERSITY - SOCCER FIELD - NIGHT

SOUND: CLICK. Stadium lights turns night into day.

SUPER: "Firebirds' Soccer Field, Mount Vesuvius University."

A colorful soccer ball bounces on a green synthetic turf. As the ball raises higher, in slow motion, so does hundreds of tiny black rubber pellets. FREEZE.

SUPER: "Inspired by true events."

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - CENTER - SAME

M.V.U.'s women's RED TEAM scrimmages against their WHITE.

SUPER: "2010. The Team."

WHITE moves the ball up the field crisp pass by crisp pass.

Then, the Red MIDFIELDER/KEIRA, 20, nicknamed The Wall, cuts to the soccer ball and intercepts it. FREEZE.

SUPER: "KEIRA. THE WALL."

Keira eyes the CAMERA.

KEIRA  
No one gets by me.

After two touches, she sets up their STRIKER and kicks the ball into open space.

The field of play now turns, as does the momentum.

Races ANNABEL, 21, to the ball. She's the Red team's STRIKER, a lanky warrior in pigtails who is running from her roots as fast as she can.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - OUTSIDE THE BOX - SAME

Annabel moves down the field at a pace of play the other girls do not possess.

WHITE's DEFENSE attempts to slow her down to no avail.

Annabel slices through them, in a zigzag fashion. As she separates herself from them, she stops. Then, she grunts as she swings her left leg hard, through the ball. Boom!  
FREEZE.

SUPER: "ANNABEL. THE STRIKER."

Annabel eyes the CAMERA.

ANNABEL  
I like to score.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE STANDS - SAME

The ball Annabel kicks heads toward the top right corner of the goal.

TESS, 38, older version of Annabel, watches her daughter shoot. The two are seventeen years apart. Tess is a blue-collar girl from a rust bucket town.

TESS  
Wow.

FREEZE.

SUPER: "TESS. THE MOM."

Tess eyes the CAMERA.

TESS (CONT'D)  
I like to watch my daughter succeed.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - WHITE'S GOAL LINE - SAME

O'MALLEY, 21, the team's heart and soul, their star captain, leaps right and punches the soccer ball clear. Bright is her future. FREEZE.

SUPER: "O'MALLEY. THE KEEPER."

O'Malley eyes the CAMERA.

O'MALLEY  
I like to give Annabel headaches.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - OUTSIDE BOX - SAME

Annabel brings both hands up to the side of her head.

ANNABEL

Ugh!

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - SIDELINES - SAME

COACH GORDON, 38, wears head to toe Puma gear. He's a true mentor of the game. He loved soccer before it was cool.

SUPER: "GORDON. THE COACH."

Gordon eyes the CAMERA.

COACH GORDON

Coaches have to watch for what  
they don't want to see and listen  
to what they don't want to hear.

Gordon breaks from CAMERA.

COACH GORDON (CONT'D)

Great save, O'Malley! Let's call  
it a night.

The scrimmage ends and the Firebirds' TEAM moves off the field to...

THE SIDELINES

To fetch their water bottles and gear.

When there, O'Malley grabs her squeeze Gatorade bottle from the ground and sprays water into her mouth.

O'MALLEY

These two-a-days are killing me.

Turf's pellets cover the keeper's sweaty face. She wipes at her face with her forearm. Her cheek smears black.

THE STANDS

Tess comes and climbs down the steps to...

THE FIELD

She wears a fast food employee uniform, straight from back-to-back shifts.

ANNABEL

Mom. What are you doing here?

Tess realizes she's in her work uniform now. She opens her arms up wide.

TESS

Surprise.

ANNABEL

Are you ever going home?

COACH GORDON

All right girls. Give her some space.

Coach cuts in front of them.

COACH GORDON (CONT'D)

Hey, Tess. I like your uniform.

TESS

Hi, Gordon. You would.

TEAM

Gordon? Oooh.

This causes a sheer stream of giggling laughter.

Annabel shares with the girls.

ANNABEL

They went to high school together.

COACH GORDON

Okay. Time to cool down. One lap around the field.

The TEAM starts to run.

The team consists of young women of various ethnicity and differing financial upbringings.

Tess has her own moment of clarity.

TESS

I don't belong here.

COACH GORDON

Why not?

TESS

I saw it in her eyes.

COACH GORDON

What?

TESS

She's embarrassed of me.

COACH GORDON

She's young.

TESS

I'm just a reminder of home. A  
blue-collar girl from a rust  
bucket town.

COACH GORDON

You're more than that, Tess.

TESS

I could've been.

COACH GORDON

It's never too late to want more.

TESS

Always the optimist.

COACH GORDON

I escaped. Why can't you?

The Firebirds' team returns from their lap.

Coach Gordon sees O'Malley at the end of the pack.

COACH GORDON (CONT'D)

O'Malley! Get a move on.

Gordon looks at Tess.

COACH GORDON (CONT'D)

Have any plans for dinner?

Tess looks down at her uniform.

TESS

Nope. Though, I do need a quick  
shower and a change of cloths.

COACH GORDON

It's a date.

Coach eyes his team.

COACH GORDON (CONT'D)

Huddle up, girls!

The Firebird team finishes their run and sits one-by-one near their coach.

Coach remains standing.

O'Malley joins late. She's out of breathe.

COACH GORDON (CONT'D)  
Saturday, we'll be facing our  
division rivals, Great Lakes  
State.

Reactions from the team are boos and hisses.

COACH GORDON (CONT'D)  
I know. I know. I feel the exact  
same way.

KEIRA  
They're a dirty team coach.

COACH GORDON  
Maybe. But what do I always tell  
ya about that?

Team silence.

COACH GORDON (CONT'D)  
Come on.

O'MALLEY  
We can only control ourselves.

COACH GORDON  
True. And what else?

ANNABEL  
(to coach)  
Our actions speak louder than  
words.

COACH GORDON  
That's right. So, don't let them  
push you off the ball. And when  
they try... Jasmine.

The coach eyes them one by one until he lands on JASMINE/JAZ, 19, Afro-American, edgy street fighter with a soul of gold.

JAZ  
You push them back.

COACH GORDON  
I can't hear you.

TEAM  
You push them back!

COACH GORDON  
That's better.

The teammates look at one another and smile.

COACH GORDON (CONT'D)  
Nice practice, ladies.

Everyone stands up and places their right hand on top of one another's in the circle.

COACH GORDON (CONT'D)  
Firebirds on three.

TEAM  
One. Two. Three. Firebirds!

COACH GORDON  
Hit the showers.

Annabel goes over to Tess.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - SIDELINES - SAME

As the players move off the field, Tess attempts to aid her daughter Annabel with her bag.

ANNABEL  
I got it.

TESS  
Of course, you do.

ANNABEL  
Mom, what are you doing here?

TESS  
I wanted to watch.

ANNABEL  
I mean at school?

TESS  
Do I embarrass you that much?

ANNABEL  
Yes.

Tess looks down at the turf.

TESS  
Is this field new?

ANNABEL  
Top programs have turf.

Annabel walks off.

TESS  
What's wrong with grass?

Coach Gordon answers as he joins Tess.

COACH GORDON  
Nothing, except the maintenance.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD — CENTER FIELD — SAME

A White Firebird Head centers the green turf field. Hold.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD — POWER BOX — SAME

Coach flips a switch. The stadium lights die to darkness.

NOTE: THIS IS WHAT THIS MOVIE IS ABOUT. CRUMB-RUBBER. The cancer-causing chemicals from recycled tires linked to synthetic fields just like this one.

MATCH CUT:

EXT. THORNHILL'S HOME — RITZY NEIGHBORHOOD — DAY

Eight-thousand-square-foot custom built home.

SUPER: "Batesville, Georgia."

INT. THORNHILL'S HOME — KID'S BATHROOM — SAME

Enters MARTIN THORNHILL, 40ish, a grateful sort, big heart, big glasses, who takes pride in his family's third generation turf business.

SUPER: "THE UNLIKELY HERO."

His Son JACK, 6, sits in the bubble-filled Jacuzzi tub. He wears a diving mask and snorkel.

Jack looks up and spits out his mouthpiece.

JACK  
Hi, Dad.

Martin looks around the bath. More water is out of the tub than in. He knees by his Son. The logo of his family's business stamps his shirt. It reads: 4-Ever Green with a tagline of: "When Nature Isn't Good Enough."

MARTIN  
Where's Mom?

JACK  
Out of towels.

MARTIN  
Yes, I see that.

Five soaked towels and a fluffy white mat attempt to absorb the soapy bath water now on the bathroom tile.

Jack inserts his mouthpiece again and starts to swim. The remaining water splashes about and out of the tub.

Martin stands as bath water splashes him.

MARTIN (CONT'D)  
Youth.

Appears in the doorway, JILL THORNHILL, 40, the ROCK of the Thornhill household. She holds a stack of fresh towels and wears a big smile.

JILL  
I'm b-a-c-k.

Jill's smile erodes as she sees her husband.

JILL (CONT'D)  
You forget someone? Like our daughter.

Jill gives him a quick peck on the cheek as she brushes by.

MARTIN  
Ellie. Soccer. Oops.

JACK  
I'm done.

Jack jumps out of the tub. He tosses his mask and snorkel back into the tub with a big splash.

JACK (CONT'D)  
Towel.

MARTIN  
I forgot.

Jill uses a towel to wrap him up.

JILL  
Jack.

JACK  
Yeah, Mom.

JILL  
What do we have to say to Daddy?

Jack looks right up at his father.

JACK  
Actions speak...

MARTIN  
Louder than words. Got it. Thank  
you for reminding me, Son.

Jill gives Martin an all knowing glance.

Martin pats Jack's wet hair.

MARTIN (CONT'D)  
I got her.

EXT. BATESVILLE CHRISTIAN - PARKING LOT - MINUTES LATER

Martin's black shiny SUV pulls into an available space near  
the turf soccer field. But no one is there playing on it.

He gets go and instantly his glasses steam up.

MARTIN  
Great. Where are they?

He wipes his glasses clear with his shirt.

EXT. BATESVILLE CHRISTIAN - THE GROUNDS - SAME

Martin approaches the parents of the girls on his  
daughter's soccer team.

MARTIN  
Where's the girls?

MOTHER #1  
On the grass.

MARTIN  
What's wrong with the turf?

MOTHER #2  
Coach says its too hot.

MARTIN  
Too hot. Really?

Martin walks up to the field his company donated to the school. The scoreboard advertises his company, "4-Ever Green, When Nature Isn't Good Enough."

MARTIN (CONT'D)  
Whew. It's like I'm walking into an oven.

He knees down and touches the turf. He reacts to the extensive heat.

MARTIN (CONT'D)  
Ouch.

Martin looks back to the girls playing on the grass practice field.

MARTIN (CONT'D)  
Hmmm. When nature isn't good enough.

He takes out his iPhone and tabs on his weather app.

It reads: "Batesville, 83 Degrees."

MARTIN (CONT'D)  
Strange.

INT. THORNHILL'S HOME - KITCHEN - NEXT DAY

Thornhill family moves about as they circle their granite slab kitchen island.

JACK  
Hey, my toast is burnt.

Jill scoops up his plate.

JILL  
Momma, will get ya some more.

By the fridge, Martin sips coffee from a mug that reads: #1 Dad. He looks to his first born as she approaches him.

MARTIN  
How was practice last night?

ELLIE, 16, with ear pods in, she passes him in silence. She wears a Mount Vesuvius University Firebirds' jersey and Adidas soccer pants. She treats soccer as a profession.

Martin motions for her to take the ear pods out.

MARTIN (CONT'D)  
Practice?

ELLIE  
What about it?

She opens up the fridge and grabs out a chilled peach.

MARTIN  
How was it?

ELLIE  
Good.

MARTIN  
Can you expand upon that?

She closes the fridge.

ELLIE  
Why?

MARTIN  
The turf? What's wrong with it?

ELLIE  
Too hot.

Ellie places her ear pods back in.

Martin eyes her.

ELLIE (CONT'D)  
It burned our feet.

Martin looks to Jill as she cuts up Jack's pancakes.

JILL  
Is that possible?

MARTIN  
I'm going to talk to Chet about  
that today.

EXT. 4-EVER GREEN CORPORATE - DAY

Modern structure of steel and glass. Green turf and rich red brushes landscapes the front.

To the left are five tall flag poles.

Here waves and wipes in the wind: "The Stars and Stripes, Georgia's State Flag, NFL Flag, FIFA Flag, and NCAA Flag."

Behind them, signage for, "4-Ever Green, When Nature Isn't Good Enough."

EXT. 4-EVER GREEN CORPORATE - MARTIN'S OFFICE - SAME

Martin picks up the phone.

MARTIN  
Darla. Is Chet back yet?

DARLA (O.S.)  
He's expected back this afternoon.

MARTIN  
Holler to me, when he comes back in.

EXT. M.V.U.'S OFF-CAMPUS - TEDDY BEAR BURGERS - DAY

Downtown 50's Themed Restaurant.

INT. TEDDY BEAR BURGERS & SHAKES - DAY

Eats at a long table members of the Firebirds' soccer team: O'Malley, Anna, Izzy, Jaz, Sophia, Keira, and Annabel.

JAZ  
What's your Mom doing with Coach?

ANNABEL  
I don't know.

IZZY  
Does she really work at The Greasy Spoon?

ANNABEL  
Yes. I think so.

SOPHIA  
Coach seems awfully fond of her?

Sophia looks to Jaz.

JAZ  
You trying to get some more minutes, girl?

The girls laugh at Annabel's expense.

O'MALLEY  
What's with all the questions?

SOPHIA  
Sheer curiosity.

ANNABEL  
Girls, I don't know what's going on. Honest.

Some of the girls don't believe her.

IZZY  
Come on. We want details. She's been here two weeks.

SOPHIA  
And staying at his place.

KEIRA  
Let's change the subject?

JAZ  
Why?

O'MALLEY  
Jaz. Have you forgotten?

JAZ  
What?

O'MALLEY  
I am a member of a team.

KEIRA  
(on cue)  
And I rely on the team.

IZZY  
I defer to it.

JAZ  
And sacrifice for it.

ALL THE GIRLS  
Because the team, not the individual, is the ultimate champion.

They all look up to the heavens and with their hands held high over their heads.

ALL THE GIRLS (CONT'D)  
Mia Hamm, we love you girl!

Together again, the girls giggle and laugh.

O'Malley's food is untouched.

KEIRA  
O'Malley, you didn't eat anything.

O'MALLEY  
I'm not hungry.

EXT. 4-EVER GREEN CORPORATE - RECEPTION AREA - DAY

Darla is on the phone.

DARLA  
He's been on the company's payroll  
since he was Eight. Then, he was a  
cleaner, a sweeper, and a doer of  
what needs to be done. Thirty  
years later, our boss' job  
description remains the same.  
Yeah.

CHEP, Director of Sales, black, 60, shaved head, muscular  
curves, and a smooth chiseled face who was Martin's Dad's  
right-hand man.

