

Physician – Substance Use Disorder

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES: PHYSICIAN

The primary responsibility of the physician is to offer high quality, evidence-based care to those patients qualifying for Outpatient Treatment for Substance Use Disorder in a collaborative clinician team environment. The physician is responsible for obtaining and recording a detailed medical history of each patient in the electronic medical record, including, but not limited to, chief complaint, present condition, individual history, and family history. The primary responsibilities and professional requirements are detailed below:

Substance Use Disorder Treatment

- Provides medical review and evaluation of assigned patients with substance use disorder; must be familiar with the various levels of care available for those with substance use disorders.
- Provides medication management through evidence-based practices including, but not limited to, screening for diversion, appropriate storage, optimal administration, and monitoring for adverse effects.
- Assists patients and their families in developing and/or advancing their knowledge and understanding of their condition/disease as well as identifying achievable therapeutic goals.

- 4 Helps patients learn to utilize the tools needed to achieve and maintain recovery and strategies to avoid relapse.
- Contributes to and fosters an environment where our team of compassionate care providers effectively and collaboratively treat patients and keep them on the path to recovery while implementing evidence based treatment.
- Treats patients in accordance with The Recovery Research Network's protocols.
- Provides medical expertise and input regarding the type, level of intensity and quality of care for outpatients.

- Adheres to all relevant state, federal, and organizational requirements to maintain eligibility to prescribe buprenorphine.