DARLA (CONT'D)  
Oops. Chet's here. I got'ta call  
ya back.

Chet approaches Darla.

DARLA (CONT'D)  
Marty wants to see ya.

Chet smiles as he strolls by Darla's desk.

CHEP  
I must be in trouble.

DARLA  
You know damn well this place  
couldn't run without you.

Chet turns.

CHEP  
I know. I just like hearing it.

EXT. 4-EVER GREEN CORPORATE - MARTIN'S OFFICE - SAME

Martin reviews the plans for a big stadium project they won in Canada.

There's a KNOCK on the door.

Through the glass, Martin sees Chet and waves him in.

MARTIN

When did you start knocking?

CHET

When they added CEO to your door.

Chet sits down.

MARTIN

It should be your name.

CHET

No. I prefer sales. Less headaches.

MARTIN

True.

CHET

What's up, Marty? Darla said you needed to see me. If it's about my expense account, I can explain.

MARTIN

No... but I better write myself a note to check that out.

The two share a laugh.

CHET

So, what is it?

MARTIN

The turf we installed at BC.

CHET

It's top shelf turf. Diamond ridged monofilament fiber.

MARTIN

And the infill?

CHET

Hmm. Crumb-rubber.

MARTIN

How did it test with heat?

CHET

In the lab, it ran hot.

Chet gets up.

CHET (CONT'D)

But I prefer to conduct my tests  
on-site.

Martin joins him.

EXT. BATESVILLE CHRISTIAN - SOCCER FIELD - DAY

Green turf bakes in the sun as the temperature reads 93 degrees off Martin's iPhone.

MARTIN

How are we expecting young  
athletes to play on this surface?

CHET

I can feel it through my shoes.

Chet pulls on a heat sensor. He holds it six inches off the turf.

CHET (CONT'D)

Yeah. One-hundred and sixty  
degrees Fahrenheit. Hot enough to  
cook.

MARTIN

Hot infill.

CHET

Crumb-rubber absorbs heat.

MARTIN

Than why are we using it?

CHET

Cost, boss. Cost.

INT. MARTIN'S SUV - DAY

Martin's SUV drives along a rural road.

MARTIN

Siri. Call Gus.

SIRI  
Calling, Gus Muller.

RECEPTIONIST (O.S.)  
National Turf Association, how can  
I help you?

MARTIN  
This is Marty Thornhill of  
Four-Ever Green, I wish to speak  
to Gus.

RECEPTIONIST (O.S.)  
One moment, Mr. Thornhill.

INT. NATIONAL TURF ASSOCIATION - GUS' OFFICE - SAME

GUS, late 50s, turf companies self-acclaimed holy man who needs to go to confession. This prophet preaches on the common good, profits. He's motto is conform or perish.

INTERCUT BETWEEN GUS AND MARTIN

GUS  
Marty, congrats on landing the  
Montreal deal.

MARTIN (O.S)  
Thanks Gus. I appreciated your  
help with it.

GUS  
That's why I'm here. So, how can I  
be of service.

Martin in SUV.

MARTIN  
What's the agency's stance on  
crumb-rubber?

GUS (O.S.)  
Crumb-rubber. It's safe,  
cost-effective, and a responsible  
use of discarded tire rubber.

MARTIN  
Hmm.

GUS  
Why?

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - MIDFIELD - DAY

Coach Gordon watches his team run a drill on goal. He likes what he sees and yells.

COACH GORDON  
Rotate. Rotate. Good. Okay.  
Hydrate.

Together, Annabel and O'Malley walks to the...

SIDELINES.

O'Malley removes her goalie gloves.

O'MALLEY  
Do you ever wonder what's next?

ANNABEL  
National Title.

O'MALLEY  
No. In life.

ANNABEL  
Oh. No.

O'MALLEY  
Maybe we should.

ANNABEL  
It will figure itself out. It  
always does.

O'Malley takes a deep drink from her water bottle. She appears pale.

O'MALLEY  
Ahh.

ANNABEL  
What's wrong?

O'MALLEY  
I've never felt so tired.

ANNABEL  
These two a days.

O'MALLEY  
It's more than that.

Annabel hits her shoulder hard.

ANNABEL  
You got this girl.

O'MALLEY  
What if I don't?

ANNABEL  
So what. To fail. Is to try.

O'MALLEY  
Yeah.

ANNABEL  
No one is going to give you a win,  
right?

O'MALLEY  
Right. You gotta take it.

The two race back to their positions.

INT. 4-EVER GREEN CORPORATE - MARTIN'S OFFICE - DAY

Chet strolls in.

CHET  
So, what did Gus say?

MARTIN  
Says its safe and environmentally  
responsible.

CHET  
And the extreme heat?

MARTIN  
He agrees the crumbs are fifty  
degrees hotter. Says watering it  
before practice will help.

CHET  
What does your gut say?

MARTIN  
I need more data.

INT. THORNHILL'S HOME - THEATER ROOM - NIGHT

Martin sits and watches a DVRed Arsenal game on a 90 inch screen.

On the TV, NICKLAS BENDTNER approaches the goal fast with a ball at his feet.

ANNOUNCER  
Bendtner has a chance!

The TV channel switches.

MARTIN  
What?

He turns back.

His daughter Ellie holds the remote in her hands. She wears a Mount Vesuvius hoodie.

ELLIE  
Sorry Dad. My game is about to come on.

MARTIN  
Your game?

ELLIE  
Mount Vesuvius vs. Great Lakes State.

MARTIN  
Who?

ELLIE  
Dad. Don't you know anything?

MARTIN  
Obviously not. Am I allowed to watch it with you?

ELLIE  
Of course. Popcorn?

MARTIN  
Sure.

Martin sprints up to get the popcorn.

Ellie sits in a recliner and puts her feet up.

ELLIE  
Go, O'Malley. Go.

MATCH-CUT:

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD — THE FIELD — SAME

On the green turf, two teams battle it out for first place in their division.

ANNOUNCER

Hi folks. This is Bobby Williams, your Mt. Vesuvius Firebirds' announcer. Tonight is a fight for first place. Let's see who wants it more. Firebirds take the field for warm-ups. Should be interesting tonight. Mt. Vesuvius' goal keeper O'Malley Quinlan. The senior leads the Division in goals against average, and ranks top ten in the nation.

UNIFORMS:

Great Lakes State are AWAY: All BLUE tops and bottoms with gold socks.

Mt. Vesuvius are HOME: All WHITE top and bottoms with RED socks.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE BOOTH - SAME

Bobby reads from a piece of paper.

ANNOUNCER

Here's the starting lineup for Mt. Vesuvius Firebirds.

The team waits at the sideline for their name to be called.

ANNOUNCER (CONT'D)

Across the back line, Left Back.  
Number Five from the hometown of  
Rome, New York. Sophia...

CROWD

Raucci!

Sophia sprints out onto the field.

ANNOUNCER

Right Back. Number Three from the  
hometown of West Lafayette,  
Indiana. Megan...

CROWD

Sherrick!

Megan sprints out onto the field.

ANNOUNCER  
Center Midfielder. Number Thirteen  
from hometown of Chicago,  
Illinois. Keira...

CROWD  
Erling!

Keira sprints out onto the field.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELDS - THE STANDS - SAME

Night approaches as Tess takes her sit.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE FIELD - SAME

The team mates continues to sprint out to the field.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
Attacking Midfielder. Number  
Seventeen from the hometown of  
Naples, Florida. Izzy...

CROWD  
Worley!

Izzy sprints out onto the field.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
Right Winger. On the top of the  
four-four-two, Number Two from the  
south side of Chicago, Illinois.  
Jaz...

CROWD  
Buschur!

Jaz sprints out onto the field.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE BOOTH - SAME

Bobby lays down his notes and peers out of the booth.

ANNOUNCER  
Center Forward. Number Nine from  
the hometown of Flat Rock,  
Pennsylvania. Annabel...

CROWD  
Shone!

Annabel sprints out onto the field.

Between the pipes, Number One.  
From the hometown of Batesville,  
Georgia. O'Malley...

O'Malley sprints out onto the field.

CROWD  
Quinlan!!! O'Malley! O'Malley!!

INT. THORNHILL'S HOME - THEATER ROOM - SAME

Martin comes back with two buckets of popcorn.

MARTIN  
O'Malley Quinlan? Ryan's daughter?

ELLIE  
Daa. She's been there for four  
years.

The TV captures a wide shot of the field.

MARTIN  
Nice field.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - MIDFIELD - SAME

Under the lights, the game gets underway.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
Great Lakes State with the  
kickoff, deep into space on the  
far touch, returned near midfield  
by Mt. Vesuvius.

Advances Firebirds breakaway on the near touch with Annabel  
running and Jaz on her flank.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.) (CONT'D)  
The duo is in the clear. Unlucky  
collision with Cobb of the Great  
Lakes State Cougars upends Shone.  
Goal kick State. Both teams going  
with the fresh-legged pace of a  
Saturday night match.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE STANDS - SAME

Tess and Courtney Quinlan a row in front of her watches.

TESS  
Let's go!

COURTNEY  
Come on! Talk, girls! Talk!

She turns back to Tess.

COURTNEY (CONT'D)  
Hi. I'm Courtney.

TESS  
Your daughter is wonderful at  
goal.

COURTNEY  
Thanks. She works hard at it.

TESS  
I'm...

COURTNEY  
Annabel's Mom. I know. Come.

She scoots over.

TESS  
I haven't made it to a lot of  
games. In high school, I followed  
the wrong boy into the backseat of  
his Camaro. Since then, life has  
been shit except for her.

Tess eye Annabel on the field.

TESS (CONT'D)  
She's all I have.

COURTNEY  
I see. Take a sit. Keep me in  
check, Tess.

TESS  
What do you do?

COURTNEY  
Teach English.

TESS  
Is that fun?

COURTNEY  
Sometimes. What do you do?

TESS  
I'm figuring that out.

Courtney, not judgy, just smiles back kindly.

COURTNEY  
Good.

She nudges the man next to her.

COURTNEY (CONT'D)  
This is Ryan, my husband. He's a nervous wreck.

RYAN  
Hi Tess, you think after all these games I wouldn't be.

TESS  
Its a gift to watch these girls play.

COURTNEY  
Especially Annabel.

RYAN  
She's got some wheels.

Chirps in KARL and JEANNIE, 40s, tall and fit, former college athletes and Keira's parents.

JEANNIE  
Hi.

KARL  
Does she get that speed from you?

TESS  
No.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD — ON THE FIELD — SAME

Cougar player grabs Jaz's jersey.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
Big handful of Buschur's jersey sets up the first free kick of the night, and GOOOOOOOAAAAALLLLL Mt. Vesuvius! Keira Erling lofts it perfectly toward the back side of the penalty box. You could not have put the ball on a tee better for Annabel Shone.

(MORE)

ANNOUNCER (V.O.) (CONT'D)  
She crisply flicks it right along  
the crossbar and buries it on the  
opposite side of the net. TV is  
getting its money's worth.

INT. THORNHILL'S HOME - THEATER ROOM - SAME

Ellie tips over her bowl of popcorn as she stands and  
cheers.

ELLIE  
Great goal!

Martin gives her a high-five.

MARTIN  
Great set-up.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE BOOTH - SAME

Bobby sits in the booth and watches with binoculars.

ANNOUNCER  
State restarts. Mt. V regains  
possession and moves forward with  
numbers. Fantastic overlapping  
passes through the midfield to  
bring the ball wide left side.  
Erling thinks about it, the tap  
crosses to Buschur who takes a  
stride to set then strokes a level  
shot for the far post. She's just  
a foot outside.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIRE - THE SIDELINES - SAME

Jaz's shot misses.

Coach Gordon watches.

COACH GORDON  
Great attempt, Jaz! Keep firing.

Coach starts to pace.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE FIELD - SAME

Annabel awaits Cougar Keeper's kick.

ANNABEL  
Come on. Let's win this Firebirds!

Jaz tracks down a long kick, but she's disrupted by a high cleat that grazes her in the cheek.

Jaz eyes the Cougar player.

JAZ  
Girl, you just didn't do that.

Then, she eye-balls the REF.

REF  
Play on.

A cougar breaks through the line.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
State on the assault.

The Firebirds' DEFENSE squeezes in on the Cougar player.

The Cougar gets off a weak kick to goal right at O'Malley.  
Who easily stops it.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.) (CONT'D)  
Goal kick.

INT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE MIDFIELD - SAME

Off O'Malley's long punt, Annabel is whistled for contact  
and a restart to Great Lakes State.

Cougars advances and plays possession inside the 18,  
finally Sophia gets the clearance. Off the throw, quality  
cross is broken up by Megan and goal kick for O'Malley.  
Skillings and Jaz tie up again.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
This is a classic back-forward  
showdown. This time, referee says  
advantage Cougars. Buschur must be  
careful as she comes into  
tonight's match with four cards.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE BOOTH - SAME

Bobby peers down at the game.

ANNOUNCER

Ball bounds over the State's keeper Sullivan's head, momentarily an open goal but the ball backspins into Sullivan's outstretched hands.

Bobby slaps his hand down hard on the table.

ANNOUNCER (CONT'D)

Oh, so close to Two-Zero.

State gets its' first threat as Hensen makes a solo breakaway.

ANNOUNCER (CONT'D)

O'Malley has two choices. Charge or defend.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - GOAL LINE - SAME

O'Malley opts for charge, and comes within a foot of paying for it. O'Malley dives at Petrillo right at the 18, and as she falls, Hensen drives for the goal. All Mt. V can do is watch, but the ball rolls wide left.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)

Wow. That was close.

INT. THORNHILL'S HOME - THEATER ROOM - SAME

Both Martin and Ellie are standing a few feet in front of the TV.

ELLIE

Whew. That was close.

MARTIN

Too close.

On the TV, O'Malley kicks the ball. Then, the Firebirds' win it and set up a pass for Jaz. She boots the ball towards the goal.

The Cougar's Keeper gets a glove on it and knocks it out of bounce.

ELLIE & MARTIN

Corner!

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)

First corner of the night for Mt. Vesuvius.

EXT. FIREBIRD'S FIELD - THE BOOTH - SAME

Bobby peers down.

As a routine O'Malley punt caroms off a Great Lakes State player over the end line. Hensen sends it right across the face, and Cougar's Keeper charges. It skips through her hands, but not where the Firebirds can utilize the misplay.

ANNOUNCER

Another State scare as Buschur chips forward for Shone, Great Lakes State's Cobb has the ball flick the wrong way and Shone is on. Cobb recovers just enough to frustrate Shone's shot, otherwise it would have been one v one and again likely Two-Nil.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - SCOREBOARD - SAME

Shows 1-0, Home vs. Guest. Time stands 24:00 on the first half clock.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE BOOTH - SAME

The Firebirds owns the midfield. Keira steals the ball from an advancing Cougar player.

ANNOUNCER

They don't call Erling the Wall for nothing. Great steal. And...

Another chance as Keira breaks away. A Cougar player rushes after her. She gives a smart back heel flick to Annabel.

ANNOUNCER (CONT'D)

Ooooooh. What a pass!

The home crowd is brought in.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - COUGAR'S GOAL - SAME

Keeper steps out to cover.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)

Shone uses her left. Boom!

The Cougar's keeper makes an amazing save.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.) (CONT'D)  
Wow. Stunning save. Still One-Nil  
Mt. Vesuvius, clock now at twenty  
in the first half.

Whistle blows on Great Lakes State restarts the game near  
midfield for Mt. Vesuvius.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - FIREBIRD'S GOAL - SAME

High cross from a Great Lakes State player earns the  
Cougar's their second corner.

This time, O'Malley reaches high and misses. The ball lands  
dangerously in the six-box, but a long clearance by Erling.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
The Firebirds avoids the  
equalizer.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - MIDFIELD - SAME

Izzy attacks down the field.

ANNOUNCER  
Slight breeze tonight out of the  
south, and that aids a thirty-yard  
cracker from Worley. It bends  
toward the crossbar, and Sullivan  
punches it over at the last  
moment. Corner Mt. Vesuvius.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE CORNER - SAME

Izzy strikes the ball hard. It bends and lands before a  
mele of players.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
Somebody get a boot on it.

Cougar player clears it.

The home crowd reactions with a groan.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.) (CONT'D)  
Clock winding down. Two minutes  
left in the half. Firebirds still  
lead One-Nil.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' — THE STANDS — SAME

Tess, from the bleachers, watches her daughter dribble through a crowd.

Annabel separates. She's one on one with the Cougar's Keeper.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD — COUGAR'S GOAL — SAME

Annabel stops, places her foot and shoots. The ball sails slightly over the cross bar. A miss.

ANNABEL

Aaawwww.

Annabel smacks her head for missing a sure goal.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD — THE STANDS — SAME

BART, 40s, a movie star looking man walks up the bleachers. He's eating a hot dog.

TESS

Oh, shit!

COURTNEY

Annabel's father?

TESS

Yes.

COURTNEY

I think I would have followed him into the backseat too.

TESS

In high school, he was everything. The QB captain of the football team with college scouts begging him to play for their schools.

COURTNEY

What happened?

TESS

Life. Now he works in glass factory for Eighteen dollars an hour.

COURTNEY

Oh. You too divorced?

TESS  
Not yet.

Bart stands at the end of their row.

BART  
Tess. She gets that temper our  
her's from you.

TESS  
You A-hole, what are you doing  
here?

Bart moves to sit with Tess.

BART  
Good day for a drive.

Bart moves people in Tess' row.

BART (CONT'D)  
Excuse me. My wife misses me.

Bart takes a big bite of his hot dog as he squeezes in the seat next to Tess.

Bart nods to the other parents.

BART (CONT'D)  
What's the score?

RYAN  
One-Nil, good guys.

He chews with his mouth open.

BART  
Good.

EXT. FIREBIRD'S FIELD - THE BOOTH - SAME

ANNOUNCER  
That will be the last attack of  
the first half. We go to half time  
at One-Nil Mt. Vesuvius.

INT. ATHLETIC COMPLEX - LOCKER ROOM - HALFTIME

The players rest on benches as Gordon stands.

COACH GORDON  
First half. Thoughts?

KEIRA

We have the momentum.

COACH GORDON

True. But what have we learned  
about momentum?

KEIRA

It swings.

COACH GORDON

Correct. Annabel and Jaz. What are  
you seeing?

JAZ

Not enough goals from our  
attempts.

COACH GORDON

Annabel?

ANNABEL

We missed scoring opportunities.

COACH GORDON

True. Stick to the basics. Those  
scoring chances will come again.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE BOOTH - NIGHT

The second half begins.

ANNOUNCER

Great Lakes State gets a breakaway  
that O'Malley comes off her line  
to challenge. She makes the first  
save, but the ball gets free. She  
battles with Smoker, and gets  
carded. From the penalty spot,  
Hensen puts in the equalizer. Soft  
placement to the low left side.  
one-one... Clock now at Thirty-Six  
left, and play is getting rough.

Home crowd is gets into the match with chants.

CROWD

Get it back. Get it back.

Cougar player crashes into a Firebird and gets called for  
the foul. Great Lake player then pounds the ball away and  
gets the yellow card for unsportsmanlike conduct.

After the free kick, Mt. Vesuvius picks up a throw in and Gordon substitutes Jaz back into the lineup.

ANNOUNCER  
Great Lakes State overloads the Firebirds for the first time tonight. The first shot from Hensen ricochets off O'Malley's gloves, and Smoker drives it home for the two-one lead — just under thirty minutes left.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD — GOAL LINE — MINUTES LATER

O'Malley comes off her line. She faces another Cougar challenge. O'Malley misses and a Cougar player chips into an empty goal.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
Unlucky. That's Three-One with Twenty-Eight minutes left.

O'Malley retrieves the ball. Her breathing is laborious. She looks pale.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD — THE STANDS — SAME

Reacts. Tess, Bart, Courtney, Ryan, and parents and fans.

COURTNEY  
Eeeeck.

TESS  
There is plenty of time.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD — THE BOOTH — SAME

Bobby watches.

ANNOUNCER  
How a game can turn in two minutes. After being dominated for the opening Sixty minutes, Great Lakes State is now the aggressor, very energized on the front after their back-to-back goals. Now they're flying at Mt. Vesuvius.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE STANDS - SAME

Courtney sees a Cougar with the ball. The Great Lakes State player makes a break for the one v one goal.

Courtney stands.

COURTNEY  
Someone get her!

Ryan looks around.

RYAN  
Does anyone have the time?

CHRIS, Izzy's Dad answers.

CHRIS  
Twenty minutes.

Cheers the Mt. Vesuvius fans.

FANS  
Let's go, Red!

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE FIELD - SAME

The Cougars moves to a defensive stance.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
Great Lakes State begins to dial it back a bit, and looks to play more possession to protect the Three-One lead. Twenty minutes to play.

Mt. Vesuvius swarms the Cougars for possession.

INTERCUT WITH THE THORNHILL HOME

Martin and Ellie's reactions to the game.

On the TV, the Cougars are content to play behind the ball to lock off opportunities.

Jaz breaks away, but where she found even numbers earlier, she's now doubled, with a third defender laying back.

ELLIE  
Come on. They're eating time.

On the TV.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
Great Lakes State has relaxed its  
front to protect the three-one  
spread. Sixteen left to play.

Mt. Vesuvius throws in.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELDS - THE SIDELINES - SAME

Coach Gordon walks up to the bench.

COACH GORDON  
Worley. Raucci. Purks. You're in.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
Coach Gordon makes three  
substitutions.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE FIELD - SAME

The substitutes forces a quick attack, but State collapses  
back on it.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
Twelve minutes left. Annabel Shone  
turns on a loose ball and let's  
loose from twenty-five yards.  
Keeper reaches for it.  
GOOOAAAALLL. GOAL Mt. Vesuvius  
Down by One.

INT. THORNHILL'S HOME - THEATER ROOM - SAME

Martin and Ellie's joyous reaction. High-fives and hugs.

ELLIE & MARTIN  
Go Firebirds!

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELDS - THE FIELD - SAME

The game plays on.

Megan brings the crowd to its feet with a long run from the  
mid field stripe. Cougar defenders retreats to the  
eighteen, then picks her off to end the attack.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
Buschur advances up the near  
touch, but she's forced to cross.

Keira and Annabel struggles for position.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.) (CONT'D)  
Harmless to the Keeper. Seven  
minutes left.

Mt. Vesuvius pulls the defense up high, adds more pressure.  
Results in an off-sides trap for State.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.) (CONT'D)  
Restart for the Firebirds at  
midfield allows all but Erling to  
stay back. No attack this time,  
and the clock is now the enemy.  
Four minutes to play down  
three-two.

EXT. FIREFIRDS' FIELDS — THE STANDS — SAME

From the stands watches a nervous group of parents. They  
look at the game clock opposite the field.

BART  
Go girl. Go.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD — THE FIELD — SAME

As if hearing her father's wishes.

ANNOUNCER  
Shone spins away from a  
midfielder, gets into the clear,  
sets it perfectly to her left for  
Erling. Sullivan charges out. Too  
late! Erling's shot lofts over  
Sullivan's shoulder! GOOOOAAALLL  
MVU! Goal MVU!

INT. THORNHILL'S HOME — THEATER ROOM — SAME

Stands Ellie & Martin even closer to the TV.

Ellie stomps her feet in joy.

ELLIE  
We are tied at Three!

MARTIN  
One minute left.

On TV.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
The Cougars mount an attack.  
Hensen makes a solo breakaway.  
O'Malley has two choices - charge  
or defend.

MARTIN  
Why don't I remember O'Malley at  
BC?

ELLIE  
She went to Van Buren.

MARTIN  
You're right. I forgot.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE STANDS - SAME  
Courtney watches her daughter respond to the ball.

COURTNEY  
Oh, dear.

Then, she looks to Tess.

Tess squeezes Courtney's hand for assurance.

TESS  
She's got this.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - GOAL LINE - SAME  
O'Malley charges to the ball.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
O'Malley opts for charge, and  
comes within a foot of paying for  
it.

O'Malley dives at Hensen right at the 18, saves a sure  
goal.

INT. THORNHILL'S HOME - THEATER ROOM - SAME  
Ellie stands and rocks a bit back in forth.

ELLIE  
Whew. Gutsy girl.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - GOAL LINE - SAME

O'Malley hurries the ball back in play. Her kick is perfect. Targets Annabel.

Annabel settles the ball at her feet with two defender's on her back.

Annabel moves left, then right.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
Shone is creating space!

Annabel sees Jaz and draws the defenders away.

Jaz taps it back to Shone.

Then, Annabel finds a higher gear. Jets pass her defenders. Now, she's One-on-One with Sullivan.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.) (CONT'D)  
This is going to be good.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE STANDS - SAME

Tess bites her finger nails.

TESS  
Now, girl. Now.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE 18 - SAME

Annabel makes a quick move.

The Keep charges out to intercept.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
This could be it.

Jaz breaks wide.

The Cougar Keep commits to Annabel.

Annabel sees Jaz to her far right and taps it back with her left foot.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.) (CONT'D)  
Oh, my! What a perfect pass.

The Cougar's Defense gets their late.

Jaz shoots point blank at an open goal.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.) (CONT'D)  
GOOOOOAAALLLL! In the final  
minute!

INT. THORNHILL'S HOME- THEATER ROOM - SAME  
Ellie and Martin reacts and celebrates.

MARTIN  
Wow. This beats Professional.

ELLIE  
What a goal.

MARTIN  
What a game.

The TV captures the Firebirds' fans in the stands.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE STANDS - SAME

Erupts the Firebirds' fans.

High-fives Bart and Ryan.

Hugs Tess and Courtney.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD — MIDFIELD — SAME

The Ref blows his whistle three times.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
And there's the three whistles.  
Full time and the final score  
Four-Three. Mt. Vesuvius! The  
Firebirds win.

Firebirds' fans rushes down the stands and out onto the field.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE 18 - SAME

The Firebirds' team celebrates as the girls hoist up, Jaz and O'Malley.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
You couldn't ask for a better game  
than that folks. Time to  
celebrate.

Above everyone's shoulders, O'Malley points to the stands and her parents.

Annabel looks up to O'Malley.

ANNABEL  
It all works out, Keep.

O'MALLEY  
It certainly does. Go Firebirds!  
Yeah.

Black spots and blood smears their jerseys.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - THE STANDS - SAME

Within a sea of cheering fans, Courtney realizes the Majesty of soccer played at this level.

COURTNEY  
Ah, it's a beautiful game.

TESS  
Yes, it is.

EXT. SOCCER CO-OP - SATURDAY NIGHT - LATER

College kids with red Dixie cups in their hands celebrates their victory over their regional rivals.

INT. SOCCER CO-OP - LIVING ROOM - SAME

Fill of team players out of their uniforms.

A few of the more daring parents linger about.

JEANNIE  
Where's your husband?

TESS  
He left. Bart prefers to be alone.

JEANNIE  
Oh.

Tess approaches Jaz.

TESS  
Great shot Jaz.

JAZ

It was your daughter Annabel that  
set me up.

Jaz high-fives Annabel as she enters the living room.

ANNABEL

It felt good to win.

Enters Courtney and O'Malley, side by side, into the living room.

O'Malley wears sunglasses, jeans and a Pearl Jam Tour T-Shirt.

JAZ

O'Malley. What's with the  
sunglasses?

O'MALLEY

Tonight... I feel famous.

Tess looks at O'Malley. The Keeper starts to wobble.

POV O'Malley as the room spins.

Tess attempts to grab her as she wobbles.

TESS

Honey... you okay?

O'Malley falls face down to the floor.

EXT. UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL - NIGHT - LATER

The ambulance pulls up. Paramedics pop out. We see O'Malley in a stretcher as doctors and nurses rush out of the hospital.

LEAD DOCTOR

Condition?

PARAMEDIC 1

Possible dehydration. Passed out  
at a party.

LEAD DOCTOR

Signs of Alcohol?

COURTNEY

My daughter is an athlete. She  
doesn't drink.

LEAD DOCTOR  
(to paramedics)  
Alcohol?

PARAMEDIC 2  
No signs of alcohol poisoning.

LEAD DOCTOR  
Okay. Check her vitals. We can  
take her from here.

INT. HOSPITAL WAITING ROOM - NIGHT - LATER

Sits in awkward silence: Tess, Team Mates, Ryan, Coach Gordon, and Courtney.

They all are in a daze.

A young DOCTOR comes out in clean white lab coat. He holds charts up. Looks at them one last time. Then, he clears throat as he looks up.

DOCTOR  
Mrs. Quinlan?

COURTNEY  
Right here. How's she doing?

DOCTOR  
I'm afraid not well.

The others react to the news.

INT. COACH GORDON'S HOME - KITCHEN - NIGHT

Coach Gordon makes two cups of fresh tea.

TESS  
Stage four Hodgkin's lymphoma.

COACH GORDON  
How?

TESS  
She's only Twenty-One years old.

Gordon stares out the dark window above the sink.

COACH GORDON  
I know.

INT. UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL - I.C.U. - DAY

Tess enters the room and sees her Daughter talking to an unconscious best friend.

Machines and monitors are everywhere.

O'Malley lays motionless in her bed.

ANNABEL

What are you doing here?

TESS

How many times are you going to say that?

ANNABEL

Until you go home.

TESS

Do you really think I wanted my life to turn out like this? Crap.

ANNABEL

You did nothing to stop it.

TESS

I did nothing. Hell girl. I was Homecoming Queen before I met you.

ANNABEL

So, it's all my fault.

TESS

No. But there were other options.

ANNABEL

What?

TESS

You want to have a Big-Girl conversation. Let's have it.

ANNABEL

I can't believe you just said that.

TESS

You spoiled brat. You cannot comprehend the sacrifices that have been made. All for you.

ANNABEL

Like what?

TESS

You think I'm talking about me?  
Hmm. You are just like him.  
Pig-headed.

ANNABEL

I prefer the word, determined.

TESS

You would college girl.

Annabel moves to leave. Tess grabs here hard, and shakes her.

TESS (CONT'D)

Wake up. Your father had every  
big-time school in three states  
begging him to play football.

ANNABEL

Tess thinks back.

TESS

He was fast.

ANNABEL

Not as fast as you and Coach?

TESS

Gordon and I were friends before  
you were even born.

ANNABEL

I still don't like it.

Annabel storms off.

TESS

You don't have to.

Tess walks over to O'Malley.

TESS (CONT'D)

Poor child.

O'Malley's eyes open up.

TESS (CONT'D)

You're awake.

O'Malley looks afraid.

Tess comforts her.

TESS (CONT'D)  
It's okay, dear. Shh. It's going  
to be okay.

INT. HOSPITAL ROOM - NIGHT - LATER

Tess sits by Courtney.

O'Malley lies surrounded by her teammates. She looks happy.  
She's out of the I.C.U.

Courtney looks like she hasn't slept for days. She stands  
and stretches.

COURTNEY  
Tess, can I have a word with you?

TESS  
Sure.

Courtney moves out to the hallway.

Tess follows her.

COURTNEY  
You and Coach are... friends?

TESS  
We are a little more than that  
Courtney.

COURTNEY  
I know. Could you talk to him for  
me?

TESS  
What about?

COURTNEY  
The turf. Does he think it's safe  
to play on?

TESS  
The turf?

COURTNEY  
Yes. The turf.

EXT. COACH GORDON'S HOME - DECK - DAY

Gordon and Tess enjoys some lemonade.

COACH GORDON  
The field? It's brand new.

TESS  
She was referring to their high school field back in Batesville.

COACH GORDON  
Ahh. Well, some people think turf is bad.

TESS  
Why?

COACH GORDON  
The turf is made up of three major parts. Backing material. Plastic blades. And the infill.

TESS  
Those tiny black crumbs?

Gordon nods yes.

COACH GORDON  
The old grounded up tires support the blades.

TESS  
So what's bad about tires?

COACH GORDON  
I don't know.

TESS  
Shouldn't you?

INT. O'MALLEY'S HOSPITAL ROOM - DAY

O'Malley's lays prodded up in bed.

Annabel sits besides her.

O'MALLEY  
Why are you so mean to your Mother?

ANNABEL  
What's she doing here?

O'MALLEY  
Does it matter?

ANNABEL  
She should be back in Flat Rock.

O'MALLEY  
She loves you.

Annabel grows silent.

O'MALLEY (CONT'D)  
Even though you give her every  
reason not to.

ANNABEL  
I... She embarrasses me.

O'MALLEY  
How?

ANNABEL  
She just does.

O'MALLEY  
Hmm.  
(tires)  
Do me a favor.

ANNABEL  
What?

O'MALLEY  
Love her back.

Annabel starts tearing up.

ANNABEL  
Why?

O'MALLEY  
She gave you life.

Annabel ponders this.

O'MALLEY (CONT'D)  
I need sleep. Go.

ANNABEL  
Okay.

Annabel walks to door and turns.

ANNABEL (CONT'D)  
I love you, O'Malley.

O'Malley rests with her eyes shut.

O'MALLEY

I know.

EXT. M.V.U. LIBRARY — COMPUTER STATION — NIGHT

Tess researches the Internet on possible cancer causing chemicals in artificial fields.

She sits and types into a search engine: "crumb rubber cancer."

Search results appear on the screen.

Tess clicks on one that with the keywords of crumb rubber contains. She reads out loud.

TESS

Arsenic. Barium. Benzene. Boron.

Cadmium. Lead. Mercury. Nickel.

Zinc.

Gordon approaches.

COACH GORDON

Here you are.

Coach looks around the library.

TESS

I love this place.

COACH GORDON

Tess, this is all new to you.

TESS

My college experience was changing diapers One-O-One.

COACH GORDON

So what did you learn?

TESS

Used tires are no good.

INT. THE GORDON HOME — BEDROOM — DAY

The phone rings on bedside. On the third ring, Gordon answers it.

COACH GORDON

Hello. Uh-hmm. Uh-Hmm. Okay. I will be right over.

Tess lies beside him.

TESS  
What is it?

Gordon hangs up the phone. Tears start to stream down his face.

COACH GORDON  
O'Malley. She's... gone.

TESS  
How? I thought the treatments were working.

COACH GORDON  
I don't know. Infection maybe. She was so young.

INT. THORNHILL'S HOME - MASTER BEDROOM - DAY

Martin wears a black suit. He is having trouble with his tie.

Jill comes to his aid and helps tie a perfect knot.

JILL  
There.

MARTIN  
Lymphoma.

JILL  
It's such a shame.

MARTIN  
How?

JILL  
Who knows these things?

MARTIN  
Hmm.

EXT. BATESVILLE CHURCH - DAY - LATER

Old Catholic Church of polished stone. A statue of St. Mary stands in front.

INT. BATESVILLE CHURCH - FUNERAL MASS - SAME

Bright sunlight streams through the stained glass as the PRIEST, in full formal attire, walks down the center aisle of the pews.

The pews are packed with men and women paying their final respects: friends, team mates old and new, teachers, coaches, and The Thornhills.

The Quinlan's grief as a wounded family in the front pew.

The Priest passes them as he approaches...

THE ALTAR

Flowers covers the altar. So does a blown up photograph of O'Malley besides her coffin.

PRIEST

Before we begin. Coach Gordon wishes to say a few words.

Gordon sits beside Tess and Annabel. He stands and walks up to the podium. He nods to the Priest.

COACH GORDON

Thank you.

The Priest steps back.

Gordon looks out to the fill church packed with people who loved O'Malley.

COACH GORDON (CONT'D)

I was told once... When you're a coach, and you die, you leave a little piece of yourself in each of your players.

Ryan and Courtney sits and listens.

COACH GORDON (CONT'D)

O'Malley left a huge piece of herself in our team.

Gordon tears up.

COACH GORDON (CONT'D)

And in me.

The Priest re-appears.

COACH GORDON (CONT'D)  
She's irreplaceable. There is only  
one O'Malley Quinlan. We will  
always remember her. A great Keep.

Coach Gordon moves away from the podium and stares down at the flower covered coffin.

Gordon returns to his sit, one by one, his players nod their appreciation as he passes.

PRIEST  
Many wonder. Where is God in a  
time like this?

EXT. BATESVILLE CEMETERY - LATER

Tombstones covers the grounds around O'Malley's burial site.

The priest stands before a large gathering.

PRIEST  
The Lord is my shepherd, I lack  
nothing. He makes me lie down in  
green pastures...

Annabel and Tess hold hands. They look to one another.

Annabel squeezes her Mother's hand. She is grateful she still can.

PRIEST (CONT'D)  
Even though I walk through the  
darkest valley, I will fear no  
evil.

EXT. O'MALLEY'S HIGH SCHOOL SOCCER FIELD - DAY

Martin walks the turf. He still wears his dark suit from the funeral.

A GROUNDS KEEPER appears.

GROUNDS KEEPER  
Oh, Mr. Thornhill. It's you.

MARTIN  
Hey Mike. How do you like this field?

GROUNDS KEEPER  
I love it. I don't have to cut it  
or water it.

MARTIN  
Is it safe?

GROUNDS KEEPER  
Safe? What do you mean?

Martin bends down and scoops up some crumbs and plays with them in the palm of his hand.

MARTIN  
Nothing.

INT. GORDON HOME — NIGHT

Tess still wears black.

TESS  
These guys are evil.

Coach cleans up the kitchen.

COACH GORDON  
Who?

TESS  
The Rubber Manufacturers. And  
their lobbyists.

COACH GORDON  
They are buying influence.  
Washington has always been that  
way. I bet Pharmaceutical  
lobbyists spend ten times as much  
money to get their way.

TESS  
Maybe. But is that right?

Coach makes a face as he sees her point.

EXT. COURTNEY'S HOME — DAY

Jill rings the doorbell. She has a platter in her hands.

Just as she attempts to hit the buzzer, the door swings open.

Courtney appears in a bathrobe in the doorway. She says nothing.

JILL

Oh. Hi. I thought you may need  
some food.

Courtney turns and walks into her home.

Jill enters.

The home is in disarray.

COURTNEY

Thanks.

Courtney points to the kitchen table as she returns to a living room chair and sits.

COURTNEY (CONT'D)

There.

Jill sees mountains of platters and containers on the table from family members and friends.

JILL

Well, if you need anything, let me know.

Courtney stares at the TV that is off.

COURTNEY

How about my daughter?

INT. LOCKER ROOM — PREGAME — DAY

Before the Championship Game, the locker room chatters with nerves.

NOTE: The girls are dressed in white with black armbands with a white 'O' on them. They sit along two straight wooden benches before their lockers.

In a daze, Coach Gordon stands by a large TV monitor.

There is a knock on the door.

Coach snaps out of his daze. He moves to answer it.

Appears Ryan Quinlan from around the counter.

COACH GORDON

Attention, girls.

They do not respond. Too loud.

COACH GORDON (CONT'D)  
Girls!

The team notices O'Malley's Dad. Everything stops. Utter silence. All look to him.

RYAN  
Hi girls. My girl. Wanted you to have this.

He holds up a shiny DVD.

RYAN (CONT'D)  
In fact, she insisted on it. She called it BIG-GAME MOTIVATION. I call it, her life.

Ryan starts to cry.

The team huddles up around him and hugs him hard.

Ryan pulls away.

RYAN (CONT'D)  
Thank you. Here Coach.

Ryan moves to leave.

RYAN (CONT'D)  
I can't watch it. I lived it.

COACH GORDON  
Thank you, Ryan.

O'Malley's Dad leaves.

Coach inserts the DVD. And hits play. The room is silent again.

The video starts with baby pictures of O'Malley. Then Pearl Jam's, Just Breath plays.

SERIES OF SHOTS: O'MALLEY'S LIFE MONTAGE BEGINS.

- A. Her as an infant in Courtney's arms.
- B. As a toddler in only a diaper chases her Daddy.
- C. In a pink dress dances around a small table set for tea.
- D. Blows out candles. Birthday party after birthday party.
- E. On green grass with soccer ball.

F. Pee-wee soccer teams. Different color uniforms.

G. Plays soccer and scores.

H. Ryan holds up sign, That's my Girl.

I. Try-outs.

J. Select game matches.

K. Soccer tournaments.

L. High School matches.

M. College teammates.

N. Goofing off.

O. Mt. Vesuvius games.

As montage rolls Pearl Jam's, Just Breathe continues to play. After, "Meet you on the other side."

The video ends with a bald O'Malley, in her hospital bed.

O'MALLEY  
Go Firebirds!

O'Malley cries.

O'MALLEY (CONT'D)  
Be Firebirds.

She blows a kiss.

O'MALLEY (CONT'D)  
Win for me.

O'Malley upper body returns to her bed.

O'MALLEY  
Okay Daddy. Turn it off.

The team sobs for their fallen friend and player.

Silence. Their game faces are now on.

COACH GORDON  
You know what to do.

JAZ  
Let's kick some ass.

The girls storm out of the locker room, as they move down the hall.

ANNABEL

We're playing for more than a win.  
We're playing to honor O'Malley.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - CHAMPIONSHIP GAME - DAY

In the booth sit Bobby Williams.

QUICK CUTS OF ACTION.

M.V.U. players void of emotion. Professionally and machine-like dominate the Game.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)

Never have on seen such a lopsided Championship match.

The team their playing bench reacts from being schooled.

INT. LOCKER ROOM - AFTER WIN - LATER

No cheers. Just tears.

COACH GORDON

O'Malley would've been proud of your girls effort today.

JAZ

Game ball goes to?

ANNABEL

The Quinlans.

The team agrees.

INT. THE GORDON HOME - BEDROOM - MORNING

The phone rings by the bedside. On the third ring, Gordon answers it.

COACH GORDON

Hello. Uh-hmm. Okay.

TESS

Who is it?

COACH GORDON

Bart.

TESS

Bart? Is he drunk?

Coach cups phone.

COACH GORDON  
No.

TESS  
It's my Mom.

EXT. FLAT ROCK CEMETERY — DAY

At Tess' Mom's funeral, a coffin fills a concrete silo. A big pile of dirt is beside it.

Everyone else has left except Tess, Gordon, and Bart.

The three old high school friends.

TESS  
Can I have a minute?

GORDON  
Okay.

Coach offers to shake Bart's hand. Bart refuses it.

BART  
My best man. Please.

GORDON  
Stop living in the past. We're not  
in high school anymore.

Coach nods his good-bye. Then he walks toward his car.

Tess removes divorce papers from her purse.

BART  
I'm not signing them.

TESS  
Yes. You are.

BART  
No. I am not.

Tess takes the cap off her pen. She looks straight through Bart.

TESS  
Do you know what the word  
'distress' means?

BART  
You tell me college girl.

Tess uses the pen like a knife. It's tip touches Bart's neck.

TESS  
Dis·tress. Means, extreme anxiety,  
sorrow, or pain.

BART  
So?

Tess pushes the pen into his flesh.

BART (CONT'D)  
Hey. That hurts.

TESS  
Good. I have you attention now.  
Distress could describe the last  
twenty years of my life. But no  
longer. I'm tired of your shit.

BART  
Tess. Don't give up on us.

TESS  
Sign the papers. Now! We are done.

Bart looks around.

BART  
Okay.

Bart uses a tombstone as a desk. Then, he signs the paperwork.

BART (CONT'D)  
You will regret it, girl.

TESS  
I won't.

BART  
So. I was nothing to you.

TESS  
Without you. No Annabel.

BART  
Yeah. She's the best of us, both.  
Sometimes the worse. Bye, Tess.

TESS  
Bye, Bart.

INT. GORDON'S CAR - FUNERAL - SAME

With freshly signed divorce papers in hand, she enters Gordon's car.

COACH GORDON  
How did it go?

TESS  
Good.

She shows him the signed divorce papers.

COACH GORDON  
How?

TESS  
I channeled my inter-bitch.

COACH GORDON  
Good. Let's finally say good-bye  
to this place.

INT. COLLEGE BAR - NIGHT

Great cover band plays, Rosalina Come Out Tonight.

TESS  
Let's dance.

COACH GORDON  
Why?

Tess offers him her hand.

TESS  
Because we can.

COACH GORDON  
That hand would look better. If it  
had a ring on it.

TESS  
Okay. But let's dance first.

EXT. BATESVILLE CHRISTIAN - SOCCER FIELD - DAY

Martin, Jill, and Jack watches Ellie's game.

SERIES OF SHOTS: ELLIE'S GAME.

A. Ellie is the team's goalie.

- B. Shot by shot she stops.
- C. She dives left.
- D. She dives right.
- E. Her uniform gets dirty.

The REF blows his whistle three times.

Ellie's team celebrates.

Martin, Jill and the other parents goes to midfield to congratulate the girls.

JACK  
Great game, Sissy.

Ellie walks towards him all messy and sweaty.

MARTIN  
Good job, honey.

ELLIE  
Thanks, Dad.

Martin grabs her bag and water bottle.

Ellie continues to walk toward the parking lot with her Mom, friends, and brother.

Martin stands at midfield, alone. He looks up at the sun. Then, he bends down and touches the turf.

Close-up of the cork, organic infill.

MARTIN  
Good and cool. It's hard to beat nature.

INT. 4-EVER GREEN CORPORATE - CONFERENCE ROOM - DAY

Martin leans back in his chair.

Chet talks about revenue projections. Behind him, a White Board captures sales projections, shows huge growth. He uses his arm to trace the line up.

CHET  
Sales have never been better.

SALE REP #1  
These schools we're signing only  
care about their football field.

SALES REP #2  
So adding the soccer field in, is  
a slam dunk.

CHEP  
Good. Keep up the good work.

Chet looks at the chart on the with a map of America. Red dots represents where his fields have been installed. The dots are everywhere on the map and includes the soccer field at Mt. Vesuvius University.

CHEP (CONT'D)  
Amazing.

Chet sees Martin staring out the window.

MARTIN  
These new fields we're installing.  
How many are sold with the  
crumb-rubber infill?

Chet looks to his reps.

Sales Rep #1 looks to Sales Rep #2, then back to his boss.

REP#1  
All of them.

INT. AGRICULTURAL SCIENCES BUILDING - DAY

Tess has a new ring on her finger as she walks down a long corridor. She attempts to catch up to Dr. KOTZIN, 50s, chubby, plaid on plaid academic. He's married to his work.

TESS  
Dr. Kotzin. Dr. Kotzin!

DR. KOTZIN  
Yes.

TESS  
I'm Mrs. Gore. Coach Gordon's  
wife.

DR. KOTZIN  
I know who you are. The turf? I'm  
watching it closely. I take  
samples every week.

TESS

Good. But...

DR. KOTZIN

Is it safe for the girls to play  
on?

TESS

Yes.

DR. KOTZIN

As we speak, California is  
conducting a massive study on that  
exact subject.

TESS

Our girls practice and play on  
that field.

DR. KOTZIN

I'm aware.

Dr. Kotzin looks at his watch.

DR. KOTZIN (CONT'D)

I need to go. I have a class.

Dr. Kotzin walks on.

TESS

Oh.

From down the hall, Dr. Kotzin turns and shouts back.

DR. KOTZIN

Tomorrow. My office. Ten a.m.  
Let's talk then.

INT. THORNHILL'S HOME - THEATER ROOM - NIGHT

It's movie night at the Thornhill's home.

Jill and Martin watches the end of, Mr. Smith Goes to Washington.

On screen is Jimmy Stewart, as JEFFERSON SMITH, as he addresses the SENATE. Smith's speech starts with...

JEFFERSON SMITH

I guess this is just another lost cause Mr. Paine. All you people don't know about lost causes. Mr. Paine does.

(MORE)

JEFFERSON SMITH (CONT'D)  
He said once they were the only causes worth fighting for and he fought for them once. For the only reason any man ever fights for them. Because of just one plain simple rule. Love thy neighbor. And in this world today of great hatred a man who knows that rule has a great trust. You know that rule Mr. Paine and I loved you for it just as my father did. And you know that you fight harder for the lost causes than for any others. Yes you'd even die for them. Like a man we both knew Mr. Paine. You think I'm licked. You all think I'm licked. Well I'm not licked. And I'm gonna stay right here and fight for this lost cause. Even if this room gets filled with lies like these. And the Taylors and all their armies come marching into this place. Somebody will listen to me.

Stewart collapses.

MARTIN  
Why don't they make movies like this anymore?

JILL  
Because no one seems to care.

INT. AGRICULTURAL SCIENCES BUILDING - OFFICE - DAY

Tess sits across from Dr. Kotzin in his cluttered office.

DR. KOTZIN  
Think Tess. Each square foot of field has ten plus pounds of tire crumbs. So with that said.

He goes to a chalkboard, and with chalk marks.

DR. KOTZIN (CONT'D)  
A typical three-hundred-foot-long field. That is one-hundred-fifty-feet-wide. Equals forty-five-hundred-square-feet.

He circles the number.

DR. KOTZIN (CONT'D)  
Forty-five-thousand pounds of  
chemically infused waste.

TESS  
That our children are playing on.

DR. KOTZIN  
Exactly. But we need proof.

TESS  
What can I do to help?

He grabs box of vials from a nearby shelf.

DR. KOTZIN  
I always could use more samples.

The doctor hands the box to Tess.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - SIDELINES - DAY

Coach Gordon watches Dr. Kotzin and Tess at the other side  
of the field.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - OTHER SIDE - SAME

Tess scoops up some black pellets. With care, she places  
them in a short, clear tube.

DR. KOTZIN  
It's that simple.

Tess hands over the vial.

DR. KOTZIN (CONT'D)  
Now, I can test it.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - SIDELINES - SAME

Appears DR. ARCHER, 50's, corporate-climber-type, appears  
in a fresh suit next to Coach Gordon. Dr. Archer is Mt.  
Vesuvius' new Athletic Director bent on turning Mt.  
Vesuvius into a regional football powerhouse.

DR. ARCHER  
Hi Coach.

COACH GORDON  
Dr. Archer.

DR. ARCHER  
What are they doing?

COACH GORDON  
Taking samples of the field.

DR. ARCHER  
Samples? Why?

COACH GORDON  
They're looking for...

DR. ARCHER  
We just finished paying for this  
field. Trust me. It's the best  
money can buy.

COACH GORDON  
If you say so, sir.

DR. ARCHER  
I say so.

INT. DR. KOTZIN'S LAB — DAY

Dr. Archer peers in.

DR. ARCHER  
Andy. May I have a word with you?

DR. KOTZIN  
Sure, Bill. What's up?

Dr. Archer picks up various objects in lab.

DR. ARCHER  
I'm concerned.

DR. KOTZIN  
About what?

DR. ARCHER  
Mrs. Gore?

DR. KOTZIN  
What do you mean?

DR. ARCHER  
I'm tired of her doubting the  
integrity of our sports fields for  
one.

DR. KOTZIN  
She's just helping me collect  
samples.

DR. ARCHER  
She's not a scientist, Andy.

DR. KOTZIN  
Neither are you, Bill.

DR. ARCHER  
True. But the money our sports  
teams bring in. Pays for much at  
this University. This nice lab of  
yours for one.

DR. KOTZIN  
Bill. Nothing is more important  
than the safety of our students.

DR. ARCHER  
Of course. No research I've seen  
has linked crumbs to cancer.

DR. KOTZIN  
Yet.

DR. ARCHER  
Exactly.

INT. GORDON'S OFFICE - DAY

Gordon sits at his desk, reviewing a video clip of a potential M.V.U. player's high school game.

Andy appears at the door.

DR. KOTZIN  
Knock. Knock.

Gordon looks up.

COACH GORDON  
Andy. What's up?

DR. KOTZIN  
You have a minute?

COACH GORDON  
Sure.

DR. KOTZIN  
Congrats, by the way.

COACH GORDON

Thanks. I've had my eye on Tess  
since the third grade.

DR. KOTZIN

She's the reason I'm here. Dr.  
Archer is tired of her questioning  
the fields.

COACH GORDON

Someone needs to find out if these  
fields are safe.

MATCH CUT:

EXT. ORLANDO FIVE-STAR HOTEL - TURF CONFERENCE - NIGHT

Turf exes and their vendors wander about as Gus and Martin  
debate the topic at hand.

GUS

Fifty independent studies says  
it's safe. It's safe.

MARTIN

But...

GUS

Marty. If you question the  
integrity... what is going to stop  
others?

MARTY

The heat factor alone should stop  
us from using this material as a  
variable option.

GUS

Every year, three-hundred million  
tires become waste in the United  
States. Three-hundred million.  
Where should these abandoned tires  
go?

MARTY

Not fields our children play on.

GUS

The EPA is happy with our efforts.

EXT. ANNABEL'S GRADUATION CEREMONY — DAY

Tess walks up to girls from the team. She takes a picture with her phone.

Annabel stands by Jaz, Keira, and friends with graduation gowns on.

Snap. Annabel comes and gives her Mother a hug.

ANNABEL

First round, Mom. I made the first round.

TESS

Congratulations.

The two still embrace.

TESS (CONT'D)

I'm more impressed with the diploma.

ANNABEL

Thanks, Mom.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD PRACTICE — DAY

Practice drills. Tess approaches Gordon.

TESS

Do you know Amy Griffin?

GORDON

She's was a goalie in the Ninety-One Olympics.

TESS

Yeah.

GORDON

No. Why?

TESS

I need to meet her.

EXT. STARFIRE FACILITY - TUKWILA, WASHINGTON — DAY

Tess visits Annabel in Seattle for her first professional game for the Seattle Sounders. As she does so, she scoops up pellets from the AstroTurf field and places them in a vile for Dr. Kotzin.

Seattle Reign SOCCER PLAYER looks at her, then Annabel.

SOCCKER PLAYER  
What's she doing?

ANNABEL  
Testing the turf. Seeing if it's  
is safe to play on.

SOCCKER PLAYER  
Oh. I can save her the time. It  
ain't.

The player runs across the field to warm up.

EXT. WASHINGTON STATE UNIVERSITY — DAY

On the Women's Lower Soccer Field, the Cougars Women's Soccer Team plays The Huskies.

Tess reads Brené Brown's Daring Greatly as the Huskies players approach. She sees their goalkeeper coach, Amy Griffin and pops up.

TESS  
Coach. Do you have a minute?

Coach Griffin quickens her pace. She thinks she's a reporter.

COACH GRIFFIN  
Sorry. I need to make a bus.

TESS  
It's about the artificial turf.

COACH GRIFFIN  
Are you a reporter?

TESS  
Concerned Mother.

COACH GRIFFIN  
We need more of you.

Tess and Amy talk for few minutes.

HUSKY PLAYER comes over.

HUSKY PLAYER  
Coach. The driver says.

COACH GRIFFIN  
I know.

TESS  
I'm sorry. I took too much of your time.

COACH GRIFFIN

TESS  
Well... I have a rental.

COACH GRIFFIN  
Carol.

HUSKY PLAYER  
Yes, Coach.

COACH GRIFFIN  
Take Mrs. Gore's car and follow us.

INT. HUSKY CHARTER BUS - NIGHT

Names of all youth players she knows fighting cancer.

TESS  
That many?

COACH GRIFFIN  
It seems weird to me. That you are not allowed to burn or bury them. You're not allowed to do so many things because they're deemed unsafe. Yet we can spread them around our athletes' playing fields.

TESS  
Why isn't anyone doing anything?

COACH GRIFFIN  
You are.

EXT. UNIVERSITY OF SEATTLE - CAMPUS - NIGHT

Tess POV. As the Husky Team exists bus, Carol waits with her rental car.

Coach Griffin yells to Tess as she walks to her car.

COACH GRIFFIN  
Contact Jeff Ruch at Peer in DC.  
He will open your eyes wider.

INT. GORE'S HOME - DAY

Gordon watches Tess re-pack.

COACH GORDON  
Where are you going?

TESS  
To DC.

COACH GORDON  
You just got back.

TESS  
I need to see a man. It's about...

COACH GORDON  
I know what's it about.

Gordon sighs.

COACH GORDON (CONT'D)  
Good luck.

EXT. WASHINGTON MALL AND CAPITOL - DAY

Group of kids of various ethnicity plays soccer in park.

INT. LOCAL RESTAURANT - DAY

Tess meets with JEFF KUCH, 50s, a fellow fighter of lost causes. He works at Peer group, a Consumer Activist Group over lunch.

Kuch eats a bite of pink salmon.

JEFF KUCH  
Well... tires are nasty to deal with. They catch on fire. Those fires are hard to put out. So the solution was. Let's make lemonade out of this lemon. Salt.

Tess hands him salt.

JEFF KUCH (CONT'D)

Thanks. So let's take waste and turn it into a product by chopping it up and putting it into various uses.

TESS

Like artificial fields.

JEFF KUCH

Exactly. It was a solution to a solid waste problem that had a public health blind spot.

TESS

Amazing.

JEFF KUCH

Not if it's your kids playing on it. Pepper.

INT. SUPER STORE - CEREAL AISLE - DAY

Martin's cart bumps into another person's cart. As he looks up, he sees Ryan Quinlan.

MARTIN

Oh. Hi, Ryan.

RYAN

Hey, Marty. Sorry.

MARTIN

No worries.

RYAN

Your family is in the turf business, right?

MARTIN

Yes. Three-generations.

RYAN

Good. So, Courtney has been telling me that turf may not be safe. Is that true?

MARTIN

The most respected scientists says they are.

RYAN

I'm not asking them. I'm asking you.

Martin lowers his eyes.

MARTIN  
I...

FLASHBACK:

EXT. PARK - DAY - YEARS AGO

By accident, a YOUNGER O'MALLEY, her hair in French braids, kicks a soccer ball at Martin's head.

Martin moves to miss it.

Ellie as a toddler retrieves it.

Younger O'Malley approaches him for her ball.

YOUNGER O'MALLEY  
Sorry, Mr. Thornhill.

MARTIN  
Good kick, O'Malley.

Ellie returns. She hoists up ball to O'Malley.

ELLIE  
B-a-w-l.

Younger O'Malley accepts it. Then, she runs off to play.

END OF FLASHBACK:

INT. MARTIN'S HOME - FOUR CAR GARAGE - NIGHT

Martin sits behind the wheel of SUV. His hands still grip the wheel.

Jill opens the garage door. As she stands in rich powerful light, she sees her husband.

JILL  
Marty? You okay?

Martin does not reply.

Jill walks to the car door.

JILL (CONT'D)  
Marty? You scaring me.

MARTIN  
I'm scaring myself.

JILL  
What happened?

MARTIN  
I ran in to Ryan Quinlan at the store.

JILL  
And?

MARTIN  
He asked me if exposure to turf fields killed his daughter?

JILL  
Oh, honey. She went to Van Buren. Not BC. Her soccer field wasn't installed by us.

MARTIN  
I know...

He turns to his wife.

MARTIN (CONT'D)  
But we have installed hundreds of those same fields. Hundreds.

JILL  
Then, do something about it. Fix it.

EXT. WEMBLY STADIUM, LONDON - OLYMPICS - DAY

Aerial Shot of the stadium.

INT. WEMBLY STADIUM - DAY

SUPER: "WEMBLY STADIUM - THE LONDON OLYMPICS."

A sports clip shows the highlights as the USA Women's Soccer Team beats Japan to secure Gold at Wembley Stadium during the London 2012 Olympic Games.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
United States beats Japan Two-One to win the gold.

In the stands, Coach Gordon, Tess, and Annabel attends as fans.

INT. WEMBLY STADIUM - NIGHT

Stadium lights radiates an empty arena.

On the field, Tess scoops up beads and places them in vial for Dr. Kotzin.

Annabel walks along the field. The sheer size awes her.

Then, she sprints down the field and acts as if she is playing.

Coach Gordon kicks a soccer ball to her from across the field.

COACH GORDON  
One minute left!

Annabel explodes to the goal. She kicks the ball. Boom!

The soccer ball bends high and hard.

ANNABEL  
Shoots, and scores!

Tess yells to her husband.

TESS  
Easier when there's no goalie.

COACH GORDON  
No Keeper could have stopped that ball.

INT. 4-EVER GREEN CORPORATE - MARTIN'S OFFICE - DAY

Martin sits at his desk as his phone rings. He picks it up.

MARTIN  
Marty here.

GUS  
Marty, you've to stop drawing attention to yourself.

MARTIN  
What are talking about?

GUS  
The safety studies?

MARTIN  
So I reached out to a few friends.  
I needed more data.

GUS

Let me reaffirm the association's position, your position, the fields are safe.

MARTIN

What if they're not?

EXT. GORE'S HOME — DRIVEWAY — DAY

Gordon and Tess gets out of the car.

TESS

EPA had never done a risk assessment.

COACH GORDON

You getting warmer, Tess. What next?

EXT. WOMEN'S NATIONAL TEAM TRY-OUTS — DAY

Annabel runs to the sidelines and grabs some water. As she drinks it, looks at all the caliber of talent in the midst of drills. She is amazed.

Keira comes up to her.

KEIRA

Do you believe we are actually here?

Annabel sees the players she has idolized on the field.

ANNABEL

No.

KEIRA

Well. We are.

ANNABEL

Let's make the most of it then.

KEIRA

Yeah.

In the background, HOPE SOLO stops ball after ball at goal.

KEIRA (CONT'D)

Do you ever think about O'Malley?

Annabel downs her paper cup of water and crushes it.

ANNABEL  
Everyday.

Annabel sprints back out onto the field.

Keira does the same.

KEIRA  
Me too.

EXT. 4-EVER GREEN CORPORATE - BATHROOM - DAY

Chet stands before the mirror as he washes his hands.

Martin joins him at the counter.

CHET  
Replacing the crumb-rubber fields,  
free of charge, is going to cost  
this company a fortune.

MARTIN  
Yes, it is.

Martin eyes Chet.

MARTIN (CONT'D)  
But it allows me to look my  
neighbors in the eye. Something a  
week ago, I could not do.

EXT. MT. VESUVIUS UNIVERSITY - DAY

Students nears Union Building as Tess hands out, "No  
Crumbs" in our Parks leaflets to students.

To each passing student, she offers one.

TESS  
Here you go. Thank you. We have a  
meeting next Thursday if you wish  
to attend.

Dr. Archer approaches her. He snatches a flyer from a  
passing student.

DR. ARCHER  
Thanks.

He reads it.

DR. ARCHER (CONT'D)  
What? Tess.

TESS  
A discussion on the safety of our fields, Mr. Archer.

DR. ARCHER  
We shall see about that.

He storms off.

TESS  
Dr. Archer... You're welcome to attend!

INT. NEWS SHOW - DAY

NEWSCASTER interviews a medical doctor.

SUPER: "DR. DONALD NORTH, ONCOLOGIST MAYO CLINIC."

DR. NORTH  
There has been no proof that these are definitely cancer causing exposures.

NEWSCASTER  
Let's get the Turf Association's stance on this, Kelly.

The screen switches to KELLY, a reporter standing beside Gus Muller.

KELLY  
I'm here with Gus Muller, the president of the National Turf Association. Gus, are the fields as safe as grass?

GUS  
Safer. This is a bio-friendly product.

Gus smiles broadly at the camera.

GUS (CONT'D)  
You don't need any pesticides or herbicides on its surface.

INT. 4-EVER GREEN CORPORATE - MARTIN'S OFFICE - DAY

Martin sits at his desk, as his computer pings. He sees he has received an email from his daughter.

The email's subject line reads: "Watch this Dad."

So, Martin clicks on it.

The link takes him to a YouTube page for Abby Wambach.

The video starts with a Pre-Roll 4-Ever Green commercial.

CELEBRITY SPOKESMAN  
When Nature is not good enough...  
try Four-Ever Green Turf  
Solutions.

Wambach's interview starts.

ABBY WAMBACH  
Playing on turf is a 'nightmare.'

Martin stops the video.

MARTIN  
Advertising dollars well spent.

He shakes his head, as his phone rings. He picks it up.

DARLA (O.S.)  
It's your accountant again.

MARTIN  
Take a message.

DARLA (O.S.)  
He's sounds worried.

MARTIN  
Yeah.

INT. ANNABEL'S ROOM - NIGHT

YOUTUBE ANNABEL SHONE TRIBUTE VIDEO starts off in Annabel's room.

She and Keira sings Madonna's Like A Pray.

ANNABEL  
Life is a mystery, everyone must  
stand alone.

Keira joins in.

ANNABEL AND KEIRA  
I hear you call my name. And it  
feels like home.

INT. DR. ARCHER'S OUTER OFFICE - DAY

Coach Gordon, Dr. Kotzin, and Tess sits and waits outside his office.

His RECEPTIONIST approaches.

RECEPTIONIST  
He's still in a meeting.

INT. DR. ARCHER'S OFFICE - SAME

Martin meets with Dr. Archer regarding the new soccer field his company installed.

DR. ARCHER  
Replacement? No.

MARTIN  
Did you get my letter?

ARCHER  
Yes.

MARTIN  
And?

DR. ARCHER  
Countless studies found no elevated health risks. Therefore, I see no reason of replacing the crumb-rubber with an organic.

MARTIN  
That's a mistake.

INT. DR. ARCHER'S OUTER OFFICE - SAME

DR. ARCHER  
Thank you for coming, Mr. Thornhill. The University appreciates your offer.

MARTIN  
If you change your mind, the offer stands.

DR. ARCHER  
Good day.

Dr. Archer turns to the waiting room and sees Coach Gordon, Dr. Kotzin, and Tess approaching.

DR. ARCHER (CONT'D)  
You're up.

They pass Martin.

Tess' shoulder hits Martin's.

TESS  
Oh.

MARTIN  
My apologizes.

Martin and Tess eye one another.

TESS  
What kind of mood is he in.

Martin looks back at Dr. Archer, then says to Tess.

MARTIN  
Good luck.

INT. DR. ARCHER'S OFFICE - SAME

As the group enters they see Sports memorabilia litters the office: autographs & signed baseballs, footballs, and basketballs.

They see no men or women's soccer balls or jerseys.

COACH GORDON  
Hey Bill. Where's that  
Championship ball I gave you?

Dr. Archer returns to his massive desk.

DR. ARCHER  
It's around here somewhere. So.  
What's this meeting about?

COACH GORDON  
Bill, we need to return to grass.

DR. ARCHER  
The hell we do. That turf is  
bought and paid for. The man that  
sold it to me just left.

Tess looks back at the door.

COACH GORDON

As an educator and coach, my first responsibility is for the well-being of our student athletes.

DR. ARCHER

No. You first responsibility is to win.

Gordon turns to Andy.

COACH GORDON

There is a possible risk to the student athletes.

DR. ARCHER

Possible.

DR. KOTZIN

The rubber crumbs contains cancer-causing chemicals. Fact.

Dr. Archer raises his finger.

DR. ARCHER

Very low-levels, yes.

TESS

But these chemicals smear into the cuts and abrasions of these girls.

DR. ARCHER

Please don't take this the wrong way, Tess. But... you have no idea what you are talking about.

Tess opens her mouth to interject, looks to her husband.

Gordon eyes her for a moment and nods.

Tess continues.

TESS

Maybe not. But a heat gauge doesn't lie. Outside air of seventy-five degrees equals a hundred and twenty plus on the field.

Dr. Archer looks to Andy and Gordon.

Gordon and Andy nods their agreement.

DR. ARCHER

That's what the irrigation system  
is for. To cool the turf down.

TESS

Well, it's not doing enough. An  
air temperature of eighty-six  
degrees, is a hundred fifty  
degrees on the field.

DR. KOTZIN

Scientists via satellite thermal  
imaging concluded that synthetic  
turf fields are up to Sixty  
degrees hotter than grass fields.

DR. ARCHER

What else can you confirm besides  
that it's hotter than grass?

Silence from the three.

DR. ARCHER (CONT'D)

This meeting is over.

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD - MIDFIELD - DAY

Martin walks the soccer field. He sees Anna and Izzy  
practicing their shots at goal.

Martin approaches them.

MARTIN

Excuse me. Do you two play soccer  
here?

IZZY

Daa.

ANNA

Yes.

MARTIN

Did you know O'Malley Quinlan.

Izzy and Anna's bodies straighten and they both nod yes.

MARTIN (CONT'D)

I'm from Batesville, and my  
company installed this field.

IZZY

Well, you should talk to Annabel's  
Mom.

MARTIN

Why is that?

ANNA

She wants this field torn out.

MARTIN

Well then, we have something in common. Do you know where I could find her?

ANNA

She's giving a speech tonight at Kennedy Auditorium.

MARTIN

Thank you.

INT. KENNEDY AUDITORIUM — NIGHT

Dr. Archer stands in the back of the auditorium as Tess gives speech to a mostly empty room.

Martin sits a few rows in front of him.

TESS

Forty years ago, this campus was part of a movement. Where have those activists gone?

Shouts a smart ass from crowd.

SMART ASS

Wall Street!

Dr. Archer and the room laughs at this joke at Tess' expense. Archer smirks as he walks out.

INT. KENNEDY AUDITORIUM — LATER

Tess packs up her things.

Marin walks up.

MARTIN

I liked what you had to say.

TESS

That surprises me.

MARTIN

Why?

TESS

You're the one who's responsible  
for that field being here.

MARTIN

Archer's office?

TESS

I have wide shoulders.

MARTIN

Good. Because I need your help.

EXT. URBAN STREET - DAY

YouTube Video cuts of Annabel in white shirt before the camera laughs.

SERIES OF SHOTS: YouTube with music.

- A. On street doing soccer tricks.
- B. In Nike outfit doing sprints on field.
- C. Shoots at goal, again and again.
- D. Goofing off with team.
- E. Long hotel corridor with teammate. Both move towards camera and tugs their luggage closer and closer.

INT. 4-EVER GREEN CORPORATE -LATER

Martin seats in the weekly sales meeting as Chet forecasts sales.

The White Board shows flat sales.

CHET

We're being underbid on every job.

SALE REP #1

We R Turf is losing money on every deal.

MARTIN

They have the money to lose.

CHET

We can't win this war, Marty.

MARTIN

I know.

CHET

Sales have grown cold. And  
re-filling the fields with organic  
is costing us twice the amount we  
budgeted.

MARTIN

Gus' boys want to teach us a  
lesson.

Martin raises.

Sale rep #2 looks hard at Sale rep #1.

SALES REP #2

Marty, we're hundred percent  
commission, and have families.

MARTIN

What are our options?

Darla comes into the conference room.

DARLA

Boss, your accountant...

MARTIN

Tell him, to leave me a message.

DARLA

He's in your office.

The men in the room eye one another.

MARTIN

Perfect.

INT. MARTIN'S OFFICE - SAME

SAM, a bookish accountant, late 40's, sweater vest type  
stands by the window.

SAM

Marty, what's going on here?

MARTIN

I'm attempting to right a wrong,  
Sam.

SAM

I don't think you're in the position  
to do that any more.

INT. GORE'S HOME - NIGHT

Tess' phone RINGS. She sees picture of Annabel appears on her screen.

TESS  
Hey, honey.

INT. PRACTICE FIELD - SEATTLE - SAME

Annabel calls her Mother.

ANNABEL  
Mom.

SPLIT SCREEN:

TESS  
Yes, dear.

ANNABEL  
I made it. The National Team. I'm  
on the roster. Me.

Tess reacts. She drops her phone and screams off.

ANNABEL (CONT'D)  
Mom?

Coach wanders in. He sees the phone on the ground and picks it up.

COACH GORDON  
Congratulations.

ANNABEL  
Where's Mom?

COACH GORDON  
Running up and down our street.  
Terrifying our neighbors.

ANNABEL  
She's one of a kind. Isn't she?

COACH GORDON  
Yes, she is.

ANNABEL  
Thank you, Coach.

COACH GORDON  
For what?

ANNABEL  
You know what.

COACH GORDON  
You're welcome.

INT. THORNHILL'S HOME — DAY

Martin watches C-SPAN.

SUPER: "The Consumer Product Safety Commission."

Darren Gill, Vice President of Marketing for Field Turf,  
the biggest installer of synthetic turf in the United  
States.

DARREN GILL  
We are hundred percent confident  
in what the available data tells  
us that anyone using our products  
should rest assured there are no  
valid health concerns tied to  
artificial turf.

NEWS ANNOUNCER  
The U.S. has more than  
eleven-thousand artificial turf  
fields, which can cost \$1 million  
a piece to replace.

Tess turns the television off.

TESS  
Money. We need to do more.

INT. TURF ASSOCIATION - GUS' OFFICE - DAY

Gus is on the phone with We R Turf. They specialize on the  
installation of NFL and FIFA fields.

GUS  
I know. I know. Just keep  
underbidding him. He will break.

Gus listens for a spell.

GUS (CONT'D)  
Well, if he doesn't. He will soon  
be out of business.

Gus listens again.

GUS (CONT'D)

Yeah, I heard that too. Someone seems to be driving up the price of organic infills.

Gus laughs hard.

GUS (CONT'D)

He will be crawling back to the trough soon enough.

EXT. M.V.U. PRESIDENT'S HOUSE - NIGHT

Dr. Kotzin, Coach Gordon, and Tess sits in the parlor of the University's Madame President and discusses the turf issue over drinks.

MADAME PRESIDENT

It's not just me saying this. We need more data.

DR. KOTZIN

I agree.

TESS

I can get more samples.

MADAME PRESIDENT

Have you asked Dr. Patel to examine the samples?

A light bulb goes off in Dr. Kotzin's head.

DR. KOTZIN

No. But that's a brilliant idea.

TESS

Who's that?

COACH GORDON

The chair of engineering department.

MADAME PRESIDENT

I learned early in my career. Clever people see complex problems differently. Perhaps, he can help.

EXT. WOMEN'S NATIONAL TEAM PRACTICE - DAY

Tess watches Annabel run drills. She looks down at the synthetic turf. She bends down. Touches it. She runs her fingers through it.

GROUND'S KEEPER sees her.

GROUND'S KEEPER  
Isn't it great? Looks just like  
grass.

Tess looks up.

TESS  
What's wrong with grass?

INT. SOCCER FIELD - DAY

YOUTUBE ANNABEL SHONE TRIBUTE VIDEO starts off with still shots on field. Then the video goes to her scoring highlight reel.

Shot by amazing shot, each kicked soccer ball hits the back of the goal. Annabel turns to the camera. She bows. Then, she laughs as she runs off the screen.

INT. THORNHILL'S HOME - KITCHEN - NIGHT

Martin, Jill, Ellie, and Jack eats pizza. From a small TV in the kitchen, shows a reporter in Washington, D.C.

On the TV.

REPORTER  
With concerns mounting about artificial turf athletic fields and playgrounds made of crumb rubber, two top Democrats on the Senate Commerce Committee today asked President Barack Obama to initiate a comprehensive federal-led study into the potential health risks posed by the surfaces.

LAWMAKER  
Given that millions of children and young athletes play on crumb rubber synthetic surfaces every day, this correlation with cancer cannot be ignored.

Ellie looks at her father.

ELLIE  
Is our field safe?

MARTIN

Yes. We already replaced the  
infill with cork.

ELLIE

What about the others?

MARTIN

Yes. And it's costing us a  
fortune.

He mumbles to quietly for Ellie and Jill to hear.

MARTIN (CONT'D)

A fortune we no longer have.

INT. GORE'S HOME — NIGHT

Tess watches the news, NBC News Interview.

SUPER: "Does Artificial Turf Present a Health Risk?

SUPER: "FERGUSON, MISSOURI."

RON ALLEN

Are weighing charges against the  
officer. The grand jury decision  
on that could be several weeks or  
more away. Brian. Ron Allen in  
Ferguson, Missouri tonight.

SHOT IN STUDIO.

BRIAN WILLIAMS

Ron, thanks. Tonight a member of  
congress is calling for action  
after our NBC News Investigation  
aired here last night about  
artificial turf on the soccer  
fields and football fields. We  
have heard from a lot of viewers  
including parents and athletes  
themselves sharing their stories,  
their concerns. We get our  
follow-up report tonight from  
NBC's Stephanie Gosk.

TAPED INTERVIEW.

GOSK

Megan Loul couldn't sleep last  
night.

MEGAN LOUL

Last night I was watching TV and  
was in total shock.

GOSK

The twenty-four-year-old was a  
soccer goalie through college  
where she says she played almost  
exclusively on fields with crumb  
rubber. Those little black dots  
made from shredded car and truck  
tires.

INT. STUDIO - WHITE SOUND STAGE - DAY

One Nation. One Team. 23 Stories Interviews Annabel.

As the camera rolls, Annabel balances a soccer ball on her head and rolls it to her lips, then back to her head. She removes it.

ANNABEL

I think a lot with soccer. That  
your personality off the field,  
translates on to the field.

INT. GORE'S HOME - NIGHT

Coach watches news coverage of Dr. Archer and a group of reporters outside Firebirds' Field.

COACH GORDON

Oh no.

Shot of Dr. Archer on TV.

DR. ARCHER

Of course we are concerned. But no  
credible evidence connects crumb  
rubber fields with cancer.

REPORTER

What is the University doing to  
ensure its students safety?

DR. ARCHER

Everything.

REPORTER

That's not what Mrs. Gore is  
telling us.

DR. ARCHER  
Mrs. Gore has no affiliation with  
this University.

REPORTER  
But.

DR. ARCHER  
No further questions.

Coach Gordon turns off story. As he does his home phone rings.

COACH GORDON  
I wonder who this is?

INT. THORNHILL'S HOME - THEATER ROOM - NIGHT

Ellie sits and watches. She wears a "No-Crumbs" T-Shirt.  
ON TV, NBC News Investigates Interview.

Amy Griffin appears on screen.

AMY GRIFFIN  
I've coached for Twenty-Six,  
twenty-seven years. My first  
fifteen years, I never heard  
anything about this. All of a  
sudden it seems to be a stream of  
kids.

NEWS ANNOUNCER  
Despite a series of NBC News  
reports on the growing debate  
about the safety of crumb rubber  
artificial turf, the federal  
agencies that regulate the product  
have remained largely silent.  
Earlier this month, in fact, the  
head of the Environmental  
Protection Agency would not answer  
a direct on-camera question about  
whether the surface found on  
playgrounds and athletic fields  
across the country is safe for  
kids to play on.

TV CLIP: INTERVIEW: EPA, Gina McCarthy, acknowledges the data gaps. EPA Administrator Gina McCarthy told NBC's Stephanie Gosk when Gosk caught up with her in a Capitol Hill hallway.

REPORTER GOSK

Does the EPA know if these beads really enter the body or have the ability to break down? Are the crumb rubber beads connected with these types of health consequences?

GINA MCCARTHY

It's worth looking at those issues. Because these are the issues that I don't believe we have systemically looked at for a long time or ever.

REPORTER

Mrs. McCarthy, is the EPA's view that these fields are safe to play on?

GINA MCCARTHY

I have nothing to say about that right now.

Ellie gets up and looks at her father.

ELLIE

Dad!!!!

EXT. SOCCER FACULTY — DAY

Television interview of Mia Hamm, as she weighs in on the USWNT issues with Turf in the World Cup.

ANNOUNCER

Soccer legend Mia Hamm knows the toll turf can take on a soccer player's body and wonders why the Women's World Cup isn't getting the same natural grass surface as the Men.

MIA HAMM

I love playing on grass. It's the biggest tournament. With the brightest stars. You wanna see the best players on natural surface.

INT. STUDIO — WHITE SOUND STAGE — DAY

PLAYER

Girls. Women. You can accomplish anything.

INT. ANNABEL'S LIVING ROOM - DAY

YOUTUBE TRIBUTE VIDEO.

Annabel laughs again as Keira introduces her.

KEIRA

Annabel Shone. From Flat Rock, Pennsylvania. She's a left striker for us. She played at Mt. Vesuvius University. Fine Program there.

ANNABEL

Keira, you would know.

KEIRA

Shh. I'm doing the interview here.

ANNABEL

The Wall has spoken?

KEIRA

Shh.

INT. GORE'S HOME - DAY

ON TV: ESPN STUDIOS.

JULIE FOUDY

I remember the first time I played on synthetic turf field. I thought, wow, this is amazing. What is this stuff? It seemed so much better than that concrete-like Astro Turf that was essentially just a green, thin carpet over hard ground.

INT. GORE'S HOME - LIVING ROOM - DAY

Tess sits on a sofa. Before her, on coffee table lies the 2015 U.S. Women's Soccer Team Sports Illustrated cover.

Gordon enters the living room with magazine in hand.

COACH GORDON

Have you seen this?

TESS  
Yes. The Group of Death.

COACH GORDON  
Yeah. Tough teams.

He pages through it.

COACH GORDON (CONT'D)  
Canada is going with artificial  
turf too?

TESS  
I know.

COACH GORDON  
What Annabel's view on the  
subject.

Tess looks up from the paper. She eyes her husband.

TESS  
I don't know.

INT. MARTIN'S SUV - NIGHT

Martin drives home as his bluetooth device informs him:  
"Call from BNT Bank. Call from BNT Bank."

Martin thinks about not answering it. Then he does.

MARTIN  
Marty, here.

BANK MANAGER  
Marty, we have a problem.

EXT. THORNHILL'S HOME - DECK - NIGHT

Martin drinks a double scotch.

MARTIN  
Three generations.

He raises his glass in a mock salute.

MARTIN (CONT'D)  
I'm sorry, Dad.

Jill comes out.

JILL  
There you are.

MARTIN  
I need to tell you something.

JILL  
Payroll.

MARTIN  
You know.

JILL  
It's a small town.

MARTIN  
Yeah.

JILL  
I spoke to Sam. We own the house  
free and clear.

MARTIN  
You love this house.

JILL  
I love you and our family more.

INT. BNT BANK - MANAGER'S OFFICE - DAY

Jill and Martin signs documents one by one.

Bank manager reviews them and hands them over to Sam.

SAM  
Okay. We bought some time.

EXT. THORNHILL'S HOME - OPEN HOUSE - DAY

A For Sale sign stands in the front yard as an Open House takes place.

Families and real estate agents invades the Thornhill's home.

INT. THORNHILL'S HOME - KITCHEN - NIGHT

Jill picks up her phone as it buzzes on the granite counter.

Martin stands beside her.

JILL  
Full asking price. Good. Do it.

Jill hangs up.

MARTIN  
Maybe we don't have to sell.

JILL  
This place is too big. We're too  
big.

Martin hugs Jill.

JILL (CONT'D)  
We're doing the right thing.

MARTIN  
How can you be sure?

JILL  
A Momma always knows.

She leads him out of the kitchen.

JILL (CONT'D)  
Let's go to bed.

INT. TURF ASSOCIATION - GUS' OFFICE - DAY

Gus sits at his desk with the phone in his hands.

GUS  
What do you mean he paid his  
vendors in full? How?!? Great.  
Well, keep up the pressure.

Gus listens to the other end for a spell, sees the image on  
the muted TV screen.

GUS (CONT'D)  
I'm going to have to call you  
back.

Unmutes his TV, from the News.

SOCER PLAYER  
I would have them in my ears. I  
would have them everywhere. In my  
hair. I would even blow my nose.  
And I would have them in the  
tissue.

REPORTER  
Last year she was diagnosed with  
NON-HODGKIN LYMPHOMA. Today she is  
in remission.

GUS  
Damn it!

EXT. FIREBIRDS' FIELD — DAY

Tess watches Dr. Archer with a swarm of reporters. She along with her husband and other Mt. Vesuvius faculty stands behind the AD.

DR. ARCHER  
Yes. We are excited to have two of our own play for the Womens' National Team. And a chance at the World Cup.

REPORTER  
What about the issue of them not wanting to play on the artificial turf?

DR. ARCHER  
You should ask them both that question. Not me. Tess, has your daughter shared any concerns. Insights?

REPORTER  
Mrs. Gore, what does your daughter think?

TESS  
She doesn't think about such things. She's young. But as a Mother. I do.

DR. ARCHER  
See. There you have it. Fear based on parental concern.

TESS  
They're unsafe.

Dr. Archer eyes Tess.

DR. ARCHER  
It is a question of Fear vs. Fact. Naturally we have a need to find something. Or someone to blame when cancer claims any one's life. Especially a young athletes.. Yet. Studies show no increased risk when playing on artificial fields. Prove me wrong.

(MORE)

DR. ARCHER (CONT'D)  
And I will be the first person  
with a shovel to rip up that  
field. Anyone?

REPORTER  
But NBC reports.

DR. ARCHER  
I don't know about NBC but I  
watched an excellent video. The  
Truth About Crumb Rubber and  
Artificial Turf.

REPORTER  
That was produced by the turf  
manufactures.

DR. ARCHER  
The top leading scientists in  
their fields says it is safe. Do  
you know something they don't?

Silence.

DR. ARCHER (CONT'D)  
Then, I recommend you watch it.  
Good day.

INT. BANQUET ROOM — PREGAME DINNER — DAY

The WNT sits at circle tables and prepares to be fed.

SUPER: "MOTHER'S DAY WEEKEND — TEARS OF JOY"

SUPER: "SAN JOSE, CALIFORNIA."

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
It was the ultimate Mother's Day  
surprise as U.S. Soccer reunited  
the U.S. Women's National Team  
members with their Moms over  
Mother's Day Weekend. On Saturday  
night, as the team prepared for a  
send-off game vs. Ireland in  
advance of the twenty-fifteen FIFA  
Women's World Cup, an ordinary  
team meeting and dinner took a  
dramatic turn as the featured  
guests were revealed to be  
non-other than the players' Moms.

EXT. AVAYA STADIUM - DAY

Mothers and daughters, in pairs of two, crosses field.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)

Then, on Sunday during the U.S.A. vs. Ireland game a unique breaking of tradition took place. Rather than taking the field with youth soccer members to enter the stadium, the players walked out with their Moms in a heartwarming tribute to Mother's Day and Moms across America.

INT. STUDIO - WHITE SOUND STAGE - DAY

Annabel is on camera. She wears a worn-out gray Mt. Vesuvius sweatshirt.

Tess is besides her.

ANNABEL

I can't believe you hid this from me.

TESS

I straight out lied.

ANNABEL

I don't get surprised often. Today, I was surprised.

EXT. U.S. SOCCER FIELD - DAY

Annabel walks out on to the field with Tess. The two wave to the crowds.

ANNABEL

I'm glad you're here.

TESS

You too.

INT. THORNHILL'S HOME - ELLIE'S ROOM - NIGHT

Ellie lays with an iPad on her lap in bed.

ELLIE

Let's see what Annabel is up to.

Ellie goes to Annabel's YouTube page.

ELLIE (CONT'D)  
Wow, girl. Over one million  
subscribers.

She taps on the latest video labeled "Soccer Tricks."

On the iPad screen, Annabel does several soccer tricks with her feet.

ANNABEL (V.O.)  
I love watching the Brazilians. I  
love the sound of the ball. Of  
players, confident striking it.  
And I think from a young age. I  
tried to duplicate that.

INT. THE RACHEL MADDOW SHOW - STUDIO - DAY

RACHEL MADDOW speaks to the camera and her audience.

MADDOW  
Why must these girls be forced to  
play on a second grade surface.  
Hmm? Anyone?

EXT. SOCCER COMPLEX - DAY

YOUTUBE ANNABEL SHONE TRIBUTE VIDEO.

Annabel works out hard with the team. Drill, after drill. Dribbles, does tricks with her foot always on ball. The video moves to her running on treadmill with oxygen mask. Then, her on stationary bike.

ANNABEL  
My legs feel great. Perhaps, a  
little heavy. But other than that...  
good.

More practice.

ANNABEL (V.O.)  
I just go out there. On days that  
I want to get fitter. And work.

Close on Annabel as she plays.

ANNABEL (V.O.) (CONT'D)  
Work until I can't work anymore. I  
call it. Work until you fail. I  
know if I'm doing that. Plus one  
more. Pass the fail zone.  
(MORE)

ANNABEL (V.O.) (CONT'D)  
That I have gotten better. Being  
able to change directions on a  
dime and doing that at a fast  
speed. The agility. Is probably  
what I have to do best at my  
position.

More shots from field.

ANNABEL (V.O.) (CONT'D)  
Hard work gives us confidence,  
momentum for the team. That's  
contagious. It's very important to  
establish that rhythm. To see the  
focus of your team just change.  
When you get in game mode, that  
rhythm.

EXT. WINNIPEG, CANADA — DAY

A CANADIAN REPORTER interviews Tess.

REPORTER  
So, Mrs. Gore you are unhappy with  
FIFA's decision to let the women  
play on turf?

TESS  
Unhappy? Is not a strong enough  
word.

REPORTER  
What would be a better word?

TESS  
Pissed. Yes, pissed would be a  
better word.

The reporter reacts to Tess' comment.

REPORTER  
Well, that's all from Winnipeg.

PRODUCER  
We are off air.

TESS  
Too strong?

The reporter looks at Tess as he takes off her mike.

REPORTER  
No. Just right.

EXT. BART'S HOME - MOBILE HOME PARK, FLAT ROCK - DAY

The very tip of U.S. Rubber Stack is in the distance. These are the humble homes of the plants' workers.

One by one, we pass the narrow manufactured homes and their narrow lots. We stop at the driveway of a double-wide. A 1985 F-150 parks there. The PA plate reads: "MVU DAD."

A fresh, "Go Firebirds!" sticker stamps the truck's bumper.

On a small spade of grass besides F-150 rests Annabel's well-weathered Nike soccer ball.

INT. BART'S HOME - DAY

Bart drinks a "Tall Boy" of beer as he watches a college football game on ESPN.

A commercial airs on the TV promoting a special.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)  
How Safe Are The Fields Where We  
Play?

Bart spits out some beer.

BART  
I'll be damned.

He raises his 20 oz. Schlitz can way high.

BART (CONT'D)  
Give'em hell, Tess!

INT. TESS' HOTEL ROOM - WINNIPEG, CANADA - DAY

Before WNT Match against Australia, Tess prepares to leave.

SOUND: KNOCK.

Tess answers her door and sees Annabel.

TESS  
Shouldn't you be at the stadium?

ANNABEL  
I'm on my way.

TESS  
What's so important that couldn't  
wait until after the game?

ANNABEL

Can you give your stance on  
Synthetic Turf, a break? At least,  
until after the tournament?

TESS

Why?

ANNABEL

I saw you on TV again, preaching.  
Pissed. Come on Mom. My  
endorsements.

TESS

What endorsements?

ANNABEL

Well... future ones.

TESS

So. You want me to remain silent,  
to lie?

ANNABEL

Just give it rest, until we get  
back in the States.

TESS

No.

ANNABEL

No? I'm the one playing on the  
stuff not you.

TESS

This is bigger than you dear.  
Remember O'Malley. Maybe you  
should.

ANNABEL

I gotta go. Say what you want.

TESS

I will. But it would be better...

Annabel slams the hotel door.

TESS (CONT'D)

If it was coming from you.

INT. FIVE STAR HOTEL — MONTREAL, CANADA — DAY

The morning of the USNT vs. GERMANY SEMI-FINALS GAME.

Tess and Annabel enjoys a hot breakfast in a players and family only conference room.

Mia Hamm enters. She walks towards Annabel, then stops.

Annabel is star-struck.

MIA HAMM  
Great game versus China.

ANNABEL  
Thank you.

Tess leans forward, as she clears her throat.

ANNABEL (CONT'D)  
This is my Mother.

MIA HAMM  
Hi.

TESS  
Hi, Mia. I'm Tess.

Mia smiles.

TESS (CONT'D)  
Being an Olympic hero and all. Are you mad that the men get to play on real grass for The Cup, but not the women?

ANNABEL  
Mother!

TESS  
Well.

Tess eyeballs Mia.

TESS (CONT'D)  
Thoughts?

MIA HAMM  
So you're the one?

ANNABEL  
I'm sorry. My Mother is taking prescription drugs. She's...

Mia signals Annabel to stop.

MIA HAMM  
No. Your Mother has grit. I like grit.

Other players come and steals Mia away. As they do, she turns back to Annabel and Tess.

MIA HAMM (CONT'D)  
And yes, Tess. About FIFA's decision. I don't think it's fair.

Mia smiles for effect.

MIA HAMM (CONT'D)  
That's why us women, sued their asses.

Tess and Annabel find an empty table.

ANNABEL  
She's amazing.

TESS  
You could be too. Speak up.

ANNABEL  
I'm not exactly the star of the team.

TESS  
Yet.

INT. THE RACHEL MADDOW SHOW - STUDIO - DAY

US Women's soccer objections forces end to FIFA use of artificial turf.

Rachel Maddow reports on the damage artificial turf does to soccer players' skin when they slide, and the objections by the U.S. Women's National Soccer Team to being forced to play World Cup matches on artificial turf, leading FIFA to end the practice.

RACHEL MADDOW  
How crazy is this? Hundred and twenty degree temperatures on the field, on a seventy-five degree day in Canada. Something isn't right.

CLIP: WNT victory of Japan in the FIFA WORLD CUP  
Championship game.

Highlight reel ends with Annabel's amazing goal.

INT. PHOTO SHOOT — DAY

Photographer snaps SPORTS ILLUSTRATED COVER.

ANNOUNCER (V.O.)

In an unprecedented event in the history of Sports Illustrated, all Twenty-Three members of the U.S. Women's National Team will grace covers of the latest issue of the widely popular sports magazine. This is the first time every member of a team has had a dedicated solo cover. After finishing atop the 'Group of Death' at this summer's Twenty-Fifteen FIFA Women's World Cup in Canada.

INT. NATIONAL PRESS CLUB — DAY

Abbey Wambach talks of how soccer can improve you.

Abby addresses the topic of Artificial Turf and Health Concerns from Rubber Infill.

ABBY WAMBACH

Well, I think we all know my stance on turf. I'm not a huge fan of it, at all. Our World Cup was played on turf last summer.

Shoot of the press as they listen to Abby.

ABBY WAMBACH (CONT'D)

There is serious health concerns. What's in those rubber pellets? I don't know. But I don't want my kids be the ones that suffer, because they are the Guinea pigs...

MATCH CUT:

INT. TURF ASSOCIATION - GUS' OFFICE - SAME

Gus watches Abby's interview from his desk.

ABBY WAMBACH  
Of these BIG Turf companies  
wanting to make a ton of money.

GUS  
Damn it!

Gus grabs phone.

GUS (CONT'D)  
Thornhill. Now!

INT. WHITE HOUSE - DAY

The President honors the Women's World Cup Champions at the White House. He holds up OBAMA 44.

Annabel stands in the back row.

EXT. INTERNATIONAL SOCCER GAME - NIGHT

USWNT vs. Trinidad Victory Tour

Annabel gets knocked down in play. The turf causes a bad burn on her right leg. She holds her leg a moment. We see the blood dripping down her leg. Then, she pops up.

ANNOUNCER  
Oh, you can see the rug burn  
there. Ouch. Bad burn.

ANNOUNCER #2  
Nasty.

ANNOUNCER  
That's what you get on this turf.  
Those burns.

Annabel sets up for a corner kick. But her leg is bleeding too badly. The ref comes over and looks at it. Then she waves to the U.S. bench for a substitute.

ANNOUNCER #2  
We see the turf, leaves its mark.

We see Annabel race across the field. Unaffected by the blood. She meets team docs on sidelines.

ANNOUNCER

We have all been there, Julia.  
Anyone that's played, especially  
indoors.

The game continues.

ANNOUNCER (CONT'D)

Nasty business.

INT. ANNABEL'S HOTEL ROOM - NIGHT

Annabel films her bleeding legs.

ANNABEL

These are the joys of playing on  
turf. It never gives. But you do.

Her smartphone rings. It's her agent. So, she answers it.

ANNABEL (CONT'D)

Speak.

She listens.

ANNABEL (CONT'D)

Marty who?

TV CLIP ON THE INDUSTRY'S PROPAGANDA RESPONSE "NOTHING IS  
MORE IMPORTANT THAN THE SAFETY OF OUR CHILDREN" VIDEO.

ANNOUNCER

This video is intended to educate  
decision-makers, coaches, parents,  
and the general public on the  
science related to the safety of  
artificial turf fields and  
recycled rubber.

EXT. TOWN OF BATESVILLE - DAY

Establishing shots of this small town in Northern Georgia.

- A. City limits.
- B. Downtown.
- C. High School.
- D. High School Soccer field.

EXT. VAN BUREN HIGH SCHOOL SOCCER FIELD - STANDS - SAME

The stands on both sides of the field are filled with people: Chet and his family, 4-Ever Green employees, Sam and his family, the banker and his family, and the Quinlans.

Arrives the Thornhills and Annabel at the base of the stands.

ANNABEL

Thank you, for inviting me.

MARTIN

I knew you won't want to miss this.

ANNOUNCER

Today we are dedicating our field in memory of O'Malley Quinlan. We would like to thank Four-Ever Green for our new scoreboard in her honor. Along with updating the field to organic cork.

The crowd claps politely until they see Martin and his family.

Small group, by small group, stands in his honor as he passes.

MARTIN

(to Annabel)

I think they recognize you.

JILL

Small town.

ANNABEL

No. I think this welcoming is for you two.

Annabel pushes the Thornhills forward.

The crowd reacts with thunderous claps of their hands.

Martin and Jill waves in appreciation.

MARTIN

Thank you.

His eyes find Ryan Quinlan.

Ryan nods back.

JILL  
Caring, makes us better people.

EXT. O'MALLEY'S HEADSTONE - DAY

Annabel stands before the granite slab that reads:  
"O'Malley Quinlan. Beloved Daughter. Born May 29, 1990.  
Died October 11, 2011."

ANNABEL  
Hey girl.

Annabel uses her finger to trace along the groove of the stone that reveals O'Malley's name.

ANNABEL (CONT'D)  
I know how much you like bling.

She removes an object from her pocket.

ANNABEL (CONT'D)  
So I want you to have this.

Annabel gently sets her World Cup metal atop the stone. The metal dangles down near the inscription that reads: "To live in the hearts of those we love is not to die."

ANNABEL (CONT'D)  
I miss you.

Annabel falls to her knees and begins to weep.

ANNABEL (CONT'D)  
Where did you go?

EXT. GORE'S HOME - DRIVEWAY - DAY

Tess grabs the mail out of the box.

Gordon is doing yard work nearby.

Tess sees an official looking document.

TESS  
Hmm.

She tears it open and reads it.

TESS (V.O.)  
The Honorable Fred Upton of the Commerce, Manufacturing, and Trade Subcommittee requests your appearance.

Tess looks to Gordon.

GORDON  
What is it?

TESS  
They want me to testify.

Gordon smiles and moves to give his wife a big hug.

INT. ANNABEL'S APARTMENT - NIGHT

Annabel sits before her computer and tapes herself. A TV is on behind her.

ANNABEL  
As a professional athlete, people ask me to endorse their products a-l-l the time. Last week, I visited a friend of mine in Batesville, Georgia. His family owns a turf company that is doing it right. Uses cork instead of crumbs. I know, smart. Anyways... He hasn't asked for my endorsement. Marty's not that kind of guy. Therefore, I'm giving it. If your school or college needs a new field. ANNABEL (CONT'D)  
Hey girl. My Mom's testifying next  
week in Washington. Yeah. I have  
an idea.

INT. OFFICE BUILDING, WASHINGTON D.C. — DAY

THE OVERSIGHT HEARING CHAMBER

SUPER: "Industry Perspectives on the Consumer Product Safety Commission"

The Chamber room full of witnesses, politicians, and reporters.

An old, CAREER POLITICIAN, in the spirit of Richard Jordon, begins the process.

CAREER POLITICIAN

We have had the Tire Association testify, under oath, state that the fields are safe to play on. What do you know that they don't?

YOUNG POLITICIAN

I am eager to hear what the witnesses have to say.

CAREER POLITICIAN

For the record, could you introduce yourself?

Tess sits among a panel of people. Scientists, coaches, parents. Her name sign reads: Tess Gore, Mother of U.S. Women's National Player. She sits beside Dr. Kotzin, and Dr. Patel.

TESS

I'm Tess Gore. Concerned parent.  
Slash. Activist.

CALIFORNIAN POLITICIAN

I see.

He reads off 8 x 11 sheet of paper.

CALIFORNIAN POLITICIAN (CONT'D)

Mrs. Gore, is it true that before your daughter's soccer matches. In Europe, Canada, and here, in the United States.

He looks up and smiles.

CALIFORNIAN POLITICIAN (CONT'D)  
You collected black crumb rubber  
samples?

TESS  
Yes. I had taken crumb rubber  
samples from over two hundred  
different artificial fields.

CAREER POLITICIAN  
And what happens to these samples,  
Mrs. Gore? You are not a  
scientist. Slash. Activist. Are  
you?

A few chuckles from the reporters.

TESS  
No. I am not. I delivered all my  
samples to Andy, I mean, Dr.  
Kotzin.

Old, career Politician turns to Andy.

CAREER POLITICIAN  
So, Dr. Kotzin. A professor of...

He looks down on a piece of paper.

CAREER POLITICIAN (CONT'D)  
Soil Science?

DR. KOTZIN  
Yes, Senator.

CAREER POLITICIAN  
Are you aware of the  
California-led investigation into  
the possible health risks  
associated with crumb rubber?

DR. KOTZIN  
Yes. I am.

CAREER POLITICIAN  
The top scientists in the country  
are part of that Californian-led  
study. So, with that said, what do  
you do Andy... I mean Dr. Kotzin,  
differently?

Dr. Kotzin turns to Dr. Patel.

DR. KOTZIN  
I give them to Dr. Patel to  
examine.

CAREER POLITICIAN  
I see. Dr. Patel. Please introduce  
yourself for the record.

Dr. PATEL, 40s, Oxford educated who knows he's the smartest  
man in the room.

DR. PATEL  
I'm Dr. Rajiv Patel. Materials  
Engineer at Mt. Vesuvius Research  
Laboratory.

OTHER POLITICIAN  
(interrupts)  
Your exact area of expertise,  
Doctor?

DR. PATEL  
Molecular.

The politician clears his throat.

CAREER POLITICIAN  
Continue.

DR. PATEL  
My specialties. Molecular modeling  
of polymers, composites,  
nano-structured & biological  
materials.

CALIFORNIA POLITICIAN  
Chemical kinetics?

DR. PATEL  
Correct.

CAREER POLITICIAN  
Are you aware of two independent  
studies that stated the levels are  
too low to cause cancer?

DR. PATEL  
Certainly. They dealt with  
contact...

Dr. Patel raises his long forefinger.

DR. PATEL (CONT'D)  
Not the absorption.

YOUNG POLITICIAN  
What exactly did you just say?

DR. PATEL  
Every sample I received, contained minor levels of cancer-causing chemicals, like carbon black. And yes. In mere contact terms, I agree the levels are not hazardous. But. If these carcinogens are digested, or consumed by your pores.

ANOTHER POLITICIAN  
Consumed by your pores? Explain.

DR. PATEL  
What do we do after a heavy work-out?

DR. PATEL (CONT'D)

REVERSE SHOT OF THEIR BACKS: Friends/Players of various names lost To Cancer.

Annabel's Jersey reads: "O'MALLEY."

Ends with photos of players who died of cancer. Last shot is of O'Malley Quinlan with her Mt. Vesuvius team lined up, shoulder-to-shoulder along a goal line.

## EXT. THE CAPITOL'S STONE STEPS - DAY

Reporters surrounds Gus, a born politician. He takes advantage of the prevailing winds.

GUS
